Into Something
Abundant
And Overflowing**

"And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets."

Today's Gospel shows us that Jesus wants to do more than satisfy our needs. He wants to give us an experience of fullness and abundance. He not only miraculously fed the crowd of thousands; he also provided enough to make a mountain of leftovers. More than they needed, more than they ever expected. That's what Jesus gave.

And it's what he continues to give us every time we receive the Eucharist. This too is a miraculous meal. Like the multiplication of "five loaves and two fish," Jesus turns something small — bread and wine — into something abundant and overflowing: his body, blood, soul, and divinity. Through this sacrament we experience the gift of union with Jesus and the resulting graces that come from encountering him. Just like the crowds gathered that day in a deserted place, we come to Jesus with *(continued on page 3)*

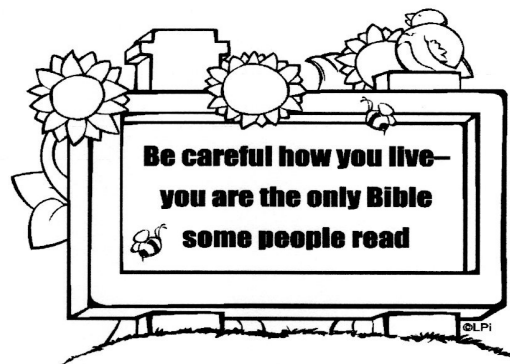

our emptiness — our needs, our weaknesses, our fears — and he fills us up until we too are "satisfied."

The prayer after Communion on today's feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ reminds us that what we experience at Mass is a foretaste of that ultimate satisfaction that we will experience in heaven: *"Grant, O Lord, we pray, that we may delight for all eternity in that share in your divine life, which is foreshadowed in the present age by our reception of your precious Body and Blood."* Receiving the Lord in the Eucharist is a momentous miracle and an earthly glimpse into heaven. May today's celebration help remind us to be ever grateful for this most glorious gift.

When I was younger, for many years I helped lead the music for our parish liturgies. The "grander" liturgies stand out to me: first Communion, confirmation, Christmas, etc. It was at one of those first Communion Masses where I learned an important lesson.

As musicians at liturgy, you really play a key role in providing a sense of movement to the entire experience. Between moments of spoken prayer and petition, you provide a way for all assembled to pray with song. Sometimes, you make decisions at the moment for the sake of keeping the liturgy "moving."

When it was time for Communion, we played

throughout the entire time, and I did not allow a time for us as musicians to receive ourselves. I had hoped that this would be noticed and after our playing had concluded, someone would offer us the Eucharist. They didn't. At first I thought, "Unfortunately, that's just the way it goes." One of our musicians did not see it that way and was upset. He said to me, "What am I here for, anyway?"

My assumption without thinking much about it that day was that our presence was to lead music. However, I had missed it. Even though we played an important role at the liturgy, the reason we were there was Jesus. No matter how beautiful our music could be or how well the congregation sang, our primary purpose of being there was just like everyone else's: Jesus.

Our stewardship is very important, but at no time does it become the main thing. Our generosity and commitment of ourselves points to that which matters the most. When we lose sight of (cont. on p 7)

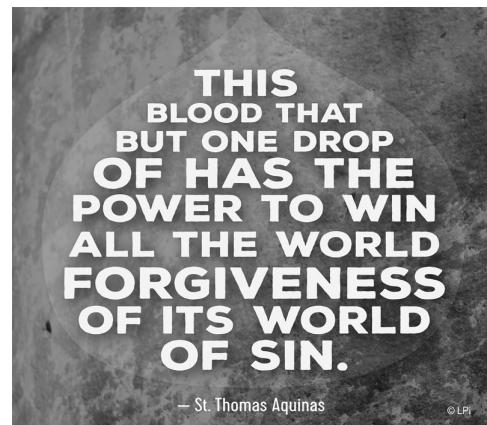

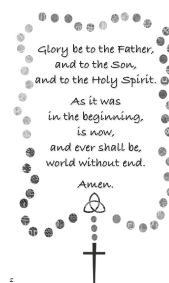

GOF Presenters Evaluate Corpus Christi Parish!

After the April GOF session, Brother Al talked with one of the Design Team members and expressed what he and Maggid Steve thought about their experience at Corpus Christi. They loved it!!! "This Mass was the mountain top," especially the sung Creed and the joy that arose from every person/song/prayer. They felt the spirit of the community and appreciated everyone's participation during their presentation, especially noting the presence of our pastor, Fr. Don (evidently this does not often happen in other parishes). "Invite us back!" they said.

Forty-three evaluations from this session gave high praise to these two presenters: "amazing"... "excellent"... "inspiring"... "energetic"... "very solid theology"... "loved their music & interpretations." (Do you rise on your toes when singing the *Holy, Holy* at Mass?) "Only a visit from the Pope could be better." (We probably can't arrange for that to happen.) "Invite them back," you said.

Other general comments about the year: "I have learned much from each [session]." "Congratulations to the members who put this all together and selected the topics." "Well done; interesting series."

What could be better: "Too rushed during lunch" was a comment from a number of people. The Design Team is dialoging with the Worship Commission for ways to streamline and simplify the Mass on GOF Sundays. The Commission also suggested that we work to eliminate the registration congestion at the gym entrance. Maybe a silent lunch would feel less rushed? (Just kidding!!)

Our preschool through grade 12 young people enjoyed the presentation in the Rainbow Room by the Children's Theatre of Michigan! "*Good News! Parables in Revue*" was a fun, interactive show that reminded them of the message of the Gospels. Some of our youth even got to be part of the show!

Did you know that over the past year between 84 and 104 households attended a GOF session? That as many as 122 adults were at one of the sessions? That 49 young people (preschool through Grade 12) have attended? Sometimes over 40 people who have registered do not attend, BUT often 25 to 30 unregistered members decide to come (the Holy Spirit balances everything out for us!).

What are the “fruits” of holy Communion?

A

The Eucharist, like all sacraments, offers its own unique grace. We receive a special share in God’s life that helps us in our faith journey. We are given all we need to sustain and nurture our relationship with God. The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. Everything we are and everything we hope to become is found in this sacrament. It is essential to the life of the church, to each member of the church. Without it, there is no church. The Eucharist is the center of our spiritual life and has enormous effects on our growth, our holiness, and our way of life.

The fruits of holy Communion are the benefits one receives from the sacrament. These fruits of holy Communion are discussed in the catechism in the article on the Eucharist. The primary benefit is union with Christ. We become one with him sacramentally, just as we hope to become one with him for eternity. The Eucharist also separates us from sin, both past and future. It forgives the venial sins of the past and, by the love we receive, protects us from mortal sin in the future. The church community is also unified and strengthened by the Eucharist. It unites us to the poor and offers the pledge of eternal life.
