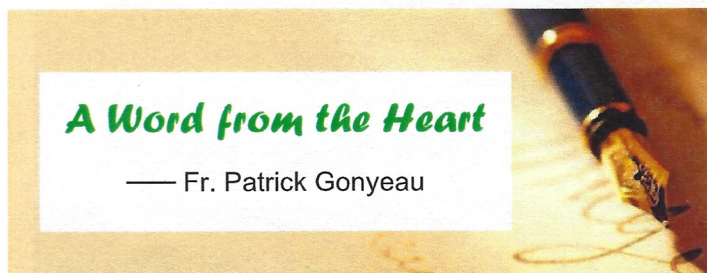

### Share His Heart

In this weekend's Gospel (Mk 6:30-34) we meditate on the compassion of Jesus. After the 12 apostles returned after being sent out by Jesus, they reported to him all they had done and taught, and He said to them "come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest awhile." (Mk 6:31) Yet, as Jesus and the apostles traveled by boat to the deserted place for some prayerful restoration, we read that "people saw them leaving and many came to know about it. They hastened there on foot from all the towns and arrived at the place before them." (Mk 6:33). What happened next was amazing.

"When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he began to teach them many things." (Mk 6:34) The Greek word for compassion in this passage of Mark's Gospel indicates not only a mental alertness to the situation, but an emotive response, too, as in being **deeply moved**. As Jesus looked at the vast crowd, his heart **burned** for them with love. The plans changed. His disciples most likely took a deep breath and followed their compassionate master's lead. There is wisdom here for us.

As disciples of Jesus, developing a devotion to His Sacred Heart brings special blessings. He invites us to share His divine life: "Come to me all you who are labored and are burdened, and I will give you rest, take my yoke upon you and learn from me..." (Mt 11:28-29). As we seek to share the heart of Jesus, we grow in our ability to share His compassion. We find ourselves drawn to help people in new ways, able to allow our schedules to change when Jesus reveals that He has something else on our schedule that He wants to bring us into. Our continued response to His invitation — to daily share in His divine life, loving as He loves, and sharing His Heart — is the way, the truth, and the life that brings the true and lasting joy that God created us for. (Jn 15:11)

Last week I was blessed to meet with the priests in our family (Fr. Jaime, Fr. Athanasius, Fr. Jim, and Fr. Jerry) to engage in the prayerful labor of putting together our priest covenant. This document will establish how we work together as a team of priests that cares for our family of parishes.

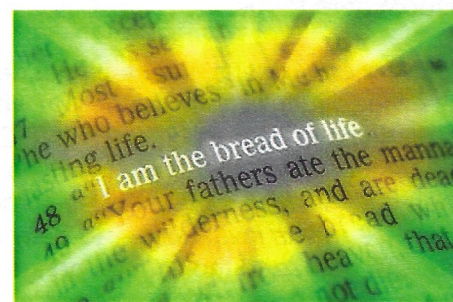

When you run into a stressful, frustrating, difficult situation, pause for a moment and turn to Jesus in prayer and ask Him for His thoughts and perspective on the situation.

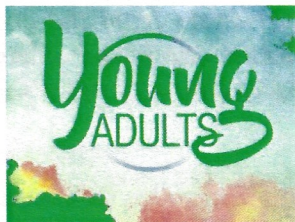
When trying to solve a problem, ask Jesus for wisdom.

## Sunday Reflection

St. Oscar Romero said, "We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is the beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest."

There were a group of ladies many years ago who made quilts. They were beautiful creations reflecting inspirational designs artfully composed from the simple scraps of fabric each woman would bring to their individual pieces. There was no plan for the finished project as each finished work became the combined creation of what each woman contributed. They abounded in vibrant colors and dazzled the beholder with intricate patterns and their myriad textures. They were so beautiful that they became coveted family treasures passed from generation to generation. Those women never realized the power of their work. Countless babies rested in the comfort of those quilts warmly nestled in the legacy of tradition they were fortunate to inherit. They adorned countless homes with their beauty and brought joy and solace to many faces.

We cannot do everything. We are not meant to. Our work in life is to contribute our individual piece, a piece that reflects the unique thumbprint I claim as my own. We only have to do small things well. Then, as St. Oscar Romero reminds us, the Lord's grace will enter and do the rest. We have to trust that this is true just as those women trusted in the eventual beauty of their final work.

Eucharistic blessings are blessings that start small and multiply. We all come to life with only a few loaves of bread and a few fish. Not any single one of us has all that it takes to transform our world. Who knows what God will do with the little we have and how many will benefit from our kindness, compassion, wisdom, courage, conviction, love, warmth, zeal, faith, and hope? That young lad never dreamed that his few leftovers would do all that they did. God shows up in unexpected ways! Where would life's adventure and fun be if it were any other way? Being able to be part of bringing God's creative, transforming, healing to the world opens us up to wonder, awe, and excitement! We can all bring our little piece to the bigger work of God that can result in being a coveted jewel passed generation to generation. This is good news indeed!

