



♦ ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Holy Hour is held every Thursday at 7:00pm alternating between Sacred Heart & St. Eulalia locations except for the first week of the month. Adoration is held at Sacred Heart on the month's first Friday.

Confessions will be available. Location is announced weekly in the bulletin.

♦ BAPTISMS

Baptism arrangements must be made by the PARENTS at the rectory office.

All parents and godparents must be practicing <u>Catholic</u> Christians.

Baptisms are available at Saturday 4:30pm Mass in English and Sunday 10:30am Mass in Spanish at Sacred Heart or at Sunday 10:30am Mass in English and 12:30pm Mass in Spanish at St. Eulalia.

English Baptism Ceremonies are at 2:00pm on Sundays and Spanish Baptism Ceremonies are at 1:00pm on Saturdays; on the 2nd & 4th weekend of each month at Sacred Heart. The mandatory Baptismal preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the 4th Monday of the month at 7:00pm in the school building at Sacred Heart. Being registered parishioners will make arrangements easier.

For full information on Baptism arrangements, requirements and restrictions please visit the rectory office for a consultation.

♦ CHAPLET OF DIVINE MERCY

Join us on to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy every second Saturday of the month at 3:00pm in St. Eulalia.

WEDDINGS

Arrangements should be made at the rectory with a parish priest or deacon

at least four months before the wedding. Normally weddings are for registered parishioners, but extraordinary circumstances may be considered.

We recommend a Wedding Mass for practicing Catholics. We recommend a Wedding Ceremony for non-practicing Catholics or mixed-religion couples. Both are valid Marriages.

Weddings will NOT be scheduled during Lent.

♦ QUINCEAÑERAS

Arrangements must be made at the rectory office with a priest or deacon

at least two months beforehand. Quinceañera preparation meetings will be <u>required</u>. Quinceañeras will NOT be scheduled during Lent.

♦ FUNERALS

Arrangements can usually be made with the rectory office by the funeral director and the family. We have the Book of Funeral Readings and Music at the rectory or by email for families who wish to choose the readings and music. A priest or deacon will usually attend the wake.

♦ SICK CALLS

If someone needs to be anointed, please call the rectory when they are **seriously ill. Don't wait too long.** If someone homebound wishes to receive Holy Communion, please call the rectory.



African Americans and the Arts

James Mercer Langston Hughes was born on February 1, 1901, in Joplin Missouri. He attended Columbia University in New York City. He was a prolific writer, to say the least, a poet, novelist, playwright and columnist. Langston Hughes proved to be an innovator in the literary arts and was know for his characterization of black life in America during the 1950' and 60's. To gain a better insight into the man I would suggest you read Hughes stories about Jesse B. Semple. Hughes first created Semple while he was working in Chicago for the Chicago Defender. He composed a weekly column in the Chicago Defender and Semple was frequently the subject of the column. In these short dialogues Langston plays the part of Jesse's educated friend and listens as Jesse shares his thoughts on women, love, marriage, politics, Jim Crow, and in short his world view. Langston Hughes died in 1967. Some of his well known works are The Weary Blues, a collection of poetry, The ways of White Folks, a collection of short stories and The Best of Simple. Hughes often referred to his character as "Simple." Take a read and see if you agree.

LENTEN OBLIGATIONS

FAST & ABSTINENCE: Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age and older, and younger than 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as ab-

PRAYER: Please try to devote as much time to prayer & reflection as possible. Morning Mass is at **8:00am** every weekday at Sacred Heart! Stations of the Cross are prayed every Friday of Lent at **7:00pm** in **English** at **Sacred Heart** & **7:00pm** in **Spanish** at **St. Eulalia.**



Todos los católicos mayores de 18 años y menores de 59 años deben observar el ayuno el Miércoles de Ceniza. Aquellos que están obligados por esto pueden tomar solo una comida completa. Se permiten dos comidas más pequeñas si es necesario para las necesidades de uno, pero no se permite comer alimentos sólidos entre comidas. El ayuno pascual especial, así como la abstinencia, se prescriben para el Viernes Santo y se recomiendan para el Sábado Santo.
