## **Sunday Reflection**



A Heavenly Kingdom

If you brought your child to the restroom during the Liturgy of the Word, you might walk away with one of two interpretations of Jesus as King. The first and second readings are bold and victorious. We see Christ coming on the clouds for the final judgment of heaven and earth. The Gospel sets a very different tone. Jesus is under arrest and facing death before Pontius Pilate. We know how this story will end. So if Christ is King, what does it mean? Is he a glorious conqueror or a suffering servant?

"My kingdom does not belong to this world." Here is the heart of Jesus' reign. He is a king — and his "subjects" are alive and well on earth — but, ultimately, Jesus' kingdom transcends our earthly concepts of power. Jesus faced down the temptation of a solely earthly kingship. At the close of his 40 days in the desert, the devil offered him the kingdoms of the world. Jesus only had to sacrifice his heavenly values and (continued on page 3)

## From The Center

Many people were keeping their eye on Baltimore as the American bishops met for their annual fall meeting. We were all expecting to see some procedures put in place to make sure that bishops ensure the safety of children from predator clergy and employees of the Catholic Church. Then we heard the disappointing news that Pope Francis asked the bishops not vote on any measures until after next February when a meeting of the world's bishops take up the topic in Rome. Surely the heat will rightly be on Church leadership until the issue is dealt with.

For most of us, there seems little we can do to address the issue. However, a laywoman who is a visitor to our parish bring unique gifts of healing. She is a psychologist with a double masters in counseling and theology. She also has specialized in counseling those who have experienced sexual abuse. Her fee is covered by most insurance plans and she is willing to adjust to the needs of the individual in order to attend to the inner wounds of those who have been harmed by clergy and lay church staff members. She hopes to bring some reconciliation to people's lives so that they may once again experience the love and care of the Lord in the midst of God's people.

As you may know, it can take months or even years of counseling to deal with the trauma of sexual abuse. But praise God for a woman who has dedicated her life to heal broken spirits. If you know anyone who has been abused in the Church and needs to contact her, just let me know.

Let us pray that institutional and structural changes needed in the church will be put into place SOON. And let us remember and attend to the innocent victims crushed by these violent crimes and cover ups. — *Fr. Don*

worship Satan. The same temptations to distort the kingship of Christ are present to us today. Jesus' invitation also endures. "Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." It is important for us to belong to the full truth of Christ's kingdom.

First, our own hearts must be transformed. Our own rebellions in favor of selfishness and against holiness must be conquered by God's grace. Second, we must work to transform the world as best we can in our own corner of it. Like Jesus shows us by his life and death, this doesn't mean domination. It means service, sacrifice, respect, and love. Our lives must "testify to the truth" of Jesus Christ, who lays down his life for his people. That is the true beauty of Christ the King!


