National Vocation Awareness Week will be celebrated November 2 – 8, 2025. We encourage Religion and Art classes to work together to incorporate vocation lessons during National Vocation Awareness Week and throughout the remainder of the month. Students in Pre-K through Eighth grade are invited to create a drawing no larger than 11" x 17" to promote vocations. Drawings should be hand-drawn, that is artwork created using pencil, paint, markers, crayons, etc. Students are encouraged to incorporate scripture verses, slogans, catchy phrases, or other words / phrases to highlight the promotion of vocations. We ask each school to submit the top 5 artworks per grade level to our office by December 18, 2025. No group projects, please. Only individual student's projects will be considered. Artwork will be judged based on creativity, craftmanship, effort, and overall vocation message. Enclosed are the guidelines by which all artwork will be judged. Winners will be recognized by the Diocese and the Office of Vocations at the Vocation Art Contest Awards Ceremony in the spring of 2026.
