





#### From the Desk of Father Steve: HAPPY EASTER!!



"God's compassion for us is all the more wonderful because Christ died, not for the righteous or the holy but for the wicked and the sinful, and, though the divine nature could not be touched by the sting of death, He took to Himself, through His birth as one of us, something He could offer on our behalf. By dying He submitted to the laws of the underworld; by rising again He destroyed them. He did away with the everlasting character of death so as to make death a thing of time, not of eternity."

-Pope St. Leo the Great (400-461 AD)

Happy Easter everyone! The Lord is risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia! With today's most solemn celebration, we reach the summit of Holy Week and the greatest victory

known in the history of the universe. In order to save man, God became man, so that He could suffer and die in our place, rising again from the grave to set us free from the evil reign of sin and death. What great joy this day gives to our hearts as we celebrate with all the Church, and indeed, with all of heaven and earth the victory of our God. A victory of love over hate, peace over chaos, light over darkness, joy over sadness, life over death. For the Lord is risen as He said, Alleluia!

I think that it is important for us to really take to heart and ponder the words above from one of the great popes and doctors of the Church, St. Leo the Great. They are profound and deep and can help to shape our hearts as we celebrate these days of joy. First, Pope St. Leo speaks about how shockingly wonderful God's infinite love for each of us is: that He died in our place, paying the price for our sins with His own blood *while we were yet sinners*. He came to save us who didn't even realize how desperately we needed to be saved. And since the divine nature is not able to be touched by death, since God is pure life, pure existence, existence itself, He willingly took on our human nature, uniting it permanently to His divine nature, so that He could suffer and die in the likeness of man and so restore to man the likeness of God which had been marred so dreadfully by the poison of sin. Praise God who loves us even when we don't love Him as we should, who saves us even when we don't think we need to be saved, who chases after us when we walk away from Him.

And the second point that I would like for us to take to heart from these words of Pope St. Leo are as follows: "Jesus did away with the everlasting character of death so as to make death a thing of time, not of eternity." Wow, is this a profound and spiritually rich statement! Remember, brothers and sisters, without Jesus' death and resurrection, we would be doomed to damnation in hell for all eternity because of the weight and consequences of our sins. Before Jesus' death and resurrection, death was an everlasting reality- physical death meant the beginning of eternal death in hell. It was the only option- without the Savior, there would be no salvation.

But by dying and rising for our salvation, God has changed the nature of death from being an automatic sentence of eternal death to being a thing of time, not eternity. In other words, physical death is no longer the automatic precursor to eternal death in hell; for the Christian, physical death is a momentary affliction that leads to eternal life in Heaven. This is what it means when we say that Christ, by dying destroyed our death and by rising restored our life: death is not the final destination, it is a temporary moment in time that leads to an eternity of joy, happiness, love, and peace.

Let us never forget, brothers and sisters, that this feast is of *incredible eternal significance!* Our salvation after our death, our chance to go to Heaven all depends upon Christ's voluntary suffering, death and resurrection to pay the debt of our sins and reconcile us to the Father in Heaven. And since nothing is more important than the attainment of eternal life, nothing is more important to celebrate on earth than the victory of Easter! Alleluia, Alleluia!

He told her to have an image painted of Him showing the water and blood which poured from His heart for His people. (Her diary was published and is available in the parish library.) In honor of this feast, there will be an extra time for confessions at 2:00 pm Sunday, April 11<sup>th</sup>, as we trust in Jesus' ever-flowing mercy. There is nothing He won't forgive if you turn to Him.


