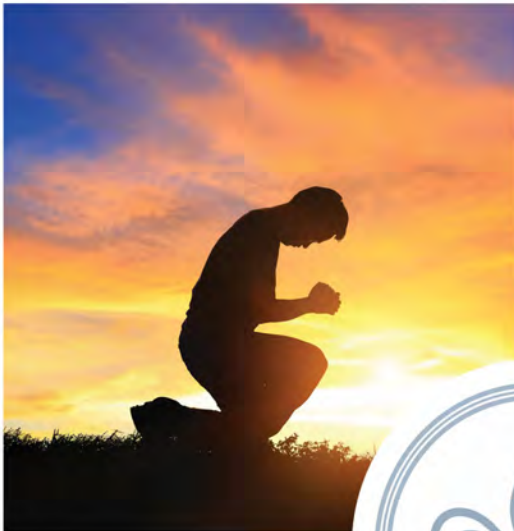

PULSE OF THE PARISH

QUESTION #1: When will all Parishioners be important in this Parish? Such as participation is not wanted, just money.

Answer: First, I want to thank you for taking the time to express your thoughts in the Pulse of the Parish "Q" and "A" box. It helps Parish Council to get handle on the viewpoints of our parishioners.

I can assure you, as a parish council member, that we want all parishioners to feel important and needed within our parish community.

We would appreciate to have your suggestions as to how we can help change your perception as St. Francis/John community. Participation by all parishioners is very important to fulfill our Parish Mission Statements.

There are three (3) suggestions that relate to "participation" in your question that I would like to address (and nothing related to money). Our parish has over 30 activities that need parishioners to help in their implementation. Examples include; 1) extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, 2) greeters (hospitality), 3) Communion to the homebound, 4) mowing and trimming at St. Francis Church and cemetery. We are in the process of rolling out a year-long Stewardship Plan. I like this definition of stewardship which is "returning to God a portion of what he has given you, an act of thanksgiving, a way of living your life". Your participation in this plan would be appreciated.

A second suggestion for involvement is the Stephen Ministry. This is a new program being led by Ozanna Allen. Her e-mail is: ozanna@att.net. This is a program for persons to minister to those going through major life changes.

A third suggestion, assuming you are 55+, would be to join the Double Nickel organization. It meets once a month, on the 2nd Monday for a potluck dinner in the Undercroft. It is a social group with the objective of having a good time, learn about activities in the community that may be fun to attend, and a small amount of charity to the Amen House.

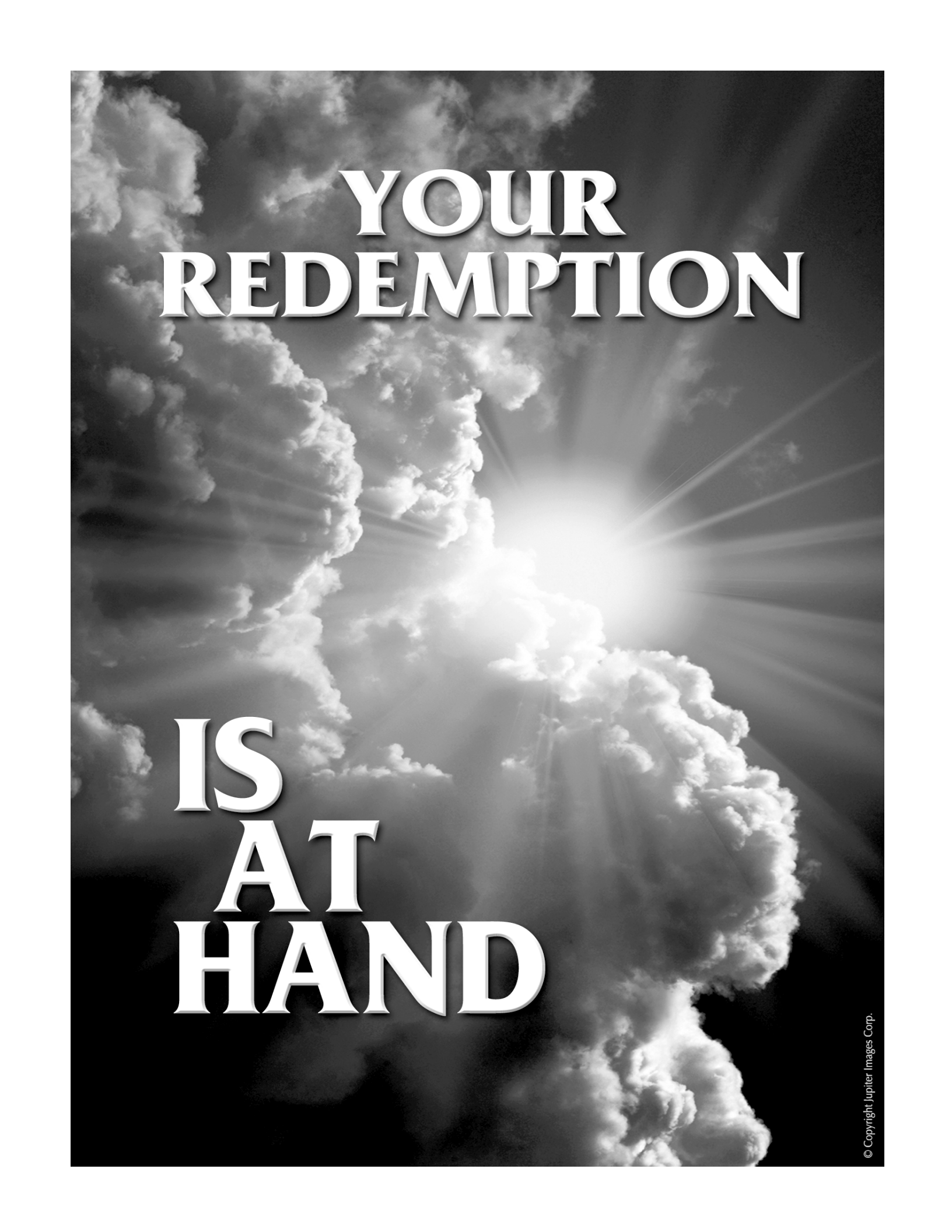
