

The S.C. House of Representatives passed the first round of the annual state budget. This \$9.8B fund includes several provisions that the S.C. Catholic Conference was proud to support, including the following provisos to:

- 1. protect religious organizations who have for decades provided valuable foster care services to vulnerable children who seek a safe and stable home; with the passing of this proviso these organizations will not have to forgo their religious beliefs and mission in order to provide this needed service to children in our state:
- 2. grow and embolden the special needs programs for children in our Catholic schools;
- 3. restrict access to abortion services in the state health plan;
- 4. increase broadband internet access to our rural communities;
- 5. increase the base student cost for each student in our public schools;
- 6. afford each public school in the state to have a nurse on staff;
- 7. insure that non-public school students are not barred from participating in interscholastic athletic programs due to attendance zone barriers established by the S.C. High School League.

This budget now heads to the Senate. We pray they continue to uphold the dignity of the human person in their deliberations. Please encourage your parishioners to contact their state representatives to support these important, life-affirming provisos.

COMPASSIONATE CAFE



At The Compassionate Cafe we share our feelings of grief without judgement, criticism or advice. We are not a prayer group but we do talk about our prayers for relief and recovery from the pain of

our losses. At our last meeting, we had a book review of Joyce Rupp's Praying our Goodbyes, A Spiritual Companion Through Life's Losses and Sorrows.

Praying our Goodbyes is really two books in one. In the first half, Rupp takes us on a journey of goodbyes: death, divorce, relationships in disrepair and other sufferings in life that can lead to despair. Through stories about loss and suffering, some from her personal experience, she leads us to introspection at the end of each chapter with questions for reflection, integration and discussion. The second half of the book is devoted to Prayers for those experiencing goodbyes. These twenty-four prayers are unique in that she provides not just words but instructions for the prayerful environment to say our goodbyes to different kinds of losses. The pattern is the same for all twenty-four: an image, an opening prayer, a reflection, a prayer, some scripture, and a closing prayer. 

SUNDAY CONNECTION



Today we begin the Easter Season, our 50-day meditation on the mystery of Christ's

Resurrection. Our Gospel today tells us about the disciples' discovery of the empty tomb. It concludes by telling us that they did not yet understand that Jesus had risen from the dead. Thus, the details provided are not necessarily meant to offer proof of the Resurrection. The details invite us to reflect upon a most amazing gift, that is faith in Jesus and his Resurrection. Each of the four Gospels tells us that Jesus' empty tomb was first discovered by women. This is notable because in first-century Jewish society women could not serve as legal witnesses. In the case of John's Gospel, the only woman attending the tomb is Mary of Magdala. Unlike the Synoptic accounts, John's Gospel does not describe an appearance of angels at the tomb. Instead, Mary is simply said to have observed that the stone that had sealed the tomb had been moved, and she runs to alert Simon Peter and the beloved disciple. Her statement to them is telling. She assumes that Jesus' body has been removed, perhaps stolen. She does not consider that Jesus has been raised from the dead.

Simon Peter and the beloved disciple race to the tomb, presumably to verify Mary's report. The beloved disciple arrives first but does not enter the tomb until after Simon Peter. This detail paints a vivid picture, as does the detail provided about the burial cloths. Some scholars believe that the presence of the burial cloths in the tomb offers evidence to the listener that Jesus' body had not been stolen (it is understood that grave robbers would have taken the burial cloths together with the body). The Gospel passage concludes, however, that even having seen the empty tomb and the burial cloths, the disciples do not yet understand about the Resurrection. In the passage that follows, Mary of Magdala meets Jesus but mistakes him for the gardener. In the weeks ahead, the Gospel readings from our liturgy will show us how the disciples came to believe in Jesus' Resurrection through his appearances to them. Our Easter faith is based on their witness to both the empty tomb and their continuing relationship with Jesus—in his appearances and in his gift of the Holy Spirit.
