REFLECTION

Today's reading speak of hospitality. Abraham, who cheerfully did for his guest all that desert hospitality required, was rewarded with his heart's desire— a son. Martha also busied herself with all the details of hospitality, but grudgingly and complaint. Am I a cheerful or a grudging giver?

DEAR HOLY FAMILY,

This weekend's Gospel is the famous story of Jesus coming to the house of Martha and Mary (Lk 10:38-42). During his time with them, Mary remains at his feet listening to him speak while Martha prepares a meal and gets stressed out. Oftentimes, we can see here a tension between Martha and Mary's behavior with Jesus. St. Francis de Sales, however, takes a different approach as he wrote in a letter to St. Jane de Chantal: "Do you know what I would have done to make a balance between Martha and Mary? I would have Martha, the true servant, sit down at the feet of the Lord where her sister Mary was, and I would have Mary get up and, for a time, concern herself with preparing the meal. In this way they would have divided the work and the rest as good sisters. I believe Jesus would have found this better and more pleasing than Martha's suggestion that he be left alone. For Jesus did not come into the world to live in solitude, but to be among God and the children of humanity. In the same way, you too should divide your time between prayer and contemplation and service to your neighbor." As the summer months continue, may we too divide our time between prayer and service for God and others.

The increasing food prices and food shortages have really affected our pantry. We face the same challenges as your family. We are seeing an increase in the number of people visiting our pantry and an increase in the number of new families. We no longer can obtain meat for greatly reduced prices and find that we now have to purchase it at the local grocery stores. Your donations keep us open to our neighbors needing food. We cannot do this without you and we thank everyone.

Donations of your garden produce, peanut butter, tuna fish, juice, and snacks for the kids are all appreciated.

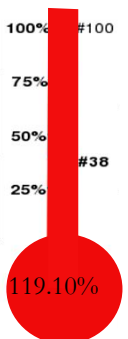
