Reflection: "Love The Lord, Love Your Neighbor"

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments." It's not uncommon to associate the word "commands" with images of dictatorship. We can tend to think of commandments as obstacles to real freedom, imposed by some angry, powerful tyrant who just wants to be in control. Call them directions, or suggestions, or



guidelines if you will, but not commands! It almost feels like an insult. But today, Jesus breaks out of these stereotypes. He casts the

Invitations?

Graduations. Bachelor parties. Wedding showers. Weddings. Proms. Memorial Day cookouts. Baseball games (kids' games and the professionals). It is the time of year for invitations to all kinds of events. Sometimes we are happy to say "yes" to the invitation and sometimes we just have to say "no."

All through-out this Easter season we hear readings from the Acts of the Apostles each day at Mass. The readings bring a smile to our faces as we hear the successes the early church had in *inviting* new members. The first to be invited were other Jews, but in today's reading we hear of the success of St. Philip in *inviting* the hated Samaritans to join the faith. In those first years of the church the *invitations* spread the faith to Greece and Rome, through modern-day Turkey to the north and south to the Egyptians. Such an amazing growth in those first 30 years of the church!

Today we are also called to be an inviting people.

Yes, it's that time to invite the brother or sister, son or daughter, family member, friend or neighbor who is not usually at Mass. How about inviting them to our Feast Day festivities on June 22nd? —Mass at 11:00 followed by a "Taste Fest" in the gym?

Each One Bring One

The phrase "Each One Bring One" came up at a recent committee meeting when one member from Nigeria mentioned a parish practice from his homeland. The expectation in his parish was that each person is to try to bring at least one visitor to church sometime over the course of a year. Of course, it is marvelous if we bring MORE than one person. Of course, it is *really* marvelous if that person is so impressed by the Lord working in the parish community that they come back on their own and even become a parish member.

When we invite someone to our parish we can do it with joy since joy reflects our own experience and joy is often a big reason for coming back week after week. We need not worry about having to be a theologian or historian. We are simply sharing our feelings like we do when we are joyfully announcing a new baby or that we have become engaged to be married.

Invite someone to share those feelings with you and the rest of our parish community.

context of love. He does not insist on any obligation to follow them. Rather, he says that whoever observes his commandments "is the one who loves me."

So just what commandments will we be following if we love the Lord? When Jesus was questioned about this, he said the two greatest commandments are to "love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind," and to "love your neighbor as yourself," (Mt 22:37-39). Even the commands he gives us are rooted in love, not legalism. Of course, when we follow these principles we will naturally keep the traditional Ten Commandments, which give more specific instructions on how to love God and neighbor.

As we know from experience, when we truly love someone, we desire to make them happy. When they are content, we are content. So the more we love Jesus, the more we will want to please him. Thus, following his commandments ultimately makes us happy too. Understood in these terms, the commandments don't stifle us, they satisfy us! God doesn't restrict our freedom; he respects it. Ultimately, it is our choice whether or not we will live the life of love that Jesus offers us.

Though the Spirit moves on the waters at the beginning of Genesis and is present in the waters of our Baptism, water itself is not used as a symbol for the Holy Spirit.)



What is a dispensation? My fiancé and I need to get one for our wedding.



Canon law is the body of laws that govern the church: its structure, rights, and responsibilities of each member, and all its work, including the sacraments. Canon 85 defines a dispensation as "the relaxation of a merely ecclesiastical law in a particular case." In other words, if the law is something that the church created, the church can also dispense from the obligation to observe that law. For example, church law states that the marriage must be witnessed by a priest or deacon and two witnesses. But if the marriage is taking place in the church of the non-Catholic, a dispensation must be granted if the marriage is to be valid.

Dispensations allow the church to apply the benefit of the law to each person in different circumstances. During your preparation for marriage, you will be told if you need a dispensation. However, the priest or deacon assisting you will fill out the paperwork and forward it to the chancery office so that the dispensation will be granted by the bishop. This is another reason why many dioceses require at least six months notice of your intention to marry. It allows for the personal as well as legal preparations necessary for your reception of the sacrament of matrimony.
