State Deputy's Message

Also ask yourself if you have grown the Order by sharing it with others and inviting them to join us.

Once you have done a good assessment of where you stand, continue the efforts in the areas where you are succeeding and make plans to correct the areas that need attention. In other words, prepare yourself and your council for success in the second half of the year.

State Chaplain's Message

My dear Brother Knights and families,

Moving into December we are all aware of the shorter days and less sunlight. I have always appreciated how the seasons of the year work together with the Liturgical seasons. In the case of December, when the earth is at its darkest point, light begins to appear again.

We are reminded by the Gospel of John that the true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. (John 1:9) Even in these darkest days of the year, we are confident that God's plan for Salvation History was perfectly manifest in the Birth of Jesus Christ, and continues to manifest itself in the Liturgy of the Church.

In addition to Advent and Christmas, December has the beautiful Feasts of the Immaculate Conception on December 8, and Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12. The Second Vatican Council Constitution on the Church, Lumen Gentium, reminds us that Mary was free from all stain of sin, as though fashioned by the Holy Spirit and formed as a new creature. Adorned from the first instant of her conception with the radiance of an entirely unique holiness, the Virgin of Nazareth is greeted, on God's command, by an angel messenger as "full of grace." (Lumen Gentium, 56)

How beautiful to think, as we pray the Rosary, or join in the celebration of Holy Mass, that Mary, filled with grace, by saying "yes" to the Angel Gabriel, ended the long darkness of sin and alienation from God. John's Gospel again cries out: from his fullness we have all received, grace in place of grace, because while the law was given through Moses, grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. (John 1:16-17)

This leads me to reflect upon the works of the Knights of Columbus. In all of our councils as we pray together; evangelize and share our Catholic faith with one another and others; as we do works of charity; as we witness to the beauty and building up

of a culture of life and a civilization of love, we allow the grace of Christ, of which Mary is filled, and which Christ pours into our hearts through the Holy Spirit (Romans 5:5) to fill our lives with hope.

And so, as the world around us seems darker, both from a lack of sunlight, and a lack of light from Christ, may we never give into despair. Jesus Christ, whose coming we celebrate, through His Incarnation, life, passion, death and resurrection and sending of the Holy Spirit is truly the light coming into the world.
