



I look forward to this new opportunity to hear where the Lord has been leading you. Please be assured of my prayers for you. May God bless you, and may he give you the courage to do his will.



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

World Mission Sunday will be celebrated on Sunday, Oct. 22, and Pope Francis asks all of us to focus not on the country in which we live, but on the mission fields of our world. Why? Because there are 258,540 religious sisters laboring there; 844,000 catechists teaching the faith to the world's villages; 38,140 seminarians studying for the priesthood; 8,750 shelters serving the homeless; and 26 million children receiving necessary assistance.

Pope Francis has sent a call to each of us to go into our world and proclaim the presence of Christ, to make his love visible and real through missionary work that reaches to the ends of the earth. He said all of us "can contribute to this missionary movement with our prayers and activities, with material offerings and the offering of our sufferings, and our personal witness.

"Just as the two disciples of Emmaus told the others what had taken place along the way (cf. Lk 24:35), so too our proclamation will be a joyful telling of Christ the Lord, his life, his passion, this death and resurrection, and the wonders that his love has accomplished in our lives," the pope said.

Missio ad Gentes, the Vatican II document on the missionary nature of the Church, reminds us that the Church of Christ is a missionary Church, that the human family has a right to hear the good news of peace and salvation, and our God is Emmanuel. The Pontifical Societies for the Propagation of the Faith has the primary responsibility for the Church's missionary work. In the Diocese of Charleston, it is under the leadership of Rev. Msgr. Edward D. Lofton, director, and Helena Moniz, associate director. The office is available to assist each of you.
