Sunday Reflection



God provides the Growth

"This is how it is with the kingdom of God." What is a kingdom? Is it the brick and mortar that build up the castle? Is it the expanse of land a king can reasonably defend? Our notions of kingdoms may be romanticized in the modern era, but for the Israelites, a kingdom held deep historical meaning. Thousands of years before the birth of Christ, the Israelites had asked God for a king. After the reigns of David and Solomon, the united kingdom dissolved into factions, and the land was conquered by the Assyrians, Babylonians, and, finally, Romans. For the Israelites, a kingdom was something to build, both structurally and civilly. While this had ended in ruin for their ancestors, many of Jesus' contemporaries longed for the restoration of an earthly kingdom.

Jesus' words in today's Gospel are a radical departure from this perspective. He compares the Kingdom of God to a field, but it appears that the farmer has little to do with its progress. "The seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord, the land yields fruit." Jesus introduces his followers to a new sort of kingdom, a kingdom where God provides the growth.

There is work to be done, of course. (cont. on page 3)

Deacon Al died last June after serving as a deacon for almost 40 years. He was born in Germany, served in the US military, married Lucille, was the father of four children (Renee, Mark, Carol and Lee), and was a deacon since 1979. The Hogrebe family registered in the parish in 1972.

Deep down, Deacon Al was a master carpenter, and we know him so well by the products of his handicraft as we see some of them every week in our parish church. Among the most prominent are:

- the Altar (Yes! Deacon Al made the Altar)
- the Ambo
- the Announcement Podium
- the stands that support the altar candles and potted flowers
- the Christmas stable
- beautifully handcrafted wood items used as prizes for GOF attendees and others

Many of our parish families have a cherished **Memorial Cross** in their homes which was presented to them during our annual Remembrance of Deceased. Deacon Al also made the wooden crosses for many years (our own Paul Billion has been making the crosses in the last few years).

May all fathers, like Deacon AI, be blessed with skills used for the benefit of others, love of the Lord, and a long, fruitful life!

■ Four Things Your Children Should Know

Unfortunately, babies don't come with users' manuals, and the job of parenting doesn't get performance reviews. There is no single right way to be a parent, however, there are some ingredients that we all need to incorporate.

Here are four things that every Catholic parent should strive to make sure their children know before leaving home. How you do these things, and how you incorporate them into your parenting, is where your own personality and your children's personalities come in.

1. You are loved.

It has been proven over and over that young adults who know beyond any doubt that their parents love them are less likely to engage in risky behavior, including premarital sex, drugs, and alcohol. This doesn't mean you will condone all their choices or bail them out of every difficult situation, but it does mean that in a changing world, your love will be a steadfast constant that they can rely on.

2. Know your faith.

The "real world" is going to challenge our children's Catholic beliefs. Catholics with a weak knowledge of the teachings of the Church often fall victim to evangelization by other faiths or, worse, fall away from the faith completely. Even if your children have had the best Catholic education, don't assume they fully understand what they've been taught. Take time to discuss the faith. 

harvest will one day be great. In all of the soils, the seed is being sown, but it is not the act of sowing that is the most important factor.

In living a stewardship way of life, we must discern how best to share our gifts. Discernment needs the Holy Spirit and a desire to follow God's will, not our own. Our own desires and misconceptions can cause us to use our gifts unwisely. The more mindful we are of how, when, and why we are sharing ourselves, than the greater the impact for God's glory. God wants all of you, but not in a way that is without understanding and discernment. He wants you to shine as a light to the world through your stewardship just as He came to you as the Light of the World in baptism. You can't shine brightly if the match does not hit the wick.

3. The Church is your home.

Make sure your children know that they may be leaving your family home, but they never have to leave their church home. When bouts of homesickness threaten (as they probably will), a nearby Catholic Church and the Mass can be a touchstone of safety in what can feel like an impersonal world.

4. Pray daily.

As important as friends are, friendship with God is even more important. Our children need to understand that friendship with God requires time and energy. While it is true that God is always there waiting for us, and that God does, in fact, take the initiative to contact us, we need to spend time every day in prayer in order to know and understand God's will for our lives.

If God knows everything we do, why do we need to go to Confession?



Another term for the Sacrament of Confession is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We go to this sacrament not only to confess our sins, but to be reconciled with God. Of course, this begs the question, "If I can pray to God on my own, why can't I be reconciled to God on my own?" In the seven sacraments, we recognize the importance of community. Sacraments like Baptism or Matrimony happen in the context of the wider church to remind us of the communal impact of our lives. We are not alone in our walk of faith!

We don't need to confess our sins in front of the whole community — thank God! But going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a tangible reminder that our sins affect not only ourselves and our relationship with God, but others as well. Jesus gave his Apostles authority to forgive sins in his name. Through this sacrament, we are really, truly forgiven by God Himself. We receive an outpouring of grace and strength to sin no more and our relationship with Christ and his Body, the Church, are restored.
