



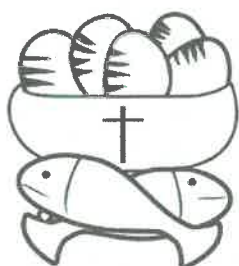

Sunday Reflection



Offering Our Loaves And Fishes

Have you ever wanted to be part of something bigger? Even the most independent among us likes to make changes and have an impact on others. In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus demonstrates one of his most iconic miracles -- the multiplication of the loaves. It is a sign of the institution of the Eucharist, when we are fed not by bread but by the Body of Christ.

In the stories of ancient pagan gods, mighty deeds were done entirely under the gods' own power. Mortals may have offered sacrifices to start the chain of events, but they played little role in the miraculous works themselves. Jesus is entirely different. The multiplication of the loaves is a prime example not only of Jesus' power over nature, but of the way he equips his disciples.

First, Jesus asks Philip a question "to test him." Jesus has seen the crowds and "he himself knew what he was going to do," but he wants his disciples to start thinking about the problem and its solution. Andrew offers a

The Crosiers are a worldwide religious order of consecrated men whose mission is to touch suffering with hope. Thirty Congolese Crosier priests and two brothers are currently guiding 84 men through religious formation and theology studies. The Crosier community also operates a children's orphanage, a crisis counseling center, a farm, a development center, and they lead two parishes that serve 60,000 people. The Crosiers in Congo are almost completely dependent on others for support.

Aglow With The Spirit

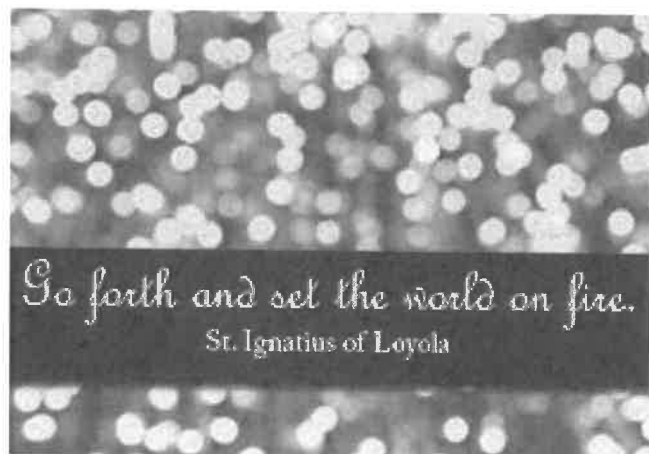

suggestion, though he isn't confident in it. "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus honors Andrew's suggestion, takes the offered loaves, and delegates the Apostles to bring order to the crowd. When the crowd has been fed, the Apostles "gather the fragments left over." In the process, they discover with wonder that bread has been produced in super abundance.

In the sacraments, God works through simple matter to make grace real in our lives. He works in and through us as well. Are you facing problems that could have spiritual solutions? Is there a need in your parish or community that you could meet? Whatever our hesitations, Jesus honors our simple loaves and fishes. He invites us to participate in his generous work of redemption, just as we are.

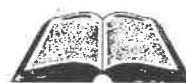

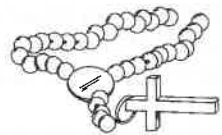

The Importance of Mission Appeals

One of the many gifts and blessings I experience in the United States as I travel during the summer for the church appeals is the universality of the Church and meeting people from the different ethnic groups from Eastern Europe, Latin and Central America and Asia.

Last year I received a letter from a nine-year-old girl named Savana that read in part: "I wanted to give you the last of my birthday money." Savanna was aware of the difficulties and sufferings of the people around the world, after she heard my own invitations and the impact of my talk to the parish that weekend. She could have purchased a box of chocolates, a bag of popcorn, a pair of earrings or pair of shoes for herself, but she opted to hear the cry of the poor, those who are in need, people she never met, but heard their plight. For her it was an awareness and realization about being part of this universal church, because she is a missionary, too.

It brought me back when I was about the age of this girl, during the Vietnam War. Charity groups asked in our school for donations of money, clothes, medicine

and non-perishable food. I asked my mother to give me an extra allowance, clothes and food for the children who were in need those days. Little did I imagine that those were the early days of my preparation for this ministry. It's a Joy of the Gospel, not a job to accomplish, which gives me fulfillment as I represent each of the Sisters and the people whom they are serving, near or far, on these mission appeals.

It's the virtue of generosity that allows us to become fully human, for by nature, we are made to love. We love our neighbors who are beyond our own language, culture and even our own comfort zone. Not only we are to be generous with our financial resources but also we are invited to be generous in everything that we do.

Before I entered the Columban Sisters, my father said that I would be a beggar like some of the local nuns outside Quiapo Church, a very popular church in Manila. I responded to my father that over my dead body, I would not beg.

After so many years, here I am in the United States, taking the challenge of my father, as I respond to be part of the yearly Archdiocese or Diocese mission cooperation plan. Missionaries are invited to come and to share the work of the Gospel being accomplished in the missions. It's a delight to hear from the people how grateful they are to be part of the missions of Christ even they don't go to the mission territories. Through their financial support and prayers, the mission of Christ continues until the ends of the earth. **CM**

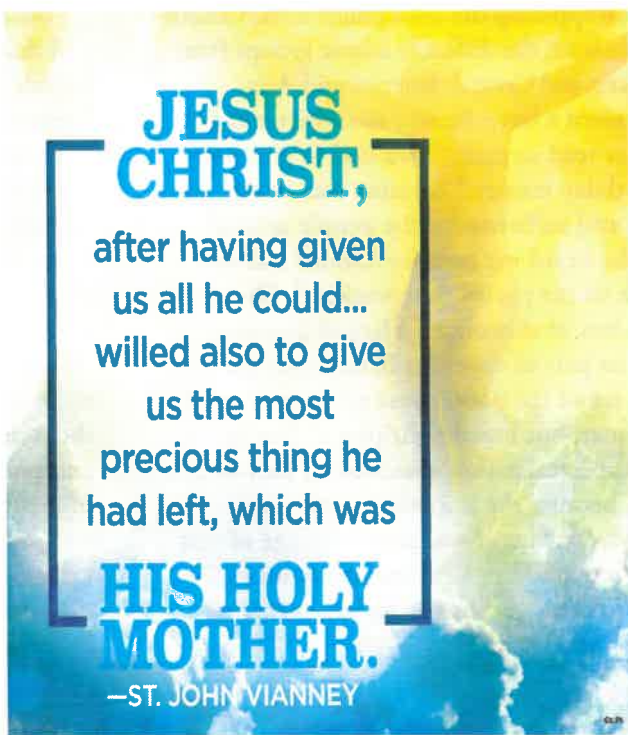

Q

What is the difference between mortal and venial sin?

A

Sin is a deliberate thought, word, action, or omission contrary to God's law. Since the beginnings of the Church, sin has been distinguished by its gravity. "Grave matter" is traditionally defined by the Ten Commandments. If a person commits a grave sin with full knowledge of the action's evil and with the complete consent of their will, this is a mortal sin. The effects of mortal sin are grave — the loss of sanctifying grace, which can be restored by a fresh outpouring of God's mercy in the sacrament of Reconciliation.

Venial sin does not fit one or more of these conditions (for example, a less serious matter still freely chosen or grave matter committed while under force or ignorance of God's law). The effects of venial sin — while still damaging to the human heart and human society — are less severe. Even so, smaller sins build habits, which can obstruct our growth in virtue. When we are serious about following Jesus, we should do our best to avoid all sin, whether large or small!
