Fourth Degree members belong to local units called assemblies. Each assembly is involved in a wide range of public patriotic activities.

Each assembly maintains a Fourth Degree Color Corps and Honor Guard. Uniformed members wearing our uniform and swords, participate in special civic and religious ceremonies. For this reason, the Fourth Degree is often called the visible arm of the Knights of Columbus.

The Assembly has resumed monthly assembly meetings. Based upon new guidance from Supreme, only essential activities are to be held in person and all other activities should be held virtually. If a meeting is essential and held in person, it must also be offered virtually. Based on this guidance, we will be transitioning to virtual meetings for the next several months. Scholarship Applications

Applications for The Knight of Columbus Assembly 973 Scholarship program for the 2021/2022 school year are now being accepted. Two \$500 scholarships are available to any child of an Active Knight of Columbus in one of our member councils.

To apply, students must submit their application and attachments to the Grand Knight of their father's Council with a <u>resume</u> and <u>a copy of their acceptance letter</u> from the college, university, institute, technical, industrial, nursing, or health care school that they will attend. A copy of the student's <u>most recent transcript</u> is also required.

The student's typed resume <u>must</u> include the following:

- Name
- Address
- Telephone Number
- E-mail address

And a description of the student's participating in the following:

- Church Activities
- Community Activities
- School Activities
- Volunteer Activities

For consideration: the applications must be complete with all the necessary documentation (resume, copy of the letter of acceptance, most recent transcript, and description of student's participation in various activities). Additional letters of recommendation from the principal, guidance counselor, teacher, or professor are welcomed but not required. Each Grand Knight can email up to two applications with all the attachments to each of the Assembly officers listed below no later than Friday, May 7, 2021 so that we can make the awards contemporaneously with their graduation at the winning students' parish during or after Holy Mass.

Hope Squad

Working or volunteering as part of the COVID-19 Hope Squad is an opportunity to unite our communities in the fight against COVID-19. This herculean task cannot rest only on the shoulders of healthcare organizations. It requires all of us to band together to reach the over 100,000 individuals who need vaccinations in Lebanon county alone.

A 120,000-square-foot space at the old Kmart building at 1745 Quentin Road has been transformed into a mass vaccination site in Lebanon County. The goal is to provide 1000 vaccinations a day. To help staff the site our community has reached out to healthcare systems, churches, civic organizations, and others to provide both clinical and non-clinical manpower.

Support of Veterans at the Lebanon Veterans Administration Hospital
