Baptism

- •1st & 3rd Sundays each month at 1 p.m.; please pre-register.
- •Pre-Baptism class for first child <u>ONLY</u> as required by Diocese, offered here the 4th Sunday of January, April, July and October at 1 p.m. in Mary's Room. Pre-registration is required.

Marriage

Couples should contact a priest 6 to 12 months before their wedding date.

Anointing of the Sick Celebrated at Masses annually during October or at home at the request of family.

- In cases of emergency: at hospital or other medical facility when a priest is available.
- •In non-emergency cases: call the parish or Catholic hospital chaplain nearest the location of person to be anointed.

Funerals

- •Contact funeral director of choice to meet; ask Director to call the Parish Office to arrange date and time.
- •Call & visit parish office; meet with priest assigned to Mass.

Holy Communion for the Homebound

Call Parish Office to arrange for Holy Communion to be brought to homebound by Extraordinary Minister. Priests visit on First Friday. Please let us know if you are ill and confined to home.

Hospital Calls

Please notify the Parish Office when you or a member of your family is hospitalized. Be sure to let the hospital know that you are Catholic and if you would like the Catholic Chaplain to visit. If it is an emergency, be sure that they reach the priest that is on call. Most hospitals also have Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion who bring Holy Communion to the Catholic patients. Be sure to let your nurse know that you are a Catholic and would like to receive Holy Communion.

Sponsor Requirements

Requests for sponsor certificates are directed to a priest. Individuals must

- •be registered and practicing members of this parish; at least 16 years of age,
- •and have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation.
- •if married, be in a marriage accepted by the Catholic Church.

Next Steps After Roe: 6 Things to Know About the March for Life 2023



Jeanne Mancini, president of the March for Life, has unveiled the new theme of the 2023 March for Life taking place on Jan. 20 in Washington, D.C.: "Next Steps: Marching in a Post-*Roe* America."

The group also revealed a shift in focus to state and federal pro-life battles in light of the *Dobbs* decision overturning the 1973 *Roe v. Wade* decision, which had been the focus of the past 49 years of marches to the Supreme Court every year on its anniversary in January.

"What we'd really like to do is celebrate the momentous victory of the overturn of *Roe*," and "honor those who've marched before us," Mancini told the Register. Still, she said, in light of *Roe* being overturned there was plenty of work ahead for the pro-life movement and the march.

March Will Now Conclude at the U.S. Capitol

One crucial difference in 2023 is that the March for Life will conclude outside the U.S. Capitol building and not the Supreme Court as it has in every previous year.

"Critical to our strategic plan is continuing to boldly march in Washington, D.C. every January," Mancini told those gathered, "but we won't march to the Supreme Court any more, we will now be marching to the Capitol."

The March Will Still Take Place in January

While those who remember the marches that took place in the snow and freezing rain over the years may have wished for a fairer weather month, March for Life has decided that the event will continue to take place in January near the anniversary of the *Roe v. Wade* decision.

Mancini explained that they made this decision for a number of reasons, including that "our largest group of participants in the March are students" so moving it to June to commemorate the release of *Dobbs* "would be a very hard time for young people." She also said there was a "stability factor" to the decision, and "it's very difficult to change an event based on a different Supreme Court decision."

Perhaps most importantly, she said, "Roe and [the loss of] 63 million Americans is a scar in our culture's history, in our country's history and it's not something that we'll quickly move past. While we celebrate that we're at this new moment ... we will continue to march in January."

Defending Life in Congress

Mancini told the Register that the group's approach in Congress would be to back some pro-life measures as well as play defense against pro-abortion efforts. "We do need to be on the defensive," she said. "If a bill like the Women's Health Protection Act were enacted, it would undo all the good work that's happening at the state level and it would go way further than codifying *Roe*."

Dear Families & Friends,

Happy New Year from everyone at Corpus Christi Academy!

...And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart.

Today, January 1, we complete our octave celebration of Christmas Day. An often-overlooked liturgical fact is that we celebrate Christmas Day for eight straight days, something we do also with Easter (which concludes with the great celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday.

On this, the eighth day of the Octave of Christmas, we turn our focus to the unique and beautiful fact that God chose to enter our world through a human mother, Mary, referred to as the "Mother of God" since here Son is God. She was not the mother of her Son's flesh alone, nor the mother only of His human nature since the Person of Jesus, the Son of God, is one Person. And that one Person took on flesh within the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Mary became the Mother of God, a pure gift from Heaven and not something she merited on her own. She possessed a unique quality that qualified her for that role: her immaculate nature.

First, she was preserved from all sin when she was conceived within the womb of her mother. God chose to take that gift of grace and transcend time to impart it to her at the moment of her conception, making her the perfect and pure instrument to bring forth God into the world.

Next, Mary remained faithful to this gift of grace throughout her life, never choosing to sin, never turning from God. She remained immaculate throughout her life. Interestingly, it is this choice of hers that makes her more fully the Mother of God than the simple act of bearing Him within her womb.

Today, let us reflect upon these most solemn mysteries of our faith. This eighth day of the Octave of Christmas is a solemn celebration and one worthy of our pondering in your own heart, allowing the grace of this holy celebration to fill you with joy and gratitude.

May the Blessings of the Christ Child dwell within us and our families today and forever. Amen.
