



#### From the Desk of Father Steve: Merry Christmas and a Blessed and Happy New Year!



Merry Christmas, dear friends! One of the great joys of our Catholic faith is that we know how to feast when it is time to feast! And so, Christmas is not a one day event for us, as it is for so many in our world- Christmas is an entire season of celebration, which, this year, extends all the way through next Sunday, January 8th, the Solemnity of the Epiphany. I would encourage you heartily to do a few things at home in order to recall this important fact that we celebrate Christmas for a whole season and not just a single day. First, keep on

listening to Christmas music, especially sacred Christmas music (Christmas hymns). Second, keep on wishing people a merry Christmas. Sure, you may get a few odd looks if you wish someone "Merry Christmas" on January 8th, but that also gives you an opportunity to let them know that you are still celebrating Christmas! Third, keep your Christmas tree and your Christmas decorations up through the celebration of the Solemnity of the Epiphany (if the tree hasn't gotten too dry!). Fourth, start your family meal each day by saying grace and singing a verse or two of a favorite Christmas hymn. In all these things, it is important to remember that the event of Jesus' birth is much too significant to be bound to one day- it needs a whole season of celebration!

This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, which occurs each year exactly one week after Christmas. What a great way for us to begin the new calendar year! We do so by honoring our Mother, Mary, who through her humility and obedience, brought forth for us our Savior, Jesus Christ. Below is a portion of a homily from St. Bernard of Clairvaux, who imagines himself speaking to the Blessed Virgin at the moment when the Archangel Gabriel has asked her to consent to becoming the mother of God, but before she replies. May God bless you and your family as you ring in the new year! And, Merry Christmas!  $\sim Fr$ . Steve

You have heard, O Virgin, that you will conceive and bear a son; you have heard that it will not be by man but by the Holy Spirit. The angel awaits an answer; it is time for him to return to God who sent him. We too are waiting, O Lady, for your word of compassion; the sentence of condemnation weighs heavily upon us. The price of our salvation is offered to you. We shall be set free at once if you consent. In the eternal Word of God we all came to be, and behold, we die. In your brief response we are to be remade in order to be recalled to life.

Tearful Adam with his sorrowing family begs this of you, O loving Virgin, in their exile from Paradise. Abraham begs it, David begs it. All the other holy patriarchs, your ancestors, ask it of you, as they dwell in the country of the shadow of death. This is what the whole earth waits for, prostrate at your feet. It is right in doing so, for on your word depends comfort for the wretched, ransom for the captive, freedom for the condemned, indeed, salvation for all the sons of Adam, the whole of your race.

Answer quickly, O Virgin. Reply in haste to the angel, or rather through the angel to the Lord. Answer with a word, receive the Word of God. Speak your own word, conceive the divine Word. Breathe a passing word, embrace the eternal Word.

Why do you delay, why are you afraid? Believe, give praise, and receive. Let humility be bold, let modesty be confident. This is no time for virginal simplicity to forget prudence. In this matter alone, O prudent Virgin, do not fear to be presumptuous. Though modest silence is pleasing, dutiful speech is now more necessary. Open your heart to faith, O blessed Virgin, your lips to praise, your womb to the Creator. See, the desired of all nations is at your door, knocking to enter. If he should pass by because of your delay, in sorrow you would begin to seek him afresh, the One whom your soul loves. Arise, hasten, open. Arise in faith, hasten in devotion, open in praise and thanksgiving. Behold the handmaid of the Lord, she says, be it done to me according to your word.
