# A Sacrament of Joy

As we celebrate Gaudete (*Latin for "rejoice"*) Sunday on this Third Sunday in the Advent Season, we're just two weeks away from Christmas. Two weeks away from declaring with fresh fervor, "joy to the world, the Lord has come!" He truly has come, yes 2,000 years ago and He will come again into our hearts and lives in a new way this Christmas if we seek that most wonderful gift!

In Advent, we continue to align our minds and hearts to the love of God, not only so that we live better in general, but so that we're truly ready to receive the gift Jesus wants to give on Christmas, the gift of Himself. One of the great ways we can prepare for Christmas is to receive the Sacrament of Confession. Heading to the Sacrament of Confession in the Advent season is a great way to clear out the spiritual gunk from our minds and hearts that can accrue from sin. The Sacrament of Confession is like a power-washer of mercy for the soul, mind, and heart. After celebrating Mass, hearing confessions is my favorite aspect of serving as a priest. Can I tell you why?

In the Sacrament of Confession, there is one judgement that reigns supreme again and again: Jesus thinks you're worth dying for! He still thinks you are worth His blood and when we turn to Him in this beautiful sacrament, the effect of His love washing away sin through the **magnificently powerful prayer of absolution** is JOY. The joy of Jesus renewing you in His love in this beautiful sacrament is PALPABLE. I love being in the confessional, it is a place of grace full of JOY. There's never any judgment from the priest in confession, it's not about him, it's about you and Jesus and the priest is blessed to be present to serve Jesus in a mighty way. It's a sacrament of joy...and the manger of your heart will be in great shape for Jesus too, come Christmas!

At 7:00pm on Sunday, December 18<sup>th</sup>, Corpus Christi will host a Holy Hour as part of the *I Am Here* Archdiocese of Detroit Advent Adoration series. Both during and after the Holy Hour, there will be several priests hearing confessions that night. On Saturday, December 17<sup>th</sup> at 10:30am there will be a children's penance service (adults are free to go to confession after the children if they would like!) with several priests available for confession as well. Finally, the Sacrament of Confession is available every Saturday from 1:00pm-3:45pm in the reconciliation room in the Church and is also available by appointment. Also, the Sacrament of Confession is also available from 9:30am-4:30pm Monday through Saturday at the St. Bonaventure Capuchin Monastery at 1740 Mt. Elliott Street in Detroit. Thank you, Jesus, for your endless mercy and the fountain of grace that is this the Sacrament of Confession...a sacrament of joy.

#### Prayer:

## **Our Lady of Guadalupe**

When Mary appeared to Juan Diego as Our Lady of Guadalupe, she had encouraging words for him. "Am I not here, I who am your mother?" In the image on Juan Diego's tilma (tunic), Mary identifies herself with the Aztec people. She has their hair and features, their symbolic maternity dress. She incorporated their important symbols of the sun, moon, and stars. Today's Mass includes two Gospel options. Both are familiar passages from the Gospel of Luke - the Annunciation and the Visitation. Both are equally relevant to today's feast because Mary's yes to Christ isn't only to care for him but to come to us. Our Lady of Guadalupe is pregnant. The image bears witness to Mary's yes to conceive the Savior of the World. But even in her pregnancy, she goes to care for Elizabeth. Now Mother to all the world, Mary comes to the aid of her children, reminding them of her presence among them.

#### The Season That Gives Back

I don't have anything left to give.

You can't pour from an empty cup.

All I do is give. Who is giving to me?

Raise your hand if these thoughts have ever run through your head. I'm sure they occur to all of us from time to time. We can become so easily depleted by the fast pace of life and whatever vocation God has called us to, whether that's parenthood, a demanding professional career or the caretaking of friends and family (or as so often happens, a hybrid of all three). Many of us also undergo certain seasons — seasons of the year, but also seasons of life — that seem to sap us of energy and leave us totally empty.

In these times, it seems impossible to continue in the spirituality of Everyday Stewardship. Graciousness, mindfulness, prayerfulness, gratitude, accountability — maintaining some semblance of these characteristics in our daily life feels not only overly optimistic, but totally impossible.



#### Question:

A famous coach once said that when the team is in trouble and things aren't going well, go back to the basics; when the team is winning and things are going well, go back to the basics!
