### **Life in The Spirit**

Not too long ago I was reading a little book by one of my favorite Scripture scholars (Fr. Francis Martin) and I found this little passage wonderful, "the message of freedom is that the Holy Spirit replaces the flesh as the real source of power in us." Fr. Francis is writing about the seismic shift that happens when we receive the Holy Spirit, that a whole new life is opened to us.

In St. Paul's Letter to The Romans, we read that, "If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit that dwells in you. (Rom 8:11) This new life that we are given is powered by the Holy Spirit, that enables us to know from within that we are God's beloved children. (Rom 8:15) The revelation of the Father's love for us, which is given to us through the Holy Spirit, is a game-changer in our lives. It is sight.

Just as the blind man we read about this weekend who Jesus healed chose to follow Jesus on the way (Mk 10:52), we too given spiritual sight are impelled by the love of God within us to follow Jesus on the way. It's fascinating that Jesus is interested in the details of our lives. (Lk 12:7) There's not a moment of our lives He doesn't want to enable us to live under the influence of the Holy Spirit, allowing us to experience the true power of God in our lives that is accessed through faith as we journey with Jesus on the way.

November 1 is All Saints' Day when we honor people who have been officially canonized as saints in the Catholic church and all those who have lived good lives. 

You have given the role of stewards to care for all of Your creation from womb to tomb.


Hear us as we pray for a greater respect for all of life throughout our world:

## Everyday Stewardship

In today's Gospel, the evangelist St. Mark tells of Jesus' healing of Bartimaeus when witnessing this blind beggar's faith. In the Letter to the Hebrews, the inspired author instructs how God calls men to the priesthood. ### St. Joseph: Faithful Protector of Mother and Child

The infant Christ "came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected, cared for and raised by Joseph" (PC 5). The humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah in a stable, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son in the years to come.

During this Year of St. Joseph, each of us can find in him "an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble" (PC, Intro). Joseph shows us how to say "yes" to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. For it is Joseph who was "chosen by God to guide the beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true 'miracle' by which God saves the child and his mother" (PC 5).

May we, too, be miracles in the lives of those who are most in need, especially at the beginning and end of life. *Dear St. Joseph, you who were "able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence" (PC 5), help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage*

## Feast of SS Simon and Jude – October 28th

Simon was a simple Galilean, a *brother* of Jesus, as the ancients called one's close relatives — aunts, uncles, first cousins; he was one of the Saviour's four first cousins, with James the Less, Jude and Joseph, all sons of Mary, the wife of Alpheus, or Cleophas, either name being a derivative of the Aramaic *Chalpai*. The latter was the brother of Saint Joseph, according to tradition. All the sons of this family were raised at Nazareth near the Holy Family. (See *the Gospel of Saint Matthew 13:53-58*.) Simon, Jude and James were called by Our Lord to be Apostles, pillars of His Church, and Joseph *the Just* was His loyal disciple.

*Saint Simon the Zealot or the Zealous*, was the name this Apostle bore among the twelve. He preached in Egypt, Mauritania (Spain), and Lybia, leaving behind him the fertile hills of Galilee, where he had been engaged in the healthful cultivation of the vineyards and olive gardens. He later rejoined his brother, Saint Jude, in Persia, where they labored and died together. At first they were respected by the king, for they had manifested power over two ferocious tigers who had terrorized the land. With the king, sixty thousand Persians became Christians, and churches rose over the ruins of the idolatrous temples.

But the ancient enemy, who never sleeps, rose up, and when the two went elsewhere the pagans commanded them to sacrifice to the sun. Both Apostles, just before that time, had seen Our Lord amid His Angels. Simon said to Jude, One of the Angels said to me, *I will take you out of the temple and bring the building down upon their heads*. I answered him, *Let it not be so; perhaps some of them will be converted*. They prayed for mercy for the people and offered their lives to God. Saint Simon told the crowd that their gods were only demons, and ordered them to come out of the statues, which they did, revealing themselves under hideous forms. But the idolaters fell on the Apostles and massacred them, while they blessed God and prayed for their murderers.

Saint Jude has left us a short but powerful epistle, written after the death of his brother James, bishop of Jerusalem, and addressed to the new Christians being tempted by false brethren and heretics.

**Reflection: Zeal is an ardent love which makes a man fearless in defense of God's honor, and earnest to make known the truth at all costs. If we desire to be children of the Saints, we must be zealous for the Faith.**




