Sacraments

Baptism

- 3rd Sunday monthly, after 10 a.m. Mass; please pre-register and submit sponsor certificates at least 1 week prior to the baptism
- Pre-Baptism class for first child <u>ONLY</u> as required by the Diocese; offered the 4th Sunday of January, April, July and October at 11:30 a.m. in Mary's Room. Registration is required.

Anointing of the Sick Celebrated at Masses annually during October or at home at the request of family.

- •In cases of emergency: at hospital or other medical facility when a priest is available.
- •In non-emergency cases: call the parish or a Catholic hospital chaplain nearest the location of person to be anointed.

Holy Communion for the Homebound

Call to arrange for Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. Priest visits on First Friday. Please call if you are ill and confined to home.

Hospital Calls

Please notify the Parish Office when you or a member of your family is hospitalized. Be sure to let the hospital know that you are Catholic and if you would like the Catholic Chaplain to visit. If it is an emergency, be sure to call the priest on call. Most hospitals also have Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion who bring Holy Communion to Catholic patients. Let your nurse know you are a Catholic and would like to receive Holy Communion.

Sponsor Requirements

Direct requests for sponsor certificates to a priest. Individuals must

- be registered and practicing members of the parish
- be at least 16 years of age
- and have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- if married, be in a marriage accepted by the Catholic Church.

THE THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM THE KITCHEN TABLE OF THE SENIOR PRIEST-RETIRED

There are many lessons that can be taken from the Gospel according to Mark for this 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time. I have always been impressed by blind Bartimaeus who is begging by the side of the road as Jesus happened to come by. Once Bartimaeus learned that all the commotion was about Jesus, the blind beggar wants Jesus to help him. It was not a quiet or simple request such as, "O Jesus, over here please". No, Bartimaeus wants to make sure that Jesus knows that he wants Jesus' help, so he shouts out, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." SON OF DAVID was a title linking this Jesus to the yearning of all of the Jewish people for the Messiah. Scripture scholars can debate whether this was a grace, a special insight given by the Holy Spirit to Bartimaeus to "see" Jesus for who He really is, OR was it just a grand compliment to get Jesus' attention just as the performer Bruce Springsteen is called "the Boss".

The lesson I wish to point out is that at first "many rebuked him, telling him to be silent." The crowd tells him to shut up, but he is NOT going to be silent. Bartimaeus "kept calling out all the more, 'Son of David, have pity on me.'" It worked! Jesus stopped and said to call this guy who is shouting out. Notice that the fickle crowd now changes its tune. Now the crowd is encouraging the blind man to get up, "Take courage,...Jesus is calling you."

Of course as we live our lives today we ought to be aware of whatever family, school, workplace or the public in general are feeling and encouraging us to do. But each of us as an individual ultimately has to decide what he or she will do. Is it best to stop and offer help or to get away from a situation and be safe? Does this situation call for the virtue of prudence or the virtue of fortitude? I end this gospel reflection with a prayer that my pastor while I was in the second grade taught our First Communion class:

Holy Spirit, help me to know what you want me to do, and then give me the grace to do it.




Ushers Needed for Saturday and Sunday Masses!
