

## The Transfiguration of Jesus and Our Minds

On this 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Lent, we meditate together on the transfiguration of Jesus, as recounted in the Gospel of Matthew. Just prior to this amazing scene, Jesus had told the disciples of His impending crucifixion and resurrection, which was indeed overwhelming for the apostles. Peter, who had just declared that Jesus was indeed the son of God, was swiftly rebuked by Jesus when he tried to step in and tell Jesus that "no such thing shall ever happen to you!" (Mt 16:22). The amazing revelation Jesus would give on Mt. Tabor would have a lasting effect on the apostles, and the entire Church, to this very day.

In addition to Moses (representing the law) and Elijah (representing the prophets) standing on each side of Jesus (his position in the center indicating he is the center and fullness of revelation), the magnificent divinity of God shines through Jesus, his face shining like the sun. What continues to fill me with faith, hope, love and joy is the reality that what shone out of Jesus is meant to shine out of you and I as well. He lives in us through the Holy Spirit and because you and I are beloved sons and daughters of God, we have access to the treasure of God's presence that transforms us.


Thinking with the mind of Christ truly helps us to experience the continual divine transformation that is life in Christ. A beautiful paradigm derived from the writings of St. Ignatius of Loyola for helping guide our thought lives is: *Awareness – Understanding – Taking Action*. Being aware of our thoughts, feelings and desires, and asking God for understanding about what is from Him and what is not, allows us to take action. We dismiss the bad thoughts (what is not of God) and receive the positive thoughts that do come from God and build on those beautiful thoughts. In addition to watching what we're putting in our mind (good spiritual diet), keeping a healthy self-awareness of our thought lives allows us, by grace, to think with the mind of Christ. This in turn helps us to shine forth the divinity of God...that may sound kind of wild, but it's real, possible and a really worthwhile pursuit on this Lenten journey of transformation.



# **Prophets:**

People Called to Speak and Act Generations of Faith 2022/23

### Amos and Micah - Call for Justice

Last Sunday - about 60 adults, 12 teens, and 12 elementary children attended the Generations of Faith session on the Prophets Amos and Micah. After praying with the hymn "The Lord Hears the Cry of the Poor", **the adults** watched two videos from the Bible Project which summarized each book (Amos and Micah). We then looked at the evidence both prophets used to prove that the Israelites were breaking God's covenant and examined the consequences from God because of their law breaking. We then stepped into the shoes of Amos, called for justice in our world today, and named areas of injustice in our city, country, and world. Finally, **the teens** "tested" the adults' knowledge by reading about 14 scripture quotes...was the quote from Amos or Micah or Jesus? Some were easy to attribute to the author; others not so much!

The 6 Characteristics of an Everyday Stewardship for Lent – Prayerful

I would play with them one day and then work to bandage a boo-boo the next. There were so many dynamics to our relationship. However, one aspect was my favorite. It was when one of them would snuggle up next to me on the couch silently, often leading to sleep. There was no better feeling, and I didn't want to move for anything. It is crazy to think of all the things we would do together, and my favorite was when we essentially were doing nothing.

Do you think God desires a portion of you? Without a doubt, He wants all of you: the good, the bad, and the ugly. Walking with Him daily is so important, and we can never become the disciples and stewards we need to be without a deepening relationship. Yet, prayer is not just talking and listening. It is also being. We sometimes seek to communicate so much and do so many things that we forget the value of stewardship of presence. No words are needed because words would destroy the moment. This is what we are called to in a relationship with God. ### The Long Walk

The walk down from Mount Tabor after the Transfiguration must have been a long one for Peter, James, and John. How differently they must have viewed the world with the eyes that had seen what they had just seen. How uncertain they must have been.

I think it's important to remember that, on the mountain, they were amazed, yes — but first, they were afraid. We are given the image of these three grown men — these saints, these giants of salvation history — cowering in fear at the voice of God. It was not until Jesus touched them that they could even bear to look up.

Christ was transfigured on Tabor, but in a way, the disciples were transfigured as well. We are all changed by what we see and what we hear. That change can be hard because knowledge is hard. Truth is hard. Sometimes cowering is easier.


