

FATHER RAY AND THE STAFF WISH YOU A VERY BLESSED CHRISTMAS!

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I want to say a big THANK YOU to all those who have contributed to memorials for the recent church renovation. May our Good Lord richly bless you!

In the next few weeks, we will have the memorial plaques for y'all.

There is one more item that has not yet been memorialized, the tall white marble standing angel on the right side of the altar. The one on the other side has already been memorialized. If there is anyone who would like to do this memorial, the donation would be \$6000. That is the cost of the Carrera marble for the 3 foot pedestal and the 4 foot tall angel.

Just to let everyone know, the total cost of the project was \$150,510. That covered the purchase and installation of the Stations of the Cross, the St John The Beloved statue, the marble items, the flooring, and other related expenses.

With that last memorial of the tall standing angel on the right side, we will have taken in \$117,497 in memorials. If my math is correct, that means that the cost to our parish for everything would be \$33,013.

I felt it was extremely important to put the tabernacle in the center of the church. Keep in mind that the recent Pew Research study found that over 50% of the Catholics who responded to them did not believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Now, many of those people who responded to the survey and said they were Catholic were probably not practicing their faith, but this statistic is very alarming!

Therefore, it is crucial at this time in our history to keep the Eucharist, and the tabernacle, in the center.

Also, before the changes, there was no focal point in the church when one first walked in. Now, as someone enters the church, the two standing angels bring the attention to the tabernacle and the altar. Also, the work lightened up our church, which before was very dark.

Thank you so much, and may the joy of this Advent season fill your hearts!

GRIEF SUPPORT

In 2021, St. John's will sponsor three programs on grief support in conjunction with The Grief Recovery Institute®.

On Monday, January 4 at 7:15 in the Commons, Paul Brustowicz, a Certified Grief Recovery Specialist, will present a general program about The Grief Recovery Method® and two new programs: one for helping children with loss and the other on pet loss. You can register for the courses after the program.

The Grief Recovery Method®: Helping Children with Loss Program (For Parents and Guardians of Grieving Children) is a four-week program for adults who want to help their children and grandchildren deal with loss and grief. It begins January 11 at 7:15 in The Commons.

The Grief Recovery Method® Pet Loss Recovery and Support Program is a six-week program for adults who are grieving the loss of a pet. It begins January 5 at 7:15 in The Commons.

The Grief Recovery Method®: Grief Support Group for adults is a time-proven method based in part on helping griever create a new level of awareness. Part of the process is helping you to better understand all the different life experiences that produce grief. This eight-week program starts March 1 at 7:15 in The Commons.

THE ADVENT WREATH originated in the German Lutheran Church and signifies the passing of time during the four weeks of **the Season. The evergreen wreath stands for God's** time in eternity, and the four candles represent the marking of our time on earth -

Kairos and **Kronos**, respectively. There are no prescribed colors for the candles. In the Roman tradition, the three purple and one pink candle marked our liturgical time before the reforms of Vatican II when Advent was considered more of a penitential season, much like Lent. The pink candle was a reminder to find joy amidst our penance. It was lit during the third week, beginning with *Gaudete Sunday*. Special prayers are said as the candles are lit and we mark our time of preparation for the coming of the Lord:

*O come, Desire of nations, bind
in one the hearts of all humankind;
Bid thou our sad divisions cease,
and be for us our Prince of Peace.
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel
Shall come to thee, O Israel!*

Lord, God of love and mercy, help us follow the example of Mary, always ready to do your will. At the message of an angel she welcomed your eternal Son. Filled with the light of your Spirit, she became the temple of your Word Jesus. It is He who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.



SUNDAY CONNECTION



This Sunday we read the story of the angel Gabriel's announcement to Mary about the birth of Jesus. This story is found only in Luke's Gospel. On this fourth Sunday of Advent, the liturgy shifts our attention from John the

Baptist to Mary, the mother of Jesus. Both John and Mary serve as important figures for our reflection during the season of Advent; they both played instrumental roles in preparing the way for Jesus. Last week we reflected on John the Baptist's announcement that the Savior was among us, although not yet recognized. This week we reflect upon Mary's example of faith and obedience to God, traits which permitted her to receive the angel's message that God's Son would be born as a human person, as one of us.

We are familiar with the story of the Annunciation, and it is fitting that we recall how God announced the birth of Jesus as we make our final preparations for our celebration of the Incarnation. The angel Gabriel visited Mary, a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph. Mary greeted the angel's news with awe and wonder and asked how it could be possible that she could give birth to a child. In his reply, the angel Gabriel announced the seemingly impossible reality: the child to be born would be conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and would be God's own Son. The angel reported to Mary another miracle; her relative Elizabeth was also pregnant despite having been thought to be unable to have a child. Mary's response to the angel, which is called her *fiat*, is an example of complete faith and obedience to God.

The story of the Annunciation calls to our attention God's wondrous action in human history. God chose a human person to give birth to his Son so that all humanity would know God's salvation. Mary, already full of God's grace, was able to cooperate in this great plan for our salvation. Thus Jesus was born as one of us, fully human and also fully divine. This is the mystery we prepare to celebrate at Christmas, the mystery of the Incarnation. In the model of Mary, we pray that we will be people of faith who recognize God's saving plan for us and are able respond with obedience.