## Haiti Outreach Mission (HOM) News

Dear Corpus Christi Family,

Haiti's civil unrest continues after the assassination of President Jovenel Moise on July 7th. In Port-au-Prince the streets are still mostly empty as citizens are keeping to their homes in fear of being caught in the violence. The American Haitian community fears for the safety of friends and family remaining in Haiti.

The pastors of St. Louis and St. Pierre have communicated with Dr. Dominique Monde-Matthews, President of Haiti Outreach Mission. Here is a translation of Fr. Romel's message:

*Hello Dr. Dominique!*

*It's going pretty well around here. The entire country is in dismay over the assassination of the president. Yesterday, the town of Mirebalais was overheated due to the attempted escape of prisoners from the civil prison. Gunshots rang out everywhere in the city, especially at the police station, on the side of our parish church and in the public square. Since last night, great calm has returned. We live in a situation of great fear and uncertainty. Pray for us, Fr. Romel*

Haiti Outreach Mission is committed to ongoing support of our partners in Mirebalais. At our Executive Committee Meeting on July 12th we voted to send \$2,000 to Fr. Romel, St. Louis Catholic Church to continue his food programs. We also voted a 10% salary increase to the 15 employees of St. Pierre medical/dental clinic which will help them with the rapidly rising cost of living (their first raise in 10 years). We also voted to send both Fr. Alphonse, St Pierre Episcopal Church and Fr. Romel, St. Louis Catholic Church, \$500 for (continued on page 9)

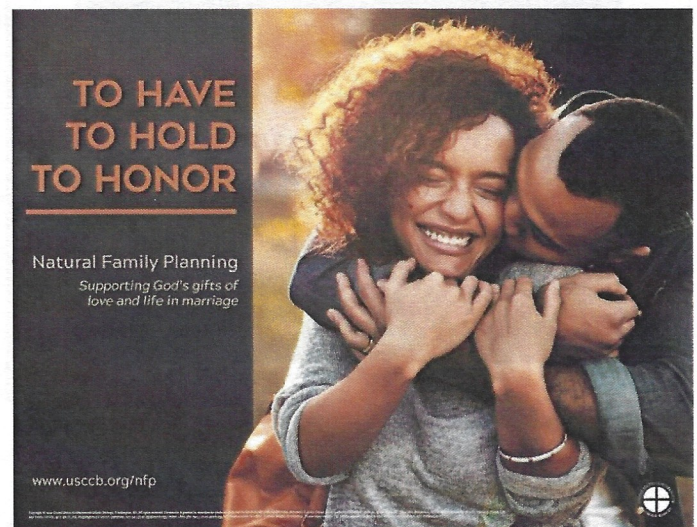
#### Grace Before Meals

## Everyday Stewardship

St. Therese of Lisieux made a point of going the extra mile in kindness towards those people who really got under her skin. It was part of her own brand of Everyday Stewardship — thanking God for all His creation, even the parts with which, in her own humanness, she struggled to cope.

I think about this a lot when I challenge myself to give thanks for things that bother me and people who challenge me. When I do this, I envision Christ giving thanks over those insufficient loaves. How many of us would see that paltry little basket and kick a rock in frustration because we can't feed all our people? "You didn't give me enough, Lord! You didn't give me enough patience, enough money, enough creativity, enough stamina to be a good steward. If you had given me more, I could also give more!"

In those moments of despair, we need to take a good look at the life God has given us. We need to look at the trials and the challenges and the shortcomings. The hopes that didn't pan out, the disappointments that keep cropping up. Somewhere therein lies what we need to be the steward God asks us to be, just as St. Therese's own stewardship was defined by the people she simply couldn't stand.

God does not give us all we want. He does not give us all we ask for. He does us one better: He gives us all we

## Why Do We Do That? – Catholic Life Explained

### Question:

**We are considering homeschooling our children. Does this present a problem when it is time for them to receive the sacraments? What must we do?**

### Answer:

Homeschooling is legal in all fifty states and like other types of education, has its advantages and its drawbacks. There are many factors to consider, and each family has to decide what the best way to educate its children is. With religious education, many dioceses have a formal policy that outlines procedures and expectations, some of which include more than just academic information. Call the religious education office to find out what they are for your area.

In general, though, an appointment with your parish priest to discuss your situation is the best first step. An opportunity to discuss what is available, what the expectations are for each sacrament, and how you can best prepare your child helps make your time of preparation more effective. The priest can direct you to good catechetical materials, parent information classes, and other choices and possibilities for your child. All parents need to be part of their child's religious education, taking a lead in instilling the values and beliefs of their faith.

Communication and information helps us all to teach and preach the Gospel as Jesus did.
