Are You Ready To Go?

The Ascension is an interesting feast when you think about it. We celebrate Jesus leaving! Jesus' first departure from the earth was sudden and unexpected, at least to his followers. That Good Friday departure was characterized by sorrow, confusion, and loss. This departure has a different feel: anticipation.

Today's Gospel is full of the mighty deeds Jesus predicts for his followers. "In my name they will drive out demons, they will speak new languages. They will pick up serpents [with their hands], and if they drink any deadly thing it will not harm them. They will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover." Mark's account of the Ascension is abrupt and succinct. "Then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven." Jesus ascends and the Apostles go. "But they went forth and preached everywhere." The real moment likely had a bit of lag time. Realistically, the Apostles had quite the task in front of them. Can you imagine those first few moments on the hilltop after Jesus disappeared, as the Apostles met each other's (continued on page 3)

Young People, the Faith, and Vocations

Pre-Synod Meeting – Synod of Bishops XV

Then afterward I will pour out my spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams and your young men shall see visions. Joel 2:28

In Spring of this year, young adult Catholics worldwide gathered in Rome and daily on social media to share their views on the current state of their lives and faith, ideas, feelings and recommendations with church leadership and each other. A summary of this meeting will be presented at the Synod of Bishops on youth, faith, and vocations in October 2018. The Pre-Synod discussed (1) Challenges and Opportunities, (2) Faith and Vocation, and (3) The Church's Pastoral Activity.

Challenges and Opportunities:

YAs "are deeply vested in and concerned about topics such as sexuality, addiction, failed marriages, broken families as well as larger-scale social issues such as organized crime, human trafficking, violence, corruption, exploitation, femicide, all forms of persecution and the degradation of our natural environment."

Social media is a significant part of young people's identity and way of life. "Digital environments have a great potential to unite people across geographical distances like never before." Also, YAs seek to engage with and address the social justice issues of our time and seek the opportunity to form a better world.

"YAs feel, inclusion is needed: welcome, mercy and tenderness from the Church – both as an institution and as a community of faith."

Faith and Vocation:

Many young people know and have a relationship with Jesus as their Savior and the Son of God and often find closeness to Jesus through His Mother, Mary. Others see Jesus merely as a moral leader and a good man. And some YAs perceive Him as distant from the human experience, a distance perpetuated by the Church.

"Young people are looking for companions on the journey, to be embraced by faithful men and women who express the truth and allow young people to articulate their understanding of faith and their vocation. Such people do not need to be models of faith to imitate, but instead living testimonies to witness." (continued in special insert)

eyes? "This is it. He really is gone this time. It's up to us now."

Mark's abrupt transition from Ascension to action makes his meaning clear. The Ascension isn't just about Jesus. It's about us. Are we ready to go? Are we ready to be commissioned? This is the heart of the Ascension message — Jesus leaves so we can go. We might not "go into the whole world," but we all live in a corner of it. The command to "proclaim the Gospel" isn't a call for everyone to be formal preachers of the Word. We do, however, proclaim our beliefs with the way we live our lives. Do our lives proclaim Easter joy?





What is a sacramental seal and where did it come from?



Leaving more than just a memory, there are some events in our life that are truly transforming, making us different people. The same thing can be said of spiritual things, especially sacraments. A sacramental seal or character is a theological concept to describe the life-changing and permanent effect of three sacraments on the person: baptism, confirmation, and holy orders. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches that these sacraments confer a seal "by which the Christian shares in Christ's priesthood and is made a member of the Church according to different states and functions. This configuration to Christ and the Church, brought about by the Spirit, is indelible" (#1121).

Once we receive these sacraments, we are forever changed. It's a spiritual "point of no return" whereby we take a step forward in our faith journey. We are marked as people of faith, as those who have received the Spirit and as those called to serve in ordained ministry. That is why these sacraments are received only once. The direction is set, the choice is made, and we are called by God to be his people. Nothing can change that, not even our own sinfulness.
