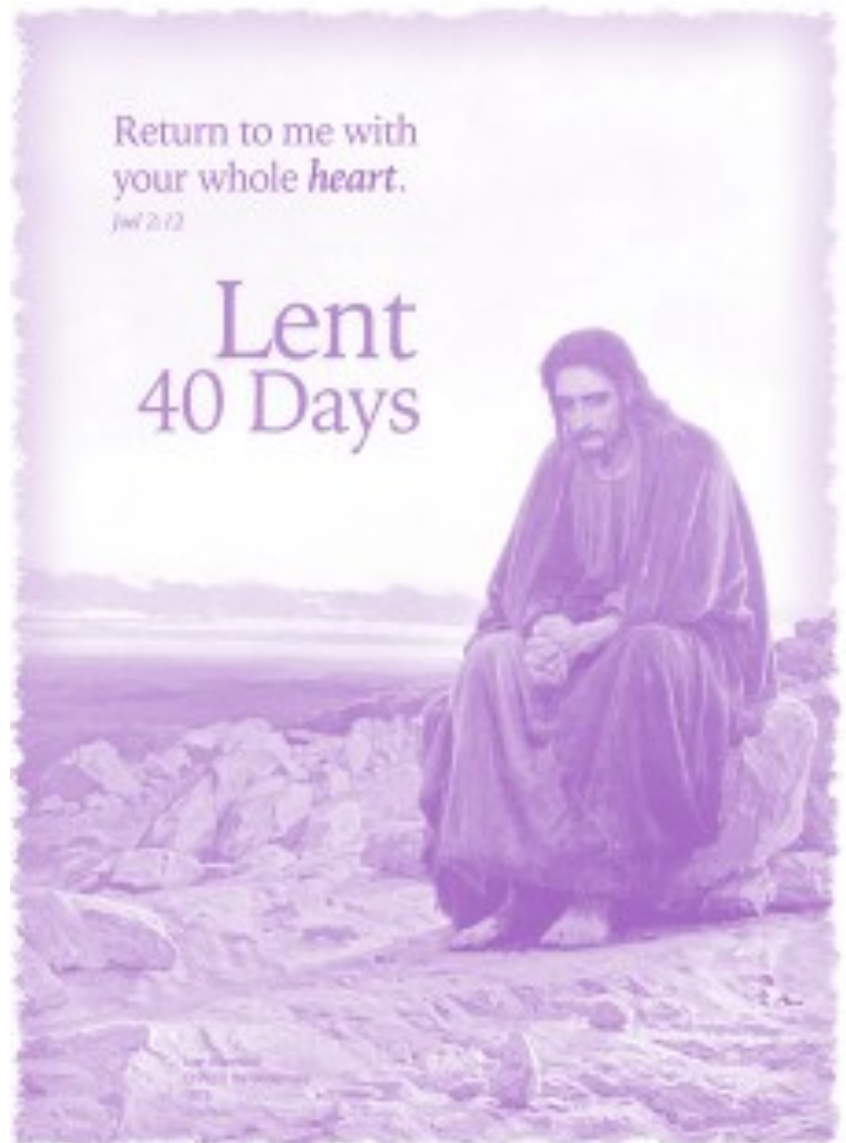

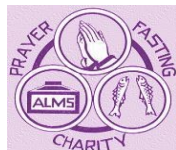
Since the earliest days of the Church, pilgrims have walked the streets of Jerusalem in the footsteps of Christ on his way to Calvary. Some of these events are noted in the Gospel accounts and some founded in ancient tradition. Since most people could not travel to that Holy City in person, customs developed of bringing Jerusalem to the local church! Everyone is also invited to enjoy bread and home-made soup in Madden Hall beginning at 6pm.



LENTEN REGULATIONS

Catholics 14 years of age and older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Catholics age 18-59 years of age are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday—a fast consisting of one normal meal and two lesser meals, with no eating in between.

It is also recommended that Catholics find opportunities through the Lenten season to complement their fasts with prayer, reception of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist, and positive works of charity.



