Fatima Centennial

The Gift of a Plenary Indulgence

Pope Francis has granted the faithful the opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence* during the centennial celebration the Fatima apparitions. There are 3 ways to obtain the plenary indulgence:

- 1. Make a pilgrimage to the Fatima Shrine in Portugal.
- 2. Visit any church where the image of Our Lady of Fatima is exposed on the days of the anniversary of the apparitions, the 13th of each month from May through October 2017.
- 3. The elderly and infirm may unite themselves spiritually to the celebrations of the 13th of each month from May to October 2017. The faithful who follow one of these three ways must also fulfill the ordinary conditions:
 - Go to Confession and Communion
 - Be interiorly detached from sin
- Pray for the intentions of the Pope
- Recite the Creed, Our Father, Hail Mary, & Glory Be
- They should also pray before the image of our Lady of Fatima invoking her help
- * "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints." (Canon 992 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1471) A plenary indulgence is a complete remission of temporal punishment due to sins and is limited to one per day.

An image of Our Lady of Fatima will be exposed in the Sanctuary (SAC) and at the Shrine of Our Lady (OLS) during the Centennial.

We are grateful to Anna Vasta for donating the red roses blessed and distributed at our Masses on the Feast of St. Rita of Cascia, May 22.

St. Rita was born in 1381 in Roccaporena in Umbria, Italy. She lived with a brutal husband with whom she had two sons. After the violent murder of her husband, she urged forgiveness in contrast to the customary "vendetta" of her day. After the death of her sons, Rita became an Augustinian nun and spent nearly 40 years in prayer, contemplation, and service to the sick and poor. Toward the end of her life, she received a wound from a thorn from the crown of thorns. She died in 1457. She is the patron of Christian mothers and of those in desperate situations.

The tradition of blessing roses on Saint Rita's feast day originates from a visit her cousin made to her at the convent. Rita was very ill. On taking her leave, her relative asked Rita if she could do any favor for her. "Yes, cousin," said the saint; "bring me a rose from the garden of my old home in Roccaporena." The request surprising since it was midwinter and exceedingly cold. Nevertheless, to humor the saint, her cousin told her that she would try to fulfill the request, though she thought it impossible to find a rose. St. Rita said, "My dear cousin, there is nothing impossible to God." In fact, to her great amazement, her cousin found in the garden, on a sapless and leafless rosebush, a beautiful red rose in full bloom. She plucked the rose, and brought it to Rita. The saint received the rose with joy and she gave thanks to God as she contemplated her sweet Jesus crowned with thorns.


