Bishop Daniel E. Flores' Statement on the appointment of Bishop Mario Avilés CO, as the 9th Bishop of Corpus Christi

On behalf of the people of the Rio Grande Valley, I receive with joy and thanksgiving the news that Pope Leo XIV has appointed Auxiliary Bishop Mario Alberto Avilés CO, of the Diocese of Brownsville, to become now the ninth Bishop of the Diocese of Corpus Christi.

Bishop Avilés has generously served the Diocese of Brownsville as a priest of the Oratory of St. Philip Neri since 1998, and as Auxiliary Bishop since 2018. Christ the Good Shepherd, through the decision of Pope Leo XIV, now calls Bishop Mario to offer his many gifts for the glory of God and good of the people in the Diocese of Corpus Christi.

The Diocese of Corpus Christi has over the years generously shared of her clergy to serve as bishops in Brownsville, including the first bishop of Brownsville, Bishop Adolph Marx.
