## Even the prostitutes have a room in the heart of God

Today's reading reminds us that our God is a merciful God who gives us a second chance if we turn towards him. Today's Gospel is a story of a sinful woman. The story teaches that God is kind and merciful even towards prostitutes if they are ready to turn towards Him.



There are four women in Jesus' genealogy besides Mother Mary. These women are Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, and Bathsheba. All these four women are either prostitutes or sinners.

Tamar, pretended to be a prostitute and became pregnant by her Father-in-Law, Judah (Genesis 38).

Rahab was a Canaanite town prostitute (Joshua 2).

Ruth was from Moab (Ruth 2). Lot had children from his daughters and these generations were called Moabites. They were considered sinners.

Bathsheba committed sin with David and then became the wife of King David (2 Samuel 23).


The genealogy of Jesus teaches that even Jesus' great-great-grandmothers were prostitutes and sinners. All these stories teach that even the prostitutes and sinners have a room in the heart of God. Jesus says there is a great joy in heaven when a sinner turns towards God in repentance (Luke 15:10).

Today's gospel story teaches about two kinds of people: Sinners and Self-righteous people. A public sinner is ready to convert because her sins are obvious and clear even to herself. The sinful woman had nothing to lose by her sinful life. She lost everything by her name prostitute. She was weak enough to turn towards God and receive His Glory. Jesus says to her, I am not judging you but do not commit sins again. Even God is not judging this woman then how can we judge others?

The second types of people are the religious people-the ones who carry stones to throw at the sinful lady according to the Law of Moses. Jesus says, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing" (Luke 23:34). They were not weak enough to turn towards their Father in heaven. They were too capable to lose their Glory.

Sometimes our strength becomes an obstacle to receive His mercy. Religious people never acknowledged their sins because their heart was very hard. They never receive the grace to recognize themselves and their sins. So, they never get a chance to reconcile with God because of their pride. They often judge others but they never judge themselves. God is waiting for us with open arms, even though we do not deserve it.

## Music Ministry

**Director of Music Ministries: Adam Morency**

In October 2020, allegations of sexual misconduct by composer David Haas were made public. The Archdiocese of Detroit then followed with the following directive:

“Over the past several months, multiple (arch) dioceses in the United States have received allegations concerning inappropriate sexual behavior against liturgical composer David Haas, spanning the years 1979-2020. While these allegations have not been proven, out of an abundance of caution and a desire not to cause distress for those who have suffered from sexual misconduct, all parishes in the Archdiocese of Detroit are directed to refrain from using music composed by Mr. Haas at this time.” - Excerpt from AOD statement 10/28/2020

Too my knowledge and understanding with consultation from the Office of Sacred Music for the Archdiocese of Detroit, that the above directive still stands and that music ministers are still refrained from using music written by Mr. Haas.

I've played many of Mr. Haas composition at my previous parish until this directive came out from our diocese. This is a good moment for all of us to be courageous and take this small action to show support for the survivors. The courage of these survivors demands nothing less. It won't be without a little sacrifice on our part, but we hope it will support the healing of those who have experienced the trauma of abuse by Mr. Haas.

With the above being said, I've dropped all David Haas repertoire and familiar hymns. We grieve the loss of well-known hymns that were composed by Mr. Haas. Below I have listed some of the well-known hymns composed by Mr. Haas. The AOD published a non-inclusive list of 53 titles, but there were hundreds more composed by Mr. Haas. Please keep in mind that hymns by Mr. Haas can still be used at funerals with approval by the pastor.

### Be an Ambassador for Christ

Our Second Reading for last weekend invited us to be ambassadors for Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17-21). What does it mean to be an ambassador? It means to be a representative. In spending time in a warehouse in Hamtramck dividing up the medical supplies, toiletries, and other needed supplies, all the volunteers were clearly impacted. Being able to be an ambassador for Christ by supporting those affected by the war in Ukraine was an act of love for our neighbor and a way to treat them as we would treat Christ.

## Flowing Waters

Turn on the faucet at home and get running water. Drinking water is close at hand, ready to use and abundant. The faucet is a sign of God's promise.

It wasn't always that way. People could not live far from a water source. Desert areas went uninhabited and uncharted because no one could stay there very long without ample drinking water.

Through Isaiah, God promised a day when water would flow in the desert. As proof of God's power, Isaiah invited the people to recall the marvels God had done in the past. During the Exodus, as the Israelites fled Egypt, they went through the sea dry shod, but the waters closed on the chariots, horses, and army of Pharaoh, all following in pursuit. God marvelously preserved the Israelites in the past. God would marvelously preserve them again. God is doing something new. It springs forth in the sight of believers.

As Easter draws near, we think about the water God keeps close at hand — not just the water of the faucet, but the water of your church's font. There water flows freely for those who seek Christ. God has prepared a way in the deserts of the human heart for water to flow, to give life, and to transform.

This Lent we reflect not only on the desert of our sin but also on the signs of God's presence. "In the desert I make a way," God says, "in the wasteland, rivers."

