SCHOOL NEWS, FROM MR. MEDAUGH, PRINCIPAL:

LOOKING AHEAD: The classroom progress is going pretty well. We are starting to get rid of the old clutter and arrange rooms. Once teachers have had a chance to organize their rooms, we will figure out what to do with the old furniture. I have finished the interviews and will be announcing those results next week. Some of those whom I interviewed very graciously offered to be substitute teachers for us in the event they were not offered a full-time position.

As you know, last week I met with Dave Rupe, the transportation director at New Lexington, and Debbie Reed, the transportation director at Crooksville. Both New Lexington and Crooksville will drop students at St. Rose Catholic School at 8:30 am. Pick-up for both schools will be 3:15 p.m. Obviously, those times are projected times and we will have to work out some of the bugs. Both directors have agreed to call me personally on snow days, so that I can have accurate information when I make my decision about whether or not to have school. All three of us will be exchanging school calendars sometime in July. With that in mind, I can tell you there will be no afternoon buses from New Lexington on September 4th and 18th. This new schedule may mean that we have to adjust our daily start time. Speaking of start time, whatever it becomes, I expect students to be ready for class on time. There seems to be confusion about when classes start and when students should be at school. Last year, classes started at 8:40 a.m. and some students were arriving at 8:40 a.m. To me that didn't even make sense. Also, we started our day with prayer about 8:25 a.m. It was discouraging to see students arriving after that time for two reasons. First, the day was starting at 8:25 a.m. and secondly, it was as if being on time for prayer was not really all that important. Just be aware that the beginning of the school day and the start of the first class are not the same thing. Everyone who works with students needs to have Protecting God's Children. Ms. Regina Quinn has been gracious enough to help us sponsor a class at the PCC. Fr. Reade is working with Sheriff Barker to make it possible for those attending to get their Background Checks (BCI) the same day after the session is over. The session will take place on

Saturday, August 8th, from 9:00 a.m. until noon. I will be in the office Tuesday-Thursday, from 7:30 a.m.-5:00 p.m. In July, I will most likely increase the time I am at school. There will be a lot of work that needs done prior to school starting. We are currently reviewing the Ed Choice applications, so if you haven't filed, please consider doing that in the near future.

As I mentioned, one of my favorite books is Living the Mass by Fr. Dominic Grassi and Joe Paprocki. In regards to preparing for the Eucharist, Paprocki points out that we are called to give back some of what Gad has given us. He writes that none of us know how much time on earth we have been granted and that we should use the time we have been allotted wisely. In order to follow Jesus more closely, we should use our time to serve the needs of others, at work and at home, as well as with our friends and those around the world. Each of us, as members of various communities, is called to consider the needs of those communities when we make decisions about how to spend our time. "As baptized Catholics, we are indeed accountable to one another and are called to use our time wisely, not for selfish needs, but for the needs of the community." Thank you again to all the festival volunteers. We are grateful that you have shared your time with the parish community.
