



REFLECTION



We helped to celebrate Easter with 40 children and their families on Saturday. HFP Youth Group helped them dye Easter eggs and they were each given an Easter bag full of treats and fun items from St. Vincent de Paul.

Please save your egg cartons for the months of April and May. We also are in need of macaroni and cheese as well as kids' cereal. Meat is in very short supply at the Food Bank and very expensive for us to purchase at the grocery stores. Your donations are very valuable to us and can be left in our cabinet located in the Baptistry.

Our food pantry participates in the South Michigan Food Bank Challenge during the months of April and May. Donations to the Food Bank allow us to purchase a large variety of food at below wholesale prices and fresh meat sometimes as low as 19 cents a pound! It is the most effective use of our money. 




