

Parish Information

♦ ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Holy Hour is held every Thursday alternating between Sacred Heart & St. Eulalia locations except for the first week of the month. Adoration is held at Sacred Heart on the month's first Friday.

Confessions will be available. Location is announced weekly in the bulletin.

♦ BAPTISMS

Baptism arrangements must be made by the PARENTS at the rectory office.

All parents and godparents must be practicing <u>Catholic</u> Christians.

Baptisms are available at Saturday 4:30pm Mass in English and Sunday 10:30am Mass in Spanish at Sacred Heart or at Sunday 10:30am Mass in English and 12:30pm Mass in Spanish at St. Eulalia.

English Baptism Ceremonies are at 2:00pm on Sundays and Spanish Baptism Ceremonies are at 1:00pm on Saturdays; on the 2nd & 4th weekend of each month at Sacred Heart. The mandatory Baptismal preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the 4th Monday of the month at 7:00pm in the school building at Sacred Heart. Being registered parishioners will make arrangements easier.

For full information on Baptism arrangements, requirements and restrictions please visit the rectory office for a consultation.

♦ WEDDINGS

Arrangements should be made at the rectory with a parish priest or deacon

at least four months before the wedding. Normally weddings are for registered parishioners, but extraordinary circumstances may be considered.

We recommend a Wedding Mass for practicing Catholics. We recommend a Wedding Ceremony for non-practicing Catholics or mixed-religion couples. Both are valid Marriages.

Weddings will NOT be scheduled during Lent.

♦ QUINCEAÑERAS

Arrangements must be made at the rectory office with a priest or deacon

at least two months beforehand. Quinceañera preparation meetings will be <u>required</u>. Quinceañeras will NOT be scheduled during Lent.

♦ FUNERALS

Arrangements can usually be made with the rectory office by the funeral director and the family. We have the Book of Funeral Readings and Music at the rectory or by email for families who wish to choose the readings and music. A priest or deacon will usually attend the wake.

♦ SICK CALLS

If someone needs to be anointed, please call the rectory when they are **seriously ill. Don't wait too long.** If someone homebound wishes to receive Holy Communion, please call the rectory.

January 7, 2024 The Epiphany of the Lord

A stranger in a foreign land, I was exhausted and homesick as my summer Spanish immersion ended in Guatemala. The rusty minivan arriving outside my small residence filled me with joyful hope. I was flying home to the U.S. and would be, at long last, completely happy. Or so I thought. After about half an hour of being home, I thought to myself, "This place is boring. I want to go somewhere." So, I hopped in my car and left to see my friends. As I drove, I wistfully wondered, "Where am I truly at home?"

The feast of Epiphany has a lot to do with our notion of home. Where is our origin? Where are we going? When is our wandering done? Saint Matthew tells us of the Magi, "They were overjoyed at seeing the star." This star will bring them *home*, to a place where their questing will end, and they will be satisfied. Their real home is neither in the East nor in the earthly Jerusalem. Somehow, their home is wherever this boy and his parents are.

If you're a teenager or older, you probably know by now that every physical home we have is temporary. So, we look up at the countless stars in our proverbial skies: things which bedazzle and

beckon us to follow toward peace. The Gospel invites us to behold that — at long last — God has sent us a star to follow home, one that whispers, "Follow me! I will take you home!" Perhaps that star is your spouse. A friend. An opportunity. A cause. An intuition about a new direction. A prayer group. What is it for you? How will you know? It will lead you to Mary and Joseph and their son, and you will be home.


Faith, Labor & Action: ARISE CHICAGO

ARISE

Arise Chicago was founded in 1991 by a diverse group of religious leaders who created a model to combat some of poverty's root causes (workers being paid improperly, workers receiving less than a living wage, etc.) by bringing the moral voice to both non-union and union workplace struggles. Drawing from sacred scriptures, Arise Chicago upholds the belief that every person is created in the image of God and therefore deserving of dignity and respect, including in the workplace. Each year, Arise Chicago places speakers in over 100 services over Labor Day weekend to speak about the dignity of work and the need to treat workers with respect. Arise Chicago also connects with congregations on a daily basis throughout the year. In 2001 Arise Chicago produced the first Workers Rights Manual in easy-to-read language in Spanish, Polish, and English. The manual, which outlines Illinoisspecific laws, has been replicated throughout the country. Arise provides a free download of the most recent version.

With knowledge that the basic tenets of all faith traditions support the rights of workers and in response to the many inquiries after the publication of the Workers Rights Manual, Arise Chicago opened its Worker Center in 2002. In 2007, Arise developed a membership model where workers stay involved in the organization. Since then Arise has created a worker Leadership Institute and several leadership development programs. To date, Arise has partnered with thousands of workers to recover more than \$9,000,000 in stolen wages and compensation and to eradicate harassment and discrimination from the workplace. Arise has also supported workers to raise their wages by over \$2,000,000.

In response to the need for systemic change, Arise Chicago has partnered with several religious, community, labor, and academic community partners to seek changes in public policy which will lead to a fuller measure of God's justice in the workplace. Fe, Trabajo y Acción: ARISE CHICAGO



Arise Chicago fue fundada en 1991 por un grupo diverso de líderes religiosos que crearon un modelo para combatir algunas de las causas fundamentales de la pobreza (trabajadores que reciben salarios inadecuados, trabajadores que reciben menos de un salario digno, etc.) al llevar la voz moral a personas no religiosas. Luchas sindicales y sindicales en el lugar de trabajo. Basándose en las Sagradas Escrituras, Arise Chicago defiende la creencia de que cada persona es creada a imagen de Dios y, por lo tanto, merece dignidad y respeto, incluso en el lugar de trabajo. Cada año, Arise Chicago coloca oradores en más de 100 servicios durante el fin de semana del Día del Trabajo para hablar sobre la dignidad del trabajo y la necesidad de tratar a los trabajadores con respeto. Arise Chicago también se conecta con congregaciones diariamente durante todo el año. En 2001, Arise Chicago produjo el primer Manual de derechos de los trabajadores en un lenguaje fácil de leer en español, polaco e inglés. El manual, que describe las leyes específicas de Illinois, se ha replicado en todo el país. Arise proporciona una descarga gratuita de la versión más reciente.

Con el conocimiento de que los principios básicos de todas las tradiciones religiosas respaldan los derechos de los trabajadores y en respuesta a las numerosas consultas posteriores a la publicación del Manual de Derechos de los Trabajadores, Arise Chicago abrió su Centro de Trabajadores en 2002. En 2007, Arise desarrolló un modelo de membresía donde los trabajadores mantenerse involucrado en la organización. Desde entonces, Arise ha creado un Instituto de Liderazgo para trabajadores y varios programas de desarrollo de liderazgo. Hasta la fecha, Arise se ha asociado con miles de trabajadores para recuperar más de \$9,000,000 en salarios y compensaciones robados y para erradicar el acoso y la discriminación en el lugar de trabajo. Arise también ha apoyado a los trabajadores para aumentar sus salarios en más de \$2,000,000.

En respuesta a la necesidad de un cambio sistémico, Arise Chicago se ha asociado con varios socios religiosos, comunitarios, laborales y académicos para buscar cambios en las políticas públicas que conduzcan a una medida más completa de la justicia de Dios en el lugar de trabajo.
