

## DEAR FRIENDS,

Often when we hear the word "stewardship" we think it is a financial thing. While it's true that finances play a part in stewardship, stewardship is actually much more than that; in fact, it might be better to say that stewardship is the concrete way that we live out being disciples of Jesus Christ.

Our parish website has two pages devoted to stewardship. One is on [stewardship in general](#) and the second is on the [stewardship committee](#). This past year the committee and I have been using the following definition of stewardship for Holy Family Parish:

*Christian Stewards are disciples of Jesus Christ who have consciously and freely chosen to be his active followers, regardless of the cost. Stewardship means putting God first in our lives by living according to the will of God. We all have a need to give back to God which is evidenced by our love of neighbor and our selfless sharing of our own gifts of time, talent, and treasure with our brothers and sisters, wherever they may be.*

As I've reflected on this statement, I believe that it says the following things:

1. We are disciples of Jesus Christ, who is the Truth, the Way, and the Life. In a nutshell, we are called to LIVE JESUS, in all our thoughts, words, and actions.
2. We have consciously and freely chosen to be his followers. Actually, God has chosen us and we have chosen to answer His call.
3. Regardless of the cost. Yes, there’s a cost of being followers...living as disciples isn’t easy, but it is very rewarding.
4. Putting God first in our lives requires that we give Him top billing, in a world where “Satan and other evil spirits prowl about the world for the ruin of souls.”
5. Living according to the will of God means that we listen to what Jesus told us in his Sermon on the Mount (the Beatitudes; “Blessed are the poor”, etc.) and His Sermon on the Plain (“love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you”, judging others “the speck in my brother’s eye and the log in my own”, “Be merciful, just as your father is merciful”, etc.).
6. Our need to give back to God is an outcome of those sermons (the Works of Mercy), which was made clear by Jesus later on in the gospel of the Last Judgement (“when I was hungry, you gave me to eat” etc.). Matt 25:31-46
7. We are saved by Jesus on the Cross, and from that we put our Faith into Action by how we live our lives. I believe that’s what stewardship is all about. And we pray that all Holy Family parishioners will be Good Stewards.

The three (3) dimensions of Love:

- eros: which signifies worldly love
- philia: which signifies love of friendship
- agape (caritas): is an ablative love, becoming love or care of the other

**Agape**

Love understood as agape:

- Is an ablative love. Love becomes care of the other and for the other. It no longer seeks itself but the good of the beloved. The happiness of the other becomes more important than my own.
- Is ecstasy as a journey, as the permanent exodus from the ego closed in on itself to its liberation in its gift of self and precisely in this way to rediscovery of self or rather to the discovery of God.
- Is not only a feeling that comes and goes, it is a feeling that encompasses all the dimensions and manifestations of the person, involving the will and intelligence. Through his word, God addresses himself to our intelligence and to our will and our emotions allowing us to love Him "with all our heart and soul."
- seeks definitiveness in the twofold sense: in the sense of exclusivity (only this one person) and the sense of forever (Love aims at eternity) is united with eros (eros and agape are truly united).



**QUERIDA SAGRADA FAMILIA,**



Hoy les presento a ustedes una reflexión tomando del pensamiento de San Francisco de Sales. y que hace hincapié en el tema de luz que está presente muchas veces en la Biblia.

Las lecturas de hoy hacen un llamado para que vivamos como hijos de la luz. Es el Dios de Jesucristo quien nos guía en medio de nuestra ceguera, y nos conduce por la senda de la luz del amor de Dios. San Francisco de Sales hace una acotación similar cuando nos dice: “Cuando salimos a caminar al medio día, escasamente alcanzamos a ver la luz del sol cuando ya empezamos a sentir su calor. Así mismo sucede con la luz de la fe: escasamente alcanza a iluminarnos cuando ya empezamos a sentir el calor del amor de Dios que nos colma de esperanza en Su bondad. Cuando nos esmeramos por hacer todo lo que está a nuestro alcance para abrir nuestros corazones, y recibir el amor divino, nuestra fe se aviva y nuestra esperanza se fortalece. La fe es lo que hace posible que podamos comprender la belleza, la bondad que encierra el misterio de Dios revelado en Jesucristo”.

Cuando aceptamos las enseñanzas de Jesús en la fe, el amor sagrado ilumina nuestros corazones. Es a través de Cristo que Dios nos acerca a la luz de la fe. En el momento en que Él nos otorga la fe, Él entra en nuestra alma y se comunica con nosotros por medio de las inspiraciones. Sólo Dios puede iluminarnos y hacer que nuestros ojos enceguecidos puedan volver a ver. Cuando la luz de Dios nos permite identificar la fuente de nuestra ceguera, esa es una indicación de conversión interior. Entonces nos liberamos de nuestros deseos egoístas, y llegamos a conocernos verdaderamente, y a aceptarnos a nosotros mismos como hijos de la luz. Aun cuando siempre habrá en nosotros un profundo deseo de lograr la felicidad, la fe nos revela la infinita maravilla de la felicidad eterna.

La fe es la mejor amiga de nuestro espíritu; es la base de nuestra esperanza y de nuestro amor. La fe es lo que nos da la certeza de que la oferta que Dios nos ha hecho, de que nos otorgará su gracia, es imperecedera. Por lo tanto, no debemos temer a Nuestro Salvador, ya que Él nos tratará como un buen padre y madre tratan a sus hijos. 
