

## DEAR HOLY FAMILY,

This week's Gospel (Mk 12:38-44) on the widow's mite and giving to others is an important one for us as Christians. Jesus says that she contributed more than the others (even though she had the smallest amount) because she gave according to her principles. In other words, she saw and believed that returning a portion of her own livelihood to God was important and, even in the midst of hardship, she chose to do so.



All of us lead our lives based on our principles: on those values that we hold dear and strive to live up to in our daily life. And, as we do so, we must always keep asking ourselves: "What is of value to us? What do we hold dear?" We do the same thing as a Church and, now, more than ever, it is time to ask ourselves: "What do we stand for and value as the local Catholic Church in Adrian?"

### Parish Strategic Planning

With this in mind, the Parish Pastoral Council and I decided in September to embark on a process of strategic planning to begin the process of articulating our parish vision, principles, and values. In order to facilitate this planning, Jim Hartley, the Council Chair, and I have enlisted the assistance of Bill Kenyon. Throughout his career, Bill has served as an assistant prosecutor, the Vice-President for Development at Adrian College, and most recently, the Executive Director at Hospice of Lenawee. ## "BE BOLD, BE CATHOLIC" (Prayer, Study, Generosity & Evangelization)

### Hierarchy of Truths

As Catholics we must strive to obtain a firm understanding of these foundational truths and how all other truths flow from them. As a review the five (5) foundational truths are:

The Blessed Trinity, the Person of Jesus, the Paschal Mystery, the Dignity of the Human Person and the Church.

Lets take a look at each of these truths in greater depth.

### The Church

- God created the world for the sake of the Church.
- Jesus suffered died and rose from the dead in order to create and imbue the Church with His divine life.
- The Church is God's chosen instrument of Salvation and the dispenser of the Sacraments.
- Mary is the Mother of the Church.
- The Holy Spirit guides and animates the Church.
- The Liturgy is the public worship of the Church and unites the Church in heaven with the Church on earth.
- God prepared the Israel in the Old Testament to be united with the Gentiles in the Church.
- The Church safeguards the Deposit of Faith and faithfully hands it on from one generation to the next.

This is the fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) of the Foundational Truths of Revelation. We will continue to explore how these foundational truths relate to the deposit of faith and how this deposit of faith should be understood.

2. 109 families visited our pantry in October. 22 of them were new.

3. Today, November 7th, after the 8 am Mass, we will again be distributing grocery bags with a list of the foods that we will need for our holiday food boxes. This is a great opportunity to shop with your family and fill the bag for one of our clients. The bags can be returned to the St. Joe Baptistry the following Sunday during Mass or when the pantry is open. If you are not able to shop, we always accept cash donations to be used for this project.

4. If you are a deer hunter who enjoys the sport but does not really need or want venison, the area food pantries can use your donated meat. The Lenawee Community Foundation has a program "Hunters Helping Lenawee."

Hunters bring their fresh, clean, field-dressed, tagged, legally harvested deer to a participating meat processor. They tell the processor that the deer is to be donated to the Hunters Helping Lenawee program. For further information, please contact the LCF at 263-4696. Our pantry has been the recipient of donated venison and our clients are always anxious and grateful to receive it.

5. We honor and pray for our Veterans this Thursday, November 11th. If you know any Veterans in need, please encourage them to visit our pantry.

6. As the holidays and winter months are approaching, we have several "snowbird" volunteers. We need a few new people willing to give us a few hours each month. There is a variety of ways you can help. Please prayerfully consider our mission and call me for more information. Thank you.




