Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Reflection: "God's Plans Really Do Work Out For The Best"

"When he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe." Jesus predicted his resurrection in today's Gospel. But it wasn't until after the disciples witnessed the miraculous event that they realized what he had been talking about. At the time, Jesus' words seemed mysterious, even confusing. Those who heard him understandably thought his reference to "this temple" was about the Jewish house of worship. But it wasn't. He was talking about his body. This only became clear later.



As the saying goes, "hindsight is twenty-twenty." How often do we find ourselves in the midst of a situation

that doesn't make sense at the time? We question the "meaning" of a sickness, a lost job, a betrayal, or a disappointment. But then, after time has passed, we can begin to see it from another angle. In fact, many times we begin to see how good came out of these tough situations. St. Paul says, "We know that all things work for good for those who love God," (Rom 8:28).

Sometimes it's hard to trust in God's promises, especially when his plan seems mysterious or confusing. But just as the disciples learned that Jesus (continued on page 3)

As the Evangelization Committee members and other recruits are doing door-to-door visits in the neighborhood we have a very simple approach:

- I Introducing ourselves (we go two-by-twos)
- I Information about our home parish in the form of a tri-fold handout and our explanations
- I Invitation to the residents to join us to experience our diverse community, our prayerful worship and our many activities
- **P** Praying with the residents based on intentions they have in that household.

So far we have concentrated these visits on streets just west of Evergreen from Pembroke north to 8 Mile Road.

A big thanks and salute to Paul Moore who inspired us to start this ministry based his prior experience at St. Benedict Parish in Highland Park. Thanks also to the seven people who have done the door-to-door ministry so far.

Most of the ministry has occurred between 1:00 and 2:30 on Sunday or Saturday afternoons. We have also done some on weekdays but with less success since people are less likely to be home at those times.

After just a few weeks we have had many fine visits with at least one surprise — one woman has asked us to be on her radio talk show!

This ministry is just one of the many ways to accomplish our evangelization thrust of "Each One, Bring One." knew what he was talking about, we can believe that too. He tells us that he is "the way and the truth and the life" (Jn 14:6). Although the way may seem indirect, Jesus' perspective is bigger than ours. He knows how to lead us to the fullness of life, in this world and the next. The path may not be one that we would choose. Even Jesus had to journey through the cross before his resurrection — the temple of his body was destroyed before it was rebuilt. But looking back, it's obvious that God's plans really do work out for the best.

Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome

Every diocese has a mother church, the bishop's cathedral where the diocesan church gathers and celebrates. The cathedral is the seat of the bishop's authority over the diocese. That authority is intended to be one of service to God's people, shepherding and guiding them in a truly pastoral mode.

The pope is first and foremost the bishop of Rome, as well as the head of the Roman Catholic Church. St. John Lateran is his cathedral, and its prominence derives from that reality. St. John Lateran cathedral traces its origins to Constantine who converted a portion of the Laterani family palace into a church, and gave it to Pope Sylvester (314-335) as the papal church and residence. It became known as the cathedral of the pope, and its facade's inscription refers to it as "the Mother and Head of all Churches, in the City and of the World." The universal celebration of this feast stresses the unity among Roman Catholics, as they unite themselves with the chair of Peter.

The Lateran portion of the name refers to the family who donated the land. St. John refers to the two saints in whose honor the church is dedicated, John the Baptist and John the Evangelist. Make an effort to visit your diocesan cathedral and pray for all bishops, that they continue to be true shepherds of God's people.

Black Catholic History History Month is celebrated each year in November.

History in the Archdiocese of Detroit

In the early 1900s, a man named **Norman Dukette** visited St. Mary's Parish in Greektown, Detroit. There, he volunteered to help organize a black Catholic mission inside the church. Dukette also joined the seminary and in 1926 became the first African-American to be ordained a priest in Detroit.

Similar chapels and missions for black Catholics were set up throughout Detroit beginning in the 1870s.

Dukette's mission at St. Mary's was later moved to the Sacred Heart Church near Eastern Market where it became known as St. Peter Claver Parish, the first full parish in Detroit dedicated to black Catholics.






As we celebrate Veterans Day, I'm wondering what should be the Christian attitude in resorting to violence to resolve conflicts?



Veterans are rightly honored for their role in defending the country, especially in time of conflict and violence. Yet, resorting to violence as a means of trying to resolve human conflicts is not the Christian way to deal with relationships. Jesus models the image of God in which all are valued and cherished as God's children, no matter who they are or which side they are on.

In times of war and military struggles, it is difficult to make these kinds of distinctions. Yet distinctions have to be made, and values have to be examined in determining what justice demands. Sometimes violence may be justified, but only as a means of last resort, when all possible options have been exhausted, and when greater harm might result. Those who fight and defend under such circumstances must be supported, cared for, valued, and honored.

At the same time, institutions who declare that violence is the only means left to resolve a conflict have to examine continuously their motives and agendas. Those who push institutions to such deep self-examination should be as valued as those who are defending the institution. Both play important and necessary roles, and as such both are truly patriotic. Such tensions prevent blind nationalistic slogans like "our country, right or wrong" from seeing the light of day. Let us pray for all veterans, as well as for those who seek to negotiate peace, that God may truly guide us all in the path of justice.
