

HOLY THURSDAY COLLECTION

The collection on Holy Thursday will be for St. Mary food pantry and St. Vincent de Paul Society, which provide food and assistance to those in need. Both canned goods and financial contributions will be accepted at this Mass and the proceeds will be divided evenly between both pantries. Rice bowls will also be collected at this Mass.

REFLECTION

In the Gospel story of the first Palm Sunday, we hear that the owners of the ass had only to be told, "The Master has need of it," to give the animal gladly. Do I give as readily to the Lord's work?

DEAR HOLY FAMILY,

On this Palm Sunday, we enter into Holy Week. Over the past two years we have celebrated Holy Week in different ways because of the pandemic. Today, I'd like to walk you through how we will be celebrating Holy Week and the Paschal Triduum here at Holy Family this year. And, if you haven't done so already, I invite you to subscribe to Flocknote, our parish email and texting communication program so that you are apprised of any changes. Simply text HOLYFAMILYADRIAN to 84576 to sign up.



On Holy Thursday, we will begin the Triduum with the Mass of the Lord's Supper at St. Mary Campus beginning at 7:00PM. This year we will be washing the feet of just the elect and candidates for full communion in our Church during this Mass. At the conclusion of the liturgy we will then go in procession with the Eucharist from St. Mary Campus to St. Joseph Campus. All parishioners who are able, are invited to join us as we walk with the Lord through the streets of Adrian. We will also have a bus available to take parishioners to and from St. Joseph campus and parishioners are also invited to drive over and meet us at the church as well. Upon arrival at St. Joseph campus we will place the Blessed Sacrament in the altar of repose before celebrating Night Prayer at 9:30PM. Following Night Prayer we will have Eucharistic Adoration from 10:00PM - 7:30AM at St. Joseph Campus. We are still in need of adorers of the Blessed Sacrament during the night. If you are interested please sign up in Flocknote, using the sheets at Mass this weekend or contact me or Isabelle Pioch at the parish office with your time that you'd like to wait and watch with the Lord.

All Good Friday services will held at St. Joseph Campus. We will begin with Morning Prayer at 8:15AM in the morning. I will be hearing confessions from noon - 3:00PM followed by the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3:00PM. The Celebration of the Passion of the Lord will be at 7:00PM in the evening during which we will have a communal veneration of the Cross. For the veneration of the Cross this year, I will invite you to come forward and make a sign of reverence (a bow, a sacred touch) during that time. Please do not kiss the cross during the communal veneration. If you would like to kiss the cross, it will be available after the service for private veneration.

All Holy Saturday liturgies will be held at St. Mary Campus. We will begin with Morning Prayer and the blessing of Easter baskets at 8:15AM. The Easter Vigil will be held at 8:30PM.

On Easter Sunday there will be an 8:00AM Mass at St. Mary Campus and St. Joseph Campus; a 10:00AM Mass at St. Mary Campus and St. Joseph Campus; and 12:00PM bilingual Mass at St. Mary Campus. The Easter Triduum will conclude with Evening Prayer which will be celebrated at 6:00PM at St. Joseph Campus.

As we enter into this most holy time, I encourage you to attend as many liturgies as you can. This is a most sacred time for us to enter into the Mystery of Jesus's suffering, death and resurrection which is the pattern of His life and of our lives as well.





En el Jueves Santo, empezamos el Sagrado Triduo Pascual con la Misa de la Cena del Señor en el campus de Sta. María a las 7:00PM. Durante la Misa vamos a lavar los pies de los que van a recibir los sacramentos en el Sábado de Gloria. Al final de la liturgia, vamos a caminar en procesión del campus de Sta. María al campus de San José. Caminaremos con el Santísimo por las calles de Adrian. ¡Espero que caminen con nosotros! Y si no pueden caminar, tendremos un autobús para llevarles al campus de San José y después los traí de regreso al campus de Sta. María. O pueden manejar a San José para concluir la celebración.
