



January 31, 2022 Cemetery Committee Meeting

Annual Sts. Peter and Paul Cemetery meeting was held on January 31, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. in the Parish Meeting Room.

In attendance was Al Laubenthal, John Tenwalde, Gary Hermiller, Father Scott Kramer, Joe Kuhlman, Greg Klear, Keith Schulte, Kim Hunt, Bob Fawcett and Orville Verhoff. Al Laubenthal called the meeting to order and Father Scott gave a blessing.

- 1.) Al Laubenthal asked if I could send a thank you card to Elaine Odenweller for her years of service.
- 2.) There was a moment of silence for Al Wischmeyer.
- 3.) Review of the previous meeting's minutes
- 4.) Kim Hunt presented the financial reports. Bob Fawcett motioned to accept the financials and Gary Hermiller 2nd.
- 5.) Al Laubenthal presented yearly costs for running the cemetery. He estimated based on salaries and wages that we spend approximately between \$38,000 \$39,000 each year.

Al Laubenthal introduced, welcomed and thanked the new committee members: Joe Kuhlman, Keith Schulte and Greg Klear.

- 6.) OLD BUSINESS
 - a) Mowers Big John Deere has 447 hours on it, it is a 2019. The garden tractor - It was discussed whether we should trade it in. John Deere was contacted and they advised that it would be better to trade it in now instead of in March. The new tractor would have a better seat, fuel injection, wider tires and more power. Joe Kuhlman motioned and Greg Klear 2nd to trade it in. Zero turn mower - in great shape and was advised that there would not be much benefit in trading it in at this time.
 - b.) Employees for 2022: Al Laubenthal, Orville Verhoff, Gary Hermiller and Kim Hunt all agreed to stay on. Dean Lanwehr wasn't at the meeting, but has agreed to stay and Joe Kuhlman volunteered to help when his schedule allows.
 - c.) Concrete base replacement project in the flat section Al Laubenthal thanked John Tenwalde and Orville Verhoff for the amount that they have replaced and then John Tenwalde gave an update. John mentioned that there are 33 yet to change out. They are switching the fiberglass, concrete bases with granite bases. Gary Hermiller suggested that a few of the cemetery workers including himself get together a few Saturdays and work on switching them out. Try to do about 10 each time. Father Scott Kramer agreed that he would rather not hire this job out.
 - d.) Laptops update they are doing good, running well.
 - e.) Footer expansion in the new section It was discussed whether we should extend the footers in the new section for a total of 4 or 5 rows. Further research will be done before a decision is made.

7.) NEW BUSINESS -

- a.) The big black walnut tree was taken down this past summer. Going forward we would like to remove 29 pine trees and 43 stumps.
- b.) Entrance Road Trees It has been determined that the Cemetery entry road and trees do belong to the cemetery. It was thought in the past that these actually belonged to the village. Currently we have around 18 Ornamental Pear trees, which are no longer available for replacement. One recommendation is that we take the pear trees down and make plans for something else. This recommendation, includes these trees as well as the trees in the infant section, to make a cohesive, nice looking entrance into the cemetery.
- c.) Cosmetics for west end expansion discussion on landscaping
- d.) Wreaths Across America Marcia Klima has been heading this up. There was a large donation from a parishioner to help keep this going.
- e.) Marble Crucifix for cemetery was ordered 11/24/2021, ship date is late May. After discussion we agreed to put it at the south end of the cemetery drive, illuminated at night.
- f.) Old Cemetery base for old crucifix There was a crucifix in the old section of the cemetery, but it was starting to rot and was taken down, the base remains. A possible use for this base will be found, possibly a statue. It is believed that this area of the cemetery was designated for the burial of religious priests and nuns. However, there is only one priest buried in this area.
- g.) Placement of man/woman burial There was a discussion about placement of a couple on a gravesite. The committee agreed to honor the families request as long as it is documented.
- h.) The company that provides the headstones has announced a 5.3% increase in their granite base line. The committee decided not to raise prices at this time.
- 8.) Audit of treasury books Greg Klear and Bob Fawcett agreed to do the audit this year.
- 9.) Election of officers: President Al Laubenthal; Vice President John Tenwalde; Sec/Treasurer - Kim Hunt
- 10.) Items from board members: The possible need for a columbarium was brought up. A suggestion was made that we take a road trip to Calvary Cemetery in Toledo to see how
