Sunday Reflection



God has given Us the Gift of the Holy Spirit

"Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, 'Peace be with you.'"

Then, he said it again. And then, "he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.'" Jesus brings peace, and he brings the Holy Spirit. Peace, in fact, is one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit. Today, on this feast of Pentecost, we remember the dramatic outpouring of the Holy Spirit that came upon those first apostles and the peace that came along with it. But we do more than remember. We also celebrate the presence of this same Spirit in our midst.

Through the sacrament of baptism, every Christian receives the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit in his or her soul. Thus, the gift of peace is already ours! The question is whether or not we have really begun to appreciate and utilize this most precious gift. Like the apostles who had locked themselves up "for fear of the Jews," we too are capable of imprisoning ourselves in our own anxieties. We fret and worry about the future, about our sufferings or our disappointments, and too often let these concerns stifle the true peace (cont. on page 3)

Pentecost: The Soul's Most Welcome Guest

I await the Feast of Pentecost each year with anticipation, hoping to feel God's presence. Putting on a red sweater, the color of the day, I'm always eager to be part of the celebration. Red, the color of fire and the tongues of flame that rested atop the Apostles heads. Red, the color of God's love.

Scripture says that at Pentecost, the Holy Spirit enabled the Apostles to speak in other languages, previously unknown to them. Native speakers heard the stories of kindness, peace, love, and redemption in their own languages. It must have been a powerful moment after months, or even years, speaking Aramaic or Greek as they followed Christ to now hear these wonders spoken in the language of their childhoods, the language their mothers whispered as they fell asleep at night.

When my husband and I were dating, we attended a weekly ecumenical Taize service at Stanford University. In preparation for the scripture readings, the priest would ask those who were bilingual to read the text in another language. It was exhilarating to hear these sacred words read first in English, then in Spanish, Chinese, Hindi. My soul was affirmed as I heard these truths, again and again in different languages. My faith was not just true for me. It was true for all people.

By sending the Holy Spirit, God invites us to understand one another. Have you ever had that experience where you know someone is a fellow believer, a sister or brother in Christ, without knowing them? Or when you can see that someone is hurting when they haven't told you at thing? God enables us to see each other as He does, as precious children of God. Come, Holy Spirit, we pray, "from thy celestial home, shed a ray of light divine!" Come, bring a bit of heaven to us on earth.

But the Church today urges us to rejoice and to step out in faith like the apostles who left their fears behind them. Peace not only alleviates our fears, it also frees us to live our faith to the fullest, to have the courage to take risks, and to leave our comfort zone for the sake of the Gospel. This is what we are called and, not only that, empowered to do. Anything less is a kind of spiritual poverty we bring upon ourselves. God has given us the gift of himself, present and available in every moment, every place, and every situation. May we recognize this most wonderful gift and give thanks with grateful hearts.



but most years the party cost too much, involved too much stress, and resulted in a lot of presents that ended up in my garage. Today, nice dinners with family and friends sharing time together have taken the place of the "birthday party" and that is fine with me.

Centuries ago, God moved in such a profound way and sent his Holy Spirit upon us, imparting to the Church gifts that remain with us today. That first Pentecost was a first birthday party of sorts, with people gathered to celebrate their common faith in Jesus Christ. Of course, that party had none of the trappings of a child's event at Chuck E. Cheese's, but instead presented us all with generous gifts that could be used for the glory of God instead of the stuff children discard after a few weeks.

Every year I think it is important to really celebrate what God has given to us, the Church, on the feast of Pentecost. The generosity of God knows no limits and the Holy Spirit is alive. It's just that the gifts from this celebration need to be used or the celebration will be hollow. The gifts are free to us even though they are priceless. It would be poor stewardship to toss them in the garage with all those toys that time forgot.

My friend has never heard of Christ and I want to share the Gospel with her but I'm afraid to. How do I share my faith?



There are a lot of ways to bring up the topic of religion, without being judgmental or pushy. Begin by asking what her thoughts are about religion, or what her experience was growing up. Finding common ground is often easier than you think, because the questions and problems we have about God, the presence of evil, our purpose in life, and our relationship with God are universal concerns.

Why are you afraid? If you do not want to insult or offend someone, don't be pushy or judgmental. If you are uncertain about how to explain your own faith, do a little reading or practice with a friend. If you measure success only by this person converting, focus your attention more on beginning the conversation, not on bringing it to a perfect close! Faith is a journey of many acts of belief, many discussions about God, and many choices about how we practice what we preach. In some we will have great success; in others we will need forgiveness and perseverance. The most important thing to keep in mind is that the Holy Spirit is always at work and our most humble efforts can bear great fruit. Have faith in God because he has faith in you!
