FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This weekend, we celebrate the **Feast of the Presentation of the Lord**. We contemplate this event in the 4th decade of the Joyful Mysteries in the Rosary. This event in the life of the Holy Family is recounted for us in Luke's Gospel. Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple to consecrate Him to the Lord, and offer a sacrifice. Simeon, a man they encounter, was promised by the Lord that he would not see death until he had seen the Messiah and the fulfilled promise of Israel. His words from

Luke 2:29-32 are called the *Canticle of Simeon* and are prayed each night during Night Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours. As we prepare for sleep, and pray this prayer, we can reflect upon how grateful we are that God has shown us Jesus Christ somewhere in our lives today. Have I seen Jesus in my neighbor, either in the ways I was able to help, or have been helped by someone? Have I seen Jesus, in the sacraments? Have I seen Jesus in my prayer or through some favor? Have I seen Jesus though some suffering that came my way?

Also, with this feast we can reflect upon our own "presentation in the temple." We can thank our parents or godparents for presenting us for Baptism. We thank them for consecrating us to God either from a young age or as adults. Regarding Baptism, we have a new **Ritual for Baptism** available to us for use beginning today. This ritual will look very similar to what you've seen at Baptism either within or outside of Mass, but you might notice some elevated language used in the ritual. This is so that it is more in keeping with the new translation to the Roman Missal we use for Mass and received in Advent 2011. Many of the priests and deacons of the diocese gathered a few Saturdays ago at the Pontifical College Josephinum to review the new ritual.

This Sunday also happens to be **World Day for Consecrated Life**. We benefit from the prayers of consecrated men and women who live out their vocation to serve Jesus in a special way. The grace and life we receive from our Baptism helps us to answer the call to embrace the life Jesus asks of us. We benefited from the Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity (Stella Franciscans) for years in our area. We pray that more young people will embrace this call at an early age and give radical witness to Jesus with their lives.

Prayerful best wishes for a safe and successful **basketball tournament** next weekend, February 7-9, hosted in our gym and many others throughout the area.

Please remember to **fulfill your BAA pledges**. All parishes have met and exceeded their goals. We want to receive our maximum refund from the diocese to help our parishes. CATECHISM CORNER

529: The *presentation of Jesus in the temple* shows Him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord. With Simeon and Anna, all Israel awaits its *encounter* with the Savior-the name given to this event in the Byzantine tradition. Jesus is recognized as the long-expected Messiah, the "light to the nations" and the "glory of Israel," but also "a sign that is spoken against." The sword of sorrow predicted for Mary announces Christ's perfect and unique oblation on the cross that will impart the salvation God had "prepared in the presence of all peoples."

534: The *finding of Jesus in the temple* is the only event that breaks the silence of the Gospels about the hidden years of Jesus. Here, Jesus lets us catch a glimpse of the mystery of his total consecration to a mission that flows from His divine sonship: "Did you not know that I must be about my Father's work?" Mary and Joseph did not understand these words, but they accepted them in faith. Mary "kept all these things in her heart" during the years Jesus remained hidden in the silence of an ordinary life.

916: The state of consecrated life is thus one way of experiencing a "more intimate" consecration, rooted in Baptism and dedicated totally to God. In the consecrated life, Christ's faithful, moved by the Holy Spirit, propose to follow Christ more nearly, to give themselves to God who is loved above all and, pursuing the perfection of charity in the service of the Kingdom, to signify and proclaim in the Church the glory of the world to come.

931: Already dedicated to him through Baptism, the person who surrenders himself to the God he loves above all else; thereby, consecrates himself more intimately to God's service and to the good of the Church. By this state of life consecrated to God, the Church manifests Christ and shows us how the Holy Spirit acts so wonderfully in her. And so, the first mission of those who profess the evangelical counsels is to live out their consecration. Moreover, "since members of institutes of consecrated life dedicate themselves through their consecration to the service of the Church they are obliged in a special manner to engage in missionary work, in accord with the character of the institute."
