

Dear Holy Family,

This coming Tuesday, January 24, we celebrate the feast of St. Francis de Sales, Doctor of Divine Love, and principal patron of the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales. Last month, at the conclusion of the Double Salesian Jubilee, Pope Francis released a special Apostolic Letter called *Totum Amoris Est* [Everything Pertains to Love] on the 400th anniversary of the death of St. Francis de Sales. The letter is 11 pages long.



In the Apostolic Letter, Pope Francis briefly goes into a biography of St. Francis de Sales's life and how his life and his own experiences became reflective in some of his spiritual teachings which center around the ideas: "Where do I find God? And, in finding God, how do I respond?" These teachings, found in Salesian Spirituality are

- How to discern God's will, or plan, for your life
- How all of us, no matter our age, job, or state in life, are called to holiness and a relationship with God
- How we can find God in our daily lives and respond to Him (which Matthew Kelly builds on in his *Holy Moments* book)
- How to distinguish between true and false holiness
- How joy is the mark of a Christian

I'll be doing a special "Ask the Pastor" this Tuesday afternoon (1/24) on these teachings as found in the Holy Father's letter, so please join me on Facebook for that and join our parish on Tuesday evening at 7:00PM for our regular weekly bilingual Mass at St. Joseph Campus as we celebrate the feast of St. Francis de Sales.


In closing, as we begin to celebrate this feast, I'll let Pope Francis in *Totum Amoris Est* have the final words:

"On this anniversary of the fourth centenary of his death, I [Pope Francis] have given much thought to the legacy of Saint Francis de Sales for our time. I find that his flexibility and his far-sighted vision have much to say to us. Partly by God's gift and partly thanks to his own character, but also by his steady cultivation of lived experience, Francis perceived clearly that the times were changing. On his own, he might never have imagined that those changes represented so great an opportunity for the preaching of the Gospel. The word of God that he had loved from his youth now opened up before him new and unexpected horizons in a rapidly changing world.

That same task awaits us in this, our own age of epochal change. We are challenged to be a Church that is outward-looking and free of all worldliness, even as we live in this world, share people's lives and journey with them in attentive listening and acceptance. That is what Francis de Sales did when he discerned the events of his times with the help of God's grace. Today he bids us set aside undue concern for ourselves, for our structures and for what society thinks about us, and consider instead the real spiritual needs and expectations of our people."

Stewardship of Time & Talent
Dave Maxwell**

When people ask me "why are you glad to be Catholic?", I answer, "because the Catholic Church and all its sacraments were gifts from Jesus, who founded the Church". So, the Church is His gift to us, His disciples. As disciples of Jesus Christ, we are called to LIVE JESUS, and the Church offers us many ways to do that....such as the Works of Mercy and the Beatitudes. But it all begins with our own personal Stewardship of Time, a gift given by God when we were created. As good stewards of this most precious gift, we should be giving back our first fruits, not the leftovers. By that I mean committing time to God every day..... first thing in the morning, while we work, and at day's end. We have 16 hours of awake time, so how about giving God a half hour daily, starting with our morning prayers, offering to Him all we will do that day as a return of a portion of His gift to us? And at day's end, thanking Him for watching over us that day. This Lent, let's make prayer a daily habit. Think of the power if we all prayed for our Church, our country, and for true peace among our families, and in the process became closer to God.

Human Rights

What are the fundamental human rights?

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights states:

All human beings are born free and equal and the following articles state:

- 1) They have the right to life liberty and security, 3) No individual may be kept in slavery, 4) No individual shall be subjected to torture or cruel and inhumane treatment, 5) everyone has a right to recognition as a person under the law, 6) all are equal under the law, 7) No one may be arbitrarily arrested, detained or exiled, 9) all accused are presumed innocent until proven guilty, 11) everyone has a right to freedom of movement and residence, 13) a right to citizenship, 15) Men and women have equal rights with regards to marriage, 16) everyone has a right to personal property, 17) a right to freedom thought, conscience and religion, 18) a right of opinion and expression, 19) a right to peaceful assembly, 20) a right to participate in the government of one's country.

