


Teens, don't miss World Youth Day Home Detroit!!!

I Witness

My mother taught me to forgive. She taught me the Lord's Prayer – asking God to forgive us as we forgive others. My Mom taught us mostly by example. We always saw her bringing people together, forgiving, and bringing good out of difficult circumstances. I saw her forgive hurts and live joyously and generously. In her old age, Mom chose to stay in her home close to her church and friends. She was the driver for other women to Sunday Mass, to their bridge games, and to the grocery store.

My Mother taught me to forgive. My gentle mother was murdered at age 82 in her Detroit home by a 20 year old substitute newspaper carrier. Early in my grief, I was assured by my mother or by God that good would come from this evil. If hate and revenge were added to my burden of grief, I'm sure it would have destroyed me. So I thank God for a mother who modeled love and forgiveness. I hated the crime, but I never hated her killer.

My Mother taught me to forgive. The judge said that the young man's rage and history of being abused and sense of powerlessness over his own life exploded in the time he had power over a helpless victim. I feel that there were two victims – first her killer was a victim of our society's neglect. He had no treatment for his mental problems, an inferior education, no job he could handle, and no intervention or support. Mom's violent death would likely have been averted if her young killer had any chance for a decent life.

My Mother taught me to forgive. I was invited to join other murder victims' families in telling our stories of forgiveness on annual tours of death penalty states. I met many other families whose loved one had been murdered, but who had gained healing through forgiving the killer. On the "Journey of Hope...from Violence to Healing", we spoke to many thousands at churches, schools and civic programs and changed hearts about the death penalty. I took part in this for 17 days each year from 1993 through 2003.

My Mother taught me to forgive. I honor my Mom's memory when I forgive, when I work for social justice, and try to bring good out of the evil of her murder.

My fiancé and I are very attached to a love song that we want to make the theme at our wedding. Could we use it at our wedding Mass? Must we use "church music"?



Couples always want their wedding day to be special and they spend hours planning each detail. From the wedding rehearsal dinner to the honeymoon, there are a lot of things to coordinate. But the most important moment is the one when you exchange vows because the celebration of marriage is a celebration of a sacrament. The church, as a community of faith, witnesses your vows as you give yourselves to one another. The church recognizes and blesses your love for each other. The priest, in the name of the church, witnesses your vows to one another. In one parish, the theme of the wedding preparation program sums it up nicely: it's your wedding and our celebration!

For this reason, weddings are often done in the context of a Mass. Hearing the words of sacred Scripture and the offering of the sacrifice of Jesus surround the Rite of Marriage as the community of faith prays with and for you. Secular music, even that which celebrates love, is not appropriate for Mass. Liturgical music captures the theme and spirit of worship, uniting the prayers of the community in song. Since you are receiving a sacrament, you do not want to detract from that part of the celebration. Save any secular songs for your reception.
