Parish Information

♦ ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Holy Hour is held every **Thursday** at **7:00pm** alternating between **Sacred Heart** & **St. Eulalia** locations except for the first week of the month. **Adoration** is held at **Sacred Heart** on the month's **first Friday**.

Confessions will be available. Location is announced weekly in the bulletin.

♦ BAPTISMS

Baptism arrangements must be made by **the PARENTS** at the rectory office.

All parents and godparents must be practicing **Catholic Christians**.

Baptisms are available at **Saturday 4:30pm Mass** in English and **Sunday 10:30am Mass** in Spanish at **Sacred Heart** or at **Sunday 10:30am Mass** in English and **12:30pm Mass** in Spanish at **St. Eulalia**.

English Baptism Ceremonies are at **2:00pm on Sundays** and Spanish Baptism Ceremonies are at **1:00pm on Saturdays**; on the **2nd** & **4th** weekend of each month at **Sacred Heart**.

The **mandatory** Baptismal preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the **4th Monday of the month** at **7:00pm** in the **school building** at **Sacred Heart**. **Being registered parishioners will make arrangements easier.**

For full information on Baptism arrangements, requirements and restrictions please visit the rectory office for a consultation.

♦ CHAPLET OF DIVINE MERCY

Join us on to pray the **Chaplet of Divine Mercy** every **second Saturday** of the month at **3:00pm** in **St. Eulalia**.

♦ WEDDINGS

Arrangements should be made at the rectory with a parish priest or deacon

at least four months before the wedding. Normally weddings are for registered parishioners, but extraordinary circumstances may be considered.

We recommend a **Wedding Mass** for **practicing Catholics**.

We recommend a **Wedding Ceremony** for **non-practicing Catholics** or **mixed-religion couples**. Both are valid Marriages.

Weddings will NOT be scheduled during Lent.

♦ QUINCEAÑERAS

Arrangements must be made at the rectory office with a priest or deacon

at least two months beforehand. Quinceañera preparation meetings will be **required**. **Quinceañeras will NOT be scheduled during Lent.**

♦ FUNERALS

Arrangements can usually be made with the rectory office by the funeral director and the family. We have the Book of Funeral Readings and Music at the rectory or by email for families who wish to choose the readings and music. A priest or deacon will usually attend the wake.

♦ SICK CALLS

If someone needs to be anointed, please call the rectory when they are **seriously ill**. **Don't wait too long.** If someone homebound wishes to receive Holy Communion, please call the rectory.

Dear Fr. Francisco,

The Tabernacle arrived a few moments ago, while it took many moments to open the beautifully wrapped package, I couldn't imagine what I had ordered, when I saw the first signs of color I knew immediately what it was and the excitement to release it from the packaging just grew and grew.

I am so grateful to have it, mainly as something that ties me directly to my 21 wonderful years at St. Eulalia and the worship space and the people both living and dead that still thrills me every time I enter the Church. I celebrated many funerals for members of my own family there, two grandmothers, my parents, a brother, a sister, a niece and I hope one day to be buried from St. Eulalia, hopefully in the distant future.

When I was there in September and was blessed to be able to be the celebrant at Mass, I couldn't help but be bombarded by the memory of so much that had been done to the physical environment of the worship space during my tenure: i.e. the baptismal space, the removal of 12 rows of pews to accommodate the Font and the glass wall that were paid for by money that came from my grandmother's funeral. The Cross that hangs so dramatically in the Sanctuary came as a gift from Fr. Anthony Spina, who gave it to us after his parish, St. Attracta in Cicero, was closed. The presidential chairs came from St. Anthony's Parish, the image of St. Eulalia on the outside of the Church high up on the west side of the building once hung as the image of St. Ludmilla after that church closed. The stained glass in the shrine areas were windows that also came from St. Attracta's. All of it, and so much more, speaks of the 'universal' church and our love and devotion to it.

Now, part of St. Eulalia's history with this tabernacle, is in California, and one day after I'm gone, it hopefully will be blessing another sacred space by its presence.

I am humbled to have it and I thank you and the people of St. Eulalia, who I pray for every day, that you have so generously gifted me with the consecrated piece of art and sacredness.

Be assured of my prayers for your mission to both Sacred Heart and St. Eulalia, may you be blessed with all of God's good gifts.

African Americans and the Arts

Today we are going to take a look at a little girl who wanted nothing more than to sing.

Marian Anderson was born on February 27, 1897, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Marian's vocal talent began to show while she was a child of 6 years. She was tutored at the local Baptist church and soon joined the junior choir. Marion could not afford lessons so she taught herself to play piano and later the Italian and German as most operas were written in those languages. She joined the senior choir at 13. In the United States Marian had limited concert opportunities because of her race. However, in 1930 she made her European debut in Berlin and was named the world's greatest contralto. On December 20, 1935, Marian appeared at New York's Town Hall, gave two concerts at Carnegie Hall, then toured the states from coast to coast and returned to Europe. In 1939 Marian attempted to rent a concert venues in Washington DC's Constitutional Hall, owned by the Daughter's of the American Revolution (DAR) and was refused because of her race. Washing DC was segregated. After a widespread protest many women resigned from the DAR including Eleanor Roosevelt. Roosevelt along with the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) arranged for a free open- air concert on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial for Easter Sunday, April 9, 1939.

In 1963 Marian was awarded the American Medal of Freedom by President Lyndon Johnson. In 1977, Congress awarded her a gold medal.

Now that we've had our Black History Month lesson, it's time to get our crayons and colored pencils out to color the picture!

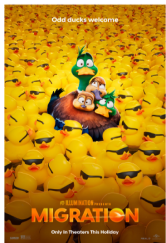