FASTING AND FEASTING

Lent is a season of renewal and repentance. Our extra acts of prayer, fasting and charity help us focus on the important elements that give our life meaning. These “sacrifices,” have both a personal and a communal dimension. Our choices help us become more conscious of the poor and needy through extra works of charity and service. We should perform these actions not just for self-discipline, but also for the material and spiritual benefit of others. We offer the support of prayer as we accompany our candidates and catechumens on their journey to the Easter Sacraments. We make healthy choices in diet in order to cleanse our bodies and lives of needless baggage that weigh us down. By entering into the true spirit of Lent, we become renewed and refreshed. Lent should be more than a time of fasting; It should be a joyous season of feasting. Lent is a time to fast from certain things and feast on others. It is a season during which we should:

FAST from judging others;
FEAST on the Christ dwelling in them.
FAST from emphasis on differences;
FEAST on the unity of all life.
FAST from thoughts of illness;
FEAST on the healing power of God.
FAST from words that pollute;
FEAST on phrases that purify.
FAST from discontent;
FEAST on gratitude.
FAST from anger;
FEAST on patience.
FAST from pessimism;
FEAST on optimism.
FAST from worry;
FEAST on divine order.
FAST from complaining;
FEAST on affirmatives.
FAST from unrelenting pressures;
FEAST on unceasing prayer.
FAST from hostility;
FEAST on nonresistance.
FAST from bitterness;
FEAST on forgiveness.
FAST from self-concern;
FEAST on compassion for others.
FAST from personal anxiety;
FEAST on “letting go”
FAST from discouragement;
FEAST on hope.
FAST from facts that depress;
FEAST on thoughts that uplift.
FAST from suspicion;
FEAST on truth.
FAST from thoughts that weaken;
FEAST on promises that inspire.
FAST from sorrow;
FEAST on the peace of serenity.
FAST from idle gossip;
FEAST on purposeful silence.

COMPASSIONATE CAFÉ

Grief is the normal and natural reaction to loss. Unfortunately, society's clichés about grief, "be strong", "keep busy", "time heals all wounds", may have caused you to cover up your normal and natural responses to loss.

The simple truth is that you may not have much helpful information with which to grieve and complete the losses that have occurred in your life. Consequently, you may have spent an inordinate amount of time and energy covering up the painful feelings associated with loss.

Beginning **March 2, 2020**, St. John the Beloved Church is sponsoring The Grief Recovery Method® Grief Support Group, which is operated under the format and guidelines established by *The Grief Recovery Institute*. This action program meets weekly from 7 - 9 PM for 8 weeks and is designed to assist people in completing the pain caused by loss.

The facilitator for the program is Paul Brustowicz, a Certified Grief Recovery Specialist. This evidence-based, time-proven method is based in part on helping griever's create a new level of awareness. Part of the process is helping you to better understand all the different life experiences that produce grief.

SUNDAY CONNECTION

In each of the three Synoptic Gospels (Mark, Matthew, and Luke), after Jesus' baptism by John, Jesus is reported to have gone to the desert to fast and pray for 40 days. In each case, while in the desert, Jesus is tempted by the devil.

Matthew and Luke give more detail than Mark does, but each one tells how the devil tempts Jesus in the desert. In Matthew, as in Luke, the devil presents three temptations to Jesus. The devil tempts Jesus to use his power to appease his hunger; he tempts Jesus to put God's promise of protection to the test; and he offers Jesus all of the kingdoms of the world if Jesus will worship the devil. In each case, Jesus resists the temptation, rebuking the devil with words from Scripture.

The account of Jesus' temptation in the desert is filled with allusions and parallels to the Old Testament, including the story of the people of Israel. The Israelites spent 40 years wandering in the desert in Exodus, for example, and Jesus spends 40 days in the desert. As the Israelites were tempted during the Exodus, so too is Jesus tempted.

Each temptation offers insight into both God and the human condition. Jesus' rejection of the temptations shows that he will not put God to the test. Grounding himself on the word and authority of Scripture, Jesus rebukes the devil, confident in God's protection and faithfulness.

As we start our journey through Lent, our Sunday readings call us to adopt the same confidence that Jesus had in the face of temptation: God's word alone will suffice; God's
