



From the Desk of Father Steve: A Special Celebration Next Sunday



Next Sunday, February 2nd, we will have a special opportunity to celebrate a specific feast day. Each year, February 2nd is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This feast always occurs on February 2nd, because it is 40 days after Christmas. This year of 2025, because February 2nd falls on a Sunday, and because the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is a celebration of a higher rank than what would have been the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we will celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord next Sunday instead of the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. But - we may ask - what exactly do we celebrate on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord?

According to the Old Testament law of Moses (see Leviticus 12:2–8), the woman who gave birth to a boy was unable for forty days to touch anything sacred or to enter the temple area by reason of her legal (ritual) impurity, due to the flow of blood from childbirth. At the end of this period she is required to offer a year-old lamb as a burnt offering and a turtledove or young pigeon as an expiation of sin. The woman who could not afford a lamb offered instead two turtledoves or two young pigeons (which is what Mary offers due to her and St. Joseph's poverty). In addition, according to the law of Moses, the first-born male was to be consecrated to the Lord, as belonging to the Lord. So, as faithful Jews, Mary and St. Joseph fulfill the requirements of God's law in the Old Testament by bringing the baby Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem in order to both present Him to the Lord as the first-born male child, and to make the required offering for Mary's regaining of her ritual purity after childbirth.

And what happens when Mary and Joseph do this is astounding and beautiful. They are met there by an elderly man, Simeon, who is a holy and prayerful man, and who has been waiting for God to send His Messiah to save His people, Israel. And now, by the grace of the Holy Spirit, when he sees the baby Jesus, Simeon recognizes Jesus to be God's promised Messiah. Which is why, taking the child Jesus in his arms, Simeon prays to God: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

And it is because of this description of Jesus as the "light for revelation to the Gentiles" that this Mass on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is sometimes referred to as "Candlemas." At the Mass for the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, it is customary that the priest begins the Mass by blessing candles which will be used later in the Sacred Liturgy, since blessed candles remind us of Jesus, Who is the light of the world, and the light of our lives.

Below is a quote about this special feast day from St. Sophronius, a bishop from the early 7th century. God bless you!

Our lighted candles are a sign of the divine splendor of the one who comes to expel the dark shadows of evil and to make the whole universe radiant with the brilliance of his eternal light. Our candles also show how bright our souls should be when we go to meet Christ. The Mother of God, the most pure Virgin, carried the true light in her arms and brought him to those who lay in darkness. We too should carry a light for all to see and reflect the radiance of the true light as we hasten to meet him.

The light has come and has shone upon a world enveloped in shadows; the Dayspring from on high has visited us and given light to those who lived in darkness. This, then, is our feast, and we join in procession with lighted candles to reveal the light that has shone upon us and the glory that is yet to come to us through him. So let us hasten all together to meet our God.
