

Sunday Reflection

"And I will lay down my life for the sheep."

Jesus himself gave us the image of himself as the Good Shepherd. In trying to teach us about who he was, his love for us, and his mission to save us, he chose to speak in these terms. The picture is a comforting one. We can imagine the natural beauty of a shepherd on a hillside, gently leading and guiding his sheep to the places where all their needs are met. The shepherd makes sure they are fed, watered, rested, and, of course, safe. This last element is what separates a good shepherd from a bad one. When a threat approaches his flock, the good shepherd will do whatever is necessary to save them, even at risk of his own safety. The bad shepherd, on the other hand, thinks only of himself and abandons the sheep in order to protect his own skin.

It's important, in understanding the analogy, for us to realize that we, the sheep of Christ's pasture, do face real threats, though they may be the kind that are hard to recognize. The wolves that prowl (cont. on page 3)

25 Years Ago ... Already?

Yes, it was 25 years ago when our US bishops created a document called **Go Make Disciples**. That document gave us American Catholics three goals: Goal I: Enthusiastic Catholics! (not just ho-hum!) Goal II: Everyone hears the Good News! (person-toperson, in print, through electronic media, etc.) Goal III: Gospel values in our society! (loving our neighbors, taking care of the poor, getting rid of the death penalty, creating justice in all venues, etc.)

25 Years Later ...

Here in 2015 we at Corpus Christi have established many tasks to work at accomplishing those very goals. Some of those tasks have been appropriated to the Evangelization Committee ... and shared with all parish members.

Each One, Bring One is an idea prompted by Joseph Emeruom's experiences in his home country of Nigeria. Essentially, it asks us to not be bashful about inviting other family members, friends and neighbors to join us in one of our social or liturgical events: our parish picnic, the baptism of one of our children or grandchildren, etc. Has that prompted you to think of someone to invite?

 $\underline{\text{Facebook}}$ use has been prompted by Katrina Smith and Vickie Figueroa. If you are a Facebook user please " $\underline{\text{friend us}}$ ", that is, Corpus Christi. Look for the Facebook symbol, \mathbf{f} , on our website homepage.

Door-to-Door Ministry has been prompted by Paul Moore based on his positive experiences while he was a member of St. Benedict parish in Highland Park. Paul led last year's efforts and we are again gearing up for it this Spring. We have started with the area between 7 and 8 Mile, between Evergreen and Lahser. We go in pairs (like Jesus told his disciples to do!), typically on Sunday or Saturday afternoons. We are working block-by-block to ring door bells, announce the presence of Corpus Christi in the neighborhood, tell them a little about what we do here, ask if we can pray for something with them, and leave a brochure. How about you? Care to join in a ministry like that? Call or see someone like Paul Moore, Jeff Smale or Paul Mueller for more info.

around our souls are the vices of anger, jealousy, lust, greed, gluttony, vanity, and laziness. We traditionally call these the seven deadly sins, and they are truly deadly. When we give in to them, we cut off our souls from the source of real life: God. But Jesus is the Good Shepherd, who lavs down his life for us. literally. Jesus suffered and died on the cross, taking away the deadly consequence of sin. This selfless act has saved us by offering the forgiveness and reconciliation that our souls, weak and weary from the attacks of evil, desperately need. What a gift to be in the care of such a shepherd. What a joy to be in this flock where, as Jesus says, "I know mine and mine know me."

mistaken his face for mine! Without bodies, our faces looked so alike and I didn't see the difference at first.

The First Letter of John tells us that the world does not yet see us for who we are because it does not recognize Jesus. When the world finally recognizes Jesus, all will see us for who we are because we will look like him. So for now, do not assume people will look at you and say, "What a great steward and disciple! They are just like Jesus!" Some will see your way of life and understand. They will be inspired to be like Jesus as well. But many will look at you and listen to what you have to say and actually wonder why you don't wake up and conform to the world. It is not easy when you find yourself in the situation of being the only intentional disciple in your neighborhood, at work, or even in your family. 



Can you explain what we mean by a vocation or calling? I have heard this term used in many different contexts and am not sure what it means. Does it apply to religious life?



A vocation or calling refers to a spiritual experience whereby a person senses within oneself the closeness of God and what he is asking in one's life. It is a realization of what one's part in God's plan could be. Vocation comes in all kinds of ways. Some are as dramatic as St. Paul's, being knocked off his horse, blinded, and hearing God's voice. Others are less dramatic, often occurring over time through little events and personal interests. Others happen in a hurry, accompanied by great spiritual insight or conversion. We often think that this applies to religious vocation, but in fact, every Christian has a vocation, a calling to serve others in and through the church. Whether married or single, religious or lay, we are all called to live out our baptismal commitment to preach and teach the Gospel message. Each of us has our role to play in God's plan, and we become coworkers with God in the work of redemption. With a little confidence, a willing spirit and God's grace, we can and will respond to his unique call.
