

Saint Project

Over the next few weeks, we will be talking about many of the saints. The class has been very interested in learning more about the lives of these important people. This is a great time to research a saint and share information in an oral presentation. (graphic organizer, rubric, lined paper attached)

Students are asked to research the saint they were named after or another saint they are interested in. If several students have chosen the same saint, they may be asked to change their choice. Once a saint has been chosen, the attached graphic organizer should be completed.

Students are asked to use all of the facts from their graphic organizer to write a paragraph about their saint. Six or more sentences should be handwritten neatly on the paper provided. Students will also need a cover for their report that includes their name, the name of their saint and a picture of their saint. Finally, each child should come dressed as their saint and be prepared to share their report with the class on Thursday, November 4.
