



### From the Desk of Father Steve: Frequently Asked Questions on Faith



Question: I've heard a lot about "annulments" in the Catholic Church, but I am not sure what an annulment actually is. Is just the Catholic form of divorce? Can you explain what an annulment is and why a person might need one?

This is a very good question, but it is also a complex question. Annulments are one of those topics in Church teaching that require a fair amount of background information and knowledge about the faith for it to really make sense. So, I will be answering the above question over the next several bulletin articles. Hopefully, this will serve to make the topic of annulments more approachable for you, the reader, and by understanding annulments more fully, also give you a deeper appreciation and admiration for the holy sacrament of marriage.

Before being able to have a helpful discussion on annulments however, it is vitally important that we be clear and "on the same page" regarding what we as Catholics believe and hold to be true about marriage. Because if a person has an incomplete understanding of marriage, then understanding the nature and purpose of the annulment process will be difficult. So, this week, let's start with a refresher on what it is that we believe about marriage.

First, we must remember that marriage is a unique type of relationship that has been created by God, and is very specific in what it is, and in what it is not. This is the first key to having an authentic understanding of marriage- realizing that God specifically created the marital relationship. Marriage is therefore a specific kind of relationship, created by God, with certain required features, and a given definition. Marriage is not, as some would like to argue, a merely human institution of social convenience. In other words, the marital relationship is bigger than the two people who enter into it. God made marriage, we did not. We have received it as God's gift to the human race, and therefore, we do not have the power to redefine it, reshape it, or reimagine it's defining qualities.

The Church therefore delineates a very specific definition of what marriage is. This is found in the Code of Canon Law, the Church's collection of guiding laws and principles. Please note: this definition applies to all marriages, not just marriages involving Catholics. That's because, again, marriage is a specific type of relationship that is rooted in the creation of two biological sexes, male and female, and the plan that God has written into our very nature as human beings by which we are all bound as His creatures. Thus, the Church states: "The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life and which is ordered by its nature to the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring, has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament between the baptized." Please notice something very important here: marriage is a *natural* institution. By this I mean that it is a specific and unique type of relationship that flows from our very nature as human beings who have been made male and female by our Creator. In other words, the desire for marriage, the desire for a man and a woman to unite themselves together by a bond that is lifelong and which has as its purpose the greater good of the two involved, as well as the procreation of children and raising a family together, is a desire that is written into our very nature as human beings by God Himself. That is why we see marriage between one man and one woman all over the world, not just in Christian communities. It is innate in us as human beings created in God's image and likeness to desire communion with another person, and to commit ourselves to that person through a lifelong covenant. Therefore, at its most basic level, marriage is a natural institution: that means that it flows from our nature as human beings. It is not a Christianonly institution; it is a human institution.

However, God through Jesus Christ has taken this human institution that He created of the covenant of marriage and raised it to the level of a sacrament when it is celebrated between two people who have both received the sacrament of Christian baptism. So, God has taken that which was natural and good and elevated it to a greater good for the baptized. Now, the sacrament of marriage, besides being a natural good, is a source of supernatural grace for Christian spouses. I will speak further on the definition of marriage in my next article.
