

Epiphany House Blessing

In many cultures, it is customary to invoke blessings upon one's home on this Feast of the Epiphany. Gathered at the main door of your home, you are invited to hold a lighted candle and a small dish of water:



May God's peace be in this home and in the hearts of all who dwell within!

"Magi from the East came to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasure chests, they presented Him with precious gifts: gold for a great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of His burial."

Casper, Melchior and Balthassar are the traditional names given to the Magi. With water or chalk, trace their initials on the framework of the main entrance:

20 + C + M + B + 18

"Like the Magi, may we come before You, O Lord, in reverence and awe, offering to Your honor and glory, the gift of our life."

"Sacred is the threshold of our home, and holy is this door!
This is the meeting place of friends, neighbors, and strangers.
May it be a bridge for our comings and goings.

Whenever we stand within its sacred space, may our eyes be granted new vision, so that we can recognize the presence of Christ in everyone we greet."

"Lord, may this house be a dwelling of your peace and may your love radiate through its walls. Let our home be the shelter of health, purity and self-control.

May we always cherish your precious gifts of charity, humility, goodness, mildness, patience and understanding as we share our lives together and grow in the spirit of your love."

"Dear Lord, may we seek to faithfully live in accord with your covenant that your promises be fulfilled in our midst.

We ask this is the name of Your Son Jesus Christ who is Emmanuel, God-with-us, now and forever. Amen!"



Baptism of our Lord

January 8, 2018

t first glance, the Baptism of the Lord might seem an odd feast. Since the Catholic Church teaches that the Sacrament of Baptism is necessary for the remission of sins,



particularly Original Sin, why was Christ baptized? After all, He was born without Original Sin, and He lived His entire life without sinning. Therefore, He had no need of the sacrament, as we do.

In humbly submitting Himself to the baptism of John, however, Christ provided the example for the rest of us. If even He should be baptized, though He had no need of it, how much more should the rest of us be grateful for this sacrament, which frees us from the darkness of sin and incorporates us into the Church, the Body of Christ on earth. His Baptism, therefore, was necessary--not for Him, but for us!

Descending into the waters of the Jordan, Jesus, who shares our humanity, makes that living water flow with healing mercy. His Divine Life is now mediated through the Sacraments in the life of the Church which is His Body.

We who are baptized into Christ are called to participate in this ongoing redemptive mission. The public ministry of Jesus began at the waters of Jordan and continues through His Church. As members of this community, we have a special ability to give witness to all the virtues we admire in Christ. As members of His Body, we cherish our unique relationship to the saints, who give us abundant examples of how we can find a way that best suits our personalities and resources.

We talk about the Baptism of Christ as a share in the "Theophany" of God $^{\sim}$ an outward presentation of God's love for all humanity. After His Nativity in Bethlehem, he was recognized by the Angels, the Shepherds and the Magi. In the Eastern traditions of the Church, the Epiphany also includes his Baptism as well as his presence at the Wedding Feast of Cana.


In the fullness of the Divine plan, then, Christ is presented to all people, Jew & Gentile alike. We are incorporated into his life of grace through our own Baptism.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Today is the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. For centuries we as Catholics celebrated this Feast on Jan. 6, but the decision was made a number of years ago, in the United States, to celebrate the Epiphany on the Sunday which falls between January 2nd and 8th.



"Epiphany" means "manifestation." It is on this day that Jesus Christ, the Messiah, is revealed as the light of all nations. Officially Christmas is not over. In fact, the recommendation of the Church is that on this day those who display a crèche, a nativity or manger scene, should replace the shepherd and sheep with the Magi and their likely animals on which they traveled as well as their gifts. However, that is all secondary to the real meaning of this day.

At Christmas the Messiah Jesus was revealed to the shepherds, who were Jewish. But on this day the Lord is revealed to all nations and to the Gentiles (represented by the Magi). We are all familiar with the star the Magi followed, but we need to understand all that is happening and what it means. This all represents the Light of Christ, a Light which today we honor and commemorate. We are called to be the Light of Christ right now to those around us and those with whom we come in contact. That way we can be the disciples Christ wants us to be.

The poet William Cullen Bryant captures the significance of the star the Magi followed very well when he wrote, "O Father, may that Holy Star, Grow every year more bright, And send its glorious beams afar, To fill the world with light."


