Essential Question

How does praying help me know and love Jesus Christ?

Learning Targets

The new archdiocesan curriculum is designed in such a way that the learning information follows a spiral pattern in that similar topics are discussed at a progressively deeper cognitive level each year following the appropriate age of the learner, beginning with early childhood and concluding with adulthood. Below is a chart that shows this progression for our 2nd topic / essential question "What does Jesus Christ teach you about God?" Please review this to see what your child(ren) are covering at their own cognitive level.

Additionally, you will notice that each grade level is covering the same or similar topic each week. This chart can also be used as a tool for conversation starters about what was learned in formation, other family discussions, and as a means to unite the family under one theme. Our hope is that this information will help you be more aware of what your child(ren) are covering and that it can be integrated or reinforced at home in some fashion and may even inspire your own faith life as well.

Family Activities

Conversation Starters

Sharing the faith as a family is a great way for it to stick/grow. Here are some conversation ideas based on what your son/daughter was recently learning in formation. Consider using these immediately after picking up your child(ren) from Catechesis or at the dinner table.

- What are three new things you learned during catechesis class today?
- What is something you learned that you already knew?
- Do you think you might have learned something that I don't know or you think is important for me to know? If so, what?
- What do you understand prayer to be?
- When you pray how do you talk to God?
- Share your own experiences of prayer and how you approach it knowing God as a friend, a Father, a teacher, etc.
- Do you have a favorite prayer?
- Why do you think it is important to pray alone?
- Why do you think it is important to pray with other people/as a family?
- Do you have any questions about prayer?

Prayer Activity

With your family, visit a nearby parish that offers the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (Adoration), and spend some time in prayer. Explain to your children that, as Catholics, we believe this exposition to be the *real* presence of Jesus Christ. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, He is made present. Although we are capable of — and called to — pray anywhere and at any time, because Adoration contains and provides special graces, it allows for a special closeness to the Lord. According to Pope Pius XII, Adoration is not "merely a passing devotional practice. It is founded on divinely revealed truths."

Physical Activity

Materials needed: Headphones, phone or music media player compatible with headphones

With your family, take turns playing "The Whisper Challenge." During each round, one member is to wear headphones plugged into a phone or music player, while listening to music at a volume that prevents the player from being able to hear what another player (not wearing headphones) is saying. The player listening to music and another player that *is not* are to face one another while the player not listening to music speaks random phrases to the person listening to music. This person is to read the lips of the other player and attempt to guess what he or she is saying. Set a timer for 60 seconds for each round of guessing. Depending on the size of the family, go around and take turns.

The point of this activity is to emphasize the need for prayer. Although God can see us and knows what is going on in our lives, in order for prayer to be effective, we need to actually talk to Him. Similarly, if we don't create a space or time to converse with Him and enter into dialogue, we'll be too distracted by the noise and chaos around us to hear or properly discern the various ways He is trying to communicate with us and work in our lives.

Closing Prayer:

*Always begin and end each prayer with the Sign of the Cross
Lord, show us how to pray. You spent your entire life doing Your Father's will and sharing His
love with others. Help us to be as devout and consistent as You were. Come, Holy Spirit, help
us understand what it truly means to have an active relationship with the Lord, so that we may
live full and holy lives, capable of sharing His goodness with others. Amen.
