2021 BISHOP'S Annual Appeal

- FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS -

What is the Bishop's Annual Appeal?

The Bishop's Annual Appeal (BAA), is a primary source of funding to help sustain and expand the ministries of the 93 parishes, 20 missions, 33 Catholic schools, and multiple agencies throughout the Diocese of Charleston.

Why should people give to the Appeal?

We are stewards of the gifts God blesses us with, and this includes our money. Yes, we might EARN it, but only because God has first given us our talents and gifts to utilize in the world. We are called to share what we have been given. Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."

Why do we need these ministries and programs?

The Catholic Church offers outreach and serves the needs of so many people in our diocese and beyond – Catholic or not. We are called to serve others and to invite them into communion with Jesus Christ and His Church by living out the Gospel. The ministries supported by the Appeal provide tangible ways to help so many who are in need, offer education and formation to build up strong disciples in the faith, education for our future priests, and so much more.

Does my gift make a difference, even if it's small?

Yes! Each of us must discern what we can give in response to God's generosity to us. If our gift is intentional, even though small, it is a gift of good stewardship and an act of faith. Together, everyone in the diocese makes a tremendous difference – accomplishing far more than any one of us could on our own. Your participation and the joy and love that you share by supporting your brothers and sisters in Christ is what's most important.

Can the funds raised by the Annual Appeal be used for anything other than their stated purpose?

No, donations to the BAA are restricted. The diocese has designated these funds to be used only for the purpose in which the donations were intended. The diocese has an obligation to honor the wishes of the donors and use these funds for the purpose they were collected.

What's the difference between the Bishop's Annual Appeal and the Bicentennial Campaign?

The Church's mission is advanced in important ways through both the Bishop's Annual Appeal and the Bicentennial Campaign. In some areas, the Appeal supports the daily operation of critical ministries throughout our diocese, while the Bicentennial Campaign funds more strategic, comprehensive, long-range, and larger scale initiatives to help the Church serve its people and prepare for doing the Lord's work in the future.

BIBLE STUDY IS BACK

Have you ever wondered how the Bible was written or been reluctant to read the library, the Bible is a collection of books, because it was intimidating and difficult to comprehend? In two sessions on Bible Basics Father Ray will explain how Catholics understand Scripture and answer your questions. Sessions are on February 9th and February 16th, in the church at 10 AM and will be live streamed for those who cannot attend in person.

Immediately following Bible Basics, for the remainder of Lent, we will focus on the Scriptural basis of the Mass. Learn the Biblical back-round of the words, prayers and gestures and study the three key aspects: sacrifice, real Presence and Holy Communion. The five-session course begins Tuesday, February 23rd and ends before Holy Week, March 23. There will be live sessions at 10 AM and 7 PM in Madden Hall. We may also add a virtual session if there is sufficient interest. The cost of materials is \$20. Due to social distancing requirements, seating for both courses is limited, so register early. THE COMPASSIONATE CAFÉ

You don't have to live in the low country very long to notice the abundance of Canada geese around every community pond, golf course and overhead. Writing for The Compassionate Friends newsletter, grief counselor Alan Wolfelt suggests that griever would benefit by emulating some of natural instincts of that flock of geese in your pond. Let me paraphrase.

Geese fly in a V-formation that provides more lift for every goose in the flock on their journey than a goose flying alone. Thought: grief is a journey and traveling with other grievers makes the journey easier.

A goose that isolates from the flock has a difficult time making its journey since the lift is no longer there. Grievers who isolate also face a tougher journey than trying to go it alone.

When a goose does leave the formation two other geese will follow it and encourage it back into the formation. Another benefit of the group: encouragement from others on the journey. Not advice, not criticism, not judgement, just encouragement to go on.

Lastly, the geese honk to one another as a form of encouragement and mutual support while flying in formation. Implication: There are times in life when we all need encouragement from fellow travelers to remind us of our interconnectedness. We must allow ourselves to rely on one another; otherwise, when we are in grief we end up feeling totally alone and completely isolated.

SUNDAY CONNECTION

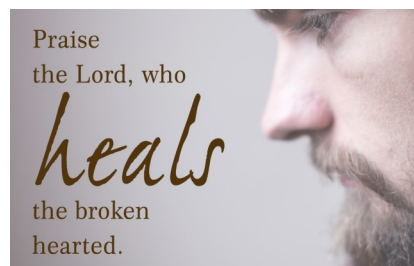
Today we continue to read from Mark's Gospel, learning more about the ministry of Jesus. Jesus cured Simon's mother-in-law, and she immediately began to serve Jesus and his disciples. Jesus also cured many others who were brought to him, healing their illnesses and driving out demons. As we will see throughout Mark's Gospel, Jesus did not permit the demons to speak because they knew his identity and would have revealed it to those who were present.

On the morning after this busy day, Jesus retreated in prayer, but was pursued by Simon and others who brought news that many people were looking for him. At this point in Mark's Gospel, we begin to see a distinct role for the inner circle of Jesus' disciples—they act as intermediaries between Jesus and the people. Jesus reports to his disciples that they need to leave Capernaum to preach in other places.

Today's Gospel completes a picture of Jesus' ministry: preaching, curing the sick, driving out demons, and then moving on to continue this work in another place. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus did this throughout Galilee.

Jesus' compassion and healing of the sick is a sign of the Kingdom of God. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence to others in its ministry to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness.

In today's Gospel we also notice the importance of [prayer](#) in Jesus' daily life. Jesus rose early in the morning, removed himself from the crowds, and went to a deserted place to pray. When the disciples found him, he told them that it was time to move on. We believe that in his prayers Jesus found guidance and direction from God. We also bring our decision-making to God in prayer, asking for his guidance and direction in our lives.