**Sunday, Apr 03, 2022***FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT/ THIRD SCRUTINY OF THE ELECT***Pause and refresh**

We rush through the hours checking items off a to-do list: work and chores, errands and meals, and more. The weekly Sabbath was designed as a pause from the maddening race of accomplishment. Pausing keeps us from making mistakes born of thoughtlessness. Jesus once asked religious elders to pause and consider their own errors before stoning a woman for hers. Father Edward Hayes (1931-2016) started a house of prayer in Kansas as a place of spiritual recollection. Pause and pray with Hayes: "May the work of my hands be part of the redemption of the world and its eternal springtime liberation." **TODAY'S READINGS:** Year C: Isaiah 43:16-21; Philippians 3:8-14; John 8:1-11 (36). "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."

**Monday, Apr 04, 2022***MEMORIAL OF ISIDORE OF SEVILLE, BISHOP, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH***The original Wikipedia**

Why would Pope John Paul II name a Spanish bishop who lived 1,400 years ago the patron saint of the internet? Because Saint Isidore of Seville was the equivalent of the internet in his day. A "walking encyclopedia" you might call him. He, in fact, wrote an encyclopedia, which was used as a textbook for 900 years, as well as a dictionary and a history of the world. And like the World Wide Web, he spread information everywhere he could—founding schools and requiring seminaries in every diocese. Knowledge is power—pass it on! **TODAY'S READINGS:** Daniel 13:1-9, 15-17, 19-30, 33-62; John 8:12-20 (251). "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life."

**Tuesday, Apr 05, 2022***MEMORIAL OF VINCENT FERRER, PRIEST***Charity is good medicine**

Vincent Ferrer brought healing to a suffering church and world in the early 1400s. The Dominican-order priest used his massive popularity to end a three-way power struggle over the church's legitimate pope. People loved Vincent, not just for his preaching but for thousands of miracles attributed to him—right as Europe was ravaged by war, plague, and famine. "If you truly want to help the soul of your neighbor," Vincent preached, "you should approach God first with all your heart. Ask him simply to fill you with charity, the greatest of all virtues; with it you can accomplish what you desire."

**TODAY'S READINGS:** Numbers 21:4-9; John 8:21-30 (252). "The people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned in complaining against the LORD and you.'"

**Wednesday, Apr 06, 2022***LENTEN WEEKDAY***Answer your call, no matter the cost**

On this day in 1830, James Augustine Healy was born to Michael Healy, an Irish-Catholic immigrant, and Eliza Smith, a mixed-race African-American enslaved person, in central Georgia. Raised as a free person, James was sent to the North for school and later decided to pursue the priesthood. Though most of his peers likely did not know he was black—and James did not announce it—he became the earliest-known African American to be ordained in the Catholic Church, following seminary in Canada and Europe. He also became the first black bishop and ordinary in the United States when he was named to the Diocese of Portland

(Maine) in 1875. He was named a bishop-assistant to the papal throne two months before his death in the year 1900 and remains an example to all of faithful service to the church.

**TODAY'S READINGS:** Daniel 3:14-20, 91-92, 95; John 8:31-42 (253). "So if the Son frees you, then you will truly be free."

**Thursday, Apr 07, 2022***MEMORIAL OF JEAN-BAPTISTE DE LA SALLE, PRIEST***Be the change**

In the late 1600s Frenchman Jean-Baptiste de La Salle founded the De La Salle Brothers, whose communities and schools are now worldwide. De La Salle's innovative vision emphasized the inherent dignity of the student. He believed that "not only is God so good as to have created us, but God desires all of us to come to the knowledge of the truth." Early on, de La Salle battled opponents to his reforms. He never lived to receive official approval for his congregation of teaching brothers, which came nearly six years after his death. Are you called to uplift a reform or innovation that others oppose? You have a friend in Saint Jean-Baptiste de La Salle. May he pray for us!

**TODAY'S READINGS:** Genesis 17:3-9; John 8:51-59 (254). "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever keeps my word will never see death."

**Friday, Apr 08, 2022***LENTEN WEEKDAY; DAY OF ABSTINENCE***Tap into a higher power**

"The most common way people give up their power is by thinking they don't have any." That insight comes from author Alice Walker but certainly has its roots in scripture. Prophets and evangelists all spoke of the power available to each of us, if only we would access it. But we often make the mistake of looking for power in money, might, or celebrity, where we eventually find our paths blocked or our dominance fleeting. True and lasting power comes from love—love that is God. As we come to comprehend the breadth and depth of this love, Saint Paul tells us, we will be "filled with all the fullness of God" (Eph. 3:19). The ultimate renewable energy—straight from its divine source—is ours for the taking.

**TODAY'S READINGS:** Jeremiah 20:10-13; John 10:31-42 (255). "For he has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked!"

**Saturday, Apr 09, 2022***LENTEN WEEKDAY***Remember those who gave all**

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was executed by the Nazis on this date in 1945. He was a Lutheran pastor and theologian best known for his book *The Cost of Discipleship*, which has become a Christian classic. Ardent in his resistance of the Nazis, he became a target for harassment by the Gestapo. He fled to safety in the United States but soon returned "to share the trials of this time with my people." He was arrested, imprisoned, and hanged. A gallery of 20th-century martyrs in Westminster Abbey features Bonhoeffer along with Martin Luther King Jr. and Father Oscar Romero. Few of us are called to the ultimate sacrifice, but all of us are called to remember and revere those who answered that call.

**TODAY'S READINGS:** Ezekiel 37:21-28; John 11:45-56 (256). "It is better for you that one man should die instead of the people, so that the whole nation may not perish." Invest just five minutes a day, and your faith will deepen and grow—a day at a time.


