The reach of the Ursuline Sisters extends past the United States and the congregational generalate in Belgium and reaches to India, Guyana, DRCongo, and Tanzania, where the provinces are thriving. Over the summer, I had an opportunity to join with Ursulines from other provinces for a extended counsel meeting in Belgium followed by a pilgrimage to Italy. 


Celebrating 100 Years of

Last September, the US Province of the Ursuline Sisters of Tildonk celebrated their 100th Anniversary. The day was rich was symbolism - Bishop Robert Brennan, the Bishop of the Diocese of Brooklyn was the main celebrant of our Mass of thanksgiving, the diocese in which the Ursulines first served. The offertory included the original 1924 contract between the Ursulines and Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary school, the names of all those enrolled in our prayer card program, and the names of all living and deceased sisters and associates.

After Mass at St. William the Abbot (Seaford, NY), there was a reception attended by over 100 people. There were many stories and laughs shared. St. William's was chosen as the location of the celebration as the Ursulines have had a continuous presence in the parish for over 75 years - and they still continue to live and remain active in the community today!

Sr. Joanne Callahan, OSU was honored at the National Catholic Educational Association's Lifetime Educator Award this spring! The NCEA is the largest, private professional education association in the world. The organization works with Catholic educators across the nation to support ongoing faith formation and the teaching mission of the Church and includes nearly 140,000 educators

Sr. Joanne grew up in West Haven, CT and first encountered the Ursuline Sisters as teachers in her religious education classes. She entered the Ursuline community in 1967 and embarked on a ministry in Catholic education that would span four decades. Her first assignment was at St. William the Abbot (NY) followed by a time at St. Mary High School in (CT). In 1983, she returned to St. William's for five years as the principal. She went on to serve the Diocese of Rockville Centre as Director of Teacher Personnel, Director of School Planning, and Superintendent of Schools. While serving as Superintendent of School she also was on the committee at St. Joohn's University to for the Institute for Catholic education which offered in-service excellent for teachers administrators. Along with Bishop Murphy, she was instrumental in setting up Tomorrow's Hope Foundation which offers scholarships for students to attend Catholic elementary schools in the Diocese. She still volunteers for THF.

Reasons to Give



The average age of the Ursuline Sisters of Tildonk is 82 and 96% of them are above the retirement age, though many continue to work and serve others.



Retired sisters are not subsidized by the parishes or dioceses they served



Benefits from social security for retired religious are only 1/3 of what the average US beneficiary receives



The average annual cost of care for a sister over 70 is \$52,882 while the average annual social security benefit is \$6,336 (or 12% of the cost of care)