John Paul II outlined a list of human rights in his encyclical *Centesimus Annus*, which affirms that every human being has a right to:

- Life, an integral part of which is for the child to develop in the mother's womb from the moment of conception.
- Live in a united family and in a moral environment conducive to the growth of the child's personality
- Develop ones intelligence and freedom in seeking and knowing the truth
- Share in the work which makes wise use of the earth's resources, deriving a means to support one's self and their dependents.
- Freely establish a family, to raise children through responsible exercise of one's sexuality

In a sense, source and synthesis of these rights is religious freedom, the foundational element for all liberties, the ultimate criterion of their protection, the guarantee of authentic pluralism and true democracy.

St. Thomas Aquinas, a Dominican Friar, was a fierce proponent of science and religion working together in the revelation of God's creation. Episcopal priest and theologian Rev. Matthew Fox, PhD, explores the relevance of St. Thomas Aquinas for our world today during a live stream presentation, *The Tao of Thomas Aquinas: Fierce Wisdom for Hard Times*. The program is offered by Weber Retreat and Conference Center from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. EST on Thursday, January 26, 2023.

In his presentation, Rev. Fox explores a number of Thomas Aquinas' rich teachings, including the "original goodness" and love of God in everyday things; the primacy of conscience; the common good; compassion and justice; and non-dualism.

Querida Sagrada Familia,

Este martes vamos a celebrar la fiesta de San Francisco de Sales, Doctor del Amor Divino y patrón principal de los Oblatos de San Francisco de Sales. Al concluir el año de jubileo en honor de San Francisco de Sales y Santa Juana de Chantal en el mes pasado, el Papa Francisco escribió una Carta Apostólica que se llama *Totum Amoris Est* en el 400 centenario de la muerte de San Francisco de Sales. La carta tiene 11 páginas.



En la Carta Apostólica, el Papa Francisco dio una biografía breve de San Francisco de Sales y explicó cómo su vida y sus experiencias durante su vida se hicieron parte de sus enseñanzas espirituales. También el Santo Padre escribió que las enseñanzas de San Francisco de Sales contestaron estas preguntas: “¿Dónde encuentro yo a Dios? Y, al encontrar al Señor, ¿cómo debo responder?” Estas enseñanzas espirituales son:

- Cómo discernir la voluntad (o el plan) de Dios para su vida.
- Todos nosotros, no importa nuestro trabajo, edad o estado de vida, estamos llamados a una relación con Dios que se expresa en la santidad.
- Todos nosotros tenemos la habilidad de encontrar a Dios en la vida cotidiana y responder a su presencia (igual con lo que escribió Matthew Kelly en el libro “*Momentos Sagrados*” que recibimos durante el tiempo navideño).
- Cómo distinguir entre la santidad verdadera y la santidad falsa
- Cómo la alegría es la marca o señal de un cristiano verdadero

Voy a hacer una presentación especial en español el martes que viene (1/24) sobre estas enseñanzas en la Carta Apostólica del Santo Padre. Espero que me acompañes por Facebook y también en la misa bilingüe el mismo martes el 24 de enero en el campus de San José.

Al concluir, leemos lo que escribió el Papa Francisco sobre la importancia de las enseñanzas espirituales de San Francisco de Sales durante nuestro tiempo:

“En la memoria del cuarto centenario de la muerte de san Francisco de Sales, me he preguntado sobre su legado para nuestra época, y he encontrado iluminadoras su flexibilidad y su capacidad de visión. Un poco por don de Dios, un poco por índole personal, y también por la profundización constante de sus vivencias, había tenido la nítida percepción del cambio de los tiempos. Ni él mismo hubiera llegado a imaginar que en esto reconocería una gran oportunidad para el anuncio del Evangelio. La Palabra que había amado desde su juventud era capaz de hacerse camino abriendo horizontes nuevos e impredecibles en un mundo en rápida transición.

Es lo que también nos espera como tarea esencial para este cambio de época: una Iglesia no autorreferencial, libre de toda mundanidad pero capaz de habitar el mundo, de compartir la vida de la gente, de caminar juntos, de escuchar y de acoger [26]. Es lo que realizó Francisco de Sales leyendo su época con ayuda de la gracia. Por eso, él nos invita a salir de la preocupación excesiva por nosotros mismos, por las estructuras, por la imagen social, y a preguntarnos más bien cuáles son las necesidades concretas y las esperanzas espirituales de nuestro pueblo.”




