He Saw and Believed

In the Gospel of St. John, he recounts that on the morning of the Resurrection, "Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb." (Jn 20:1) Observing that the tomb was empty, Mary ran to tell Peter and John, who in turn ran to the tomb themselves. After Peter entered the tomb, John did as well. John wrote this of what he experienced in the empty tomb on the morning of the Resurrection: "Then the other disciple (John is referring to himself) also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the scripture that he had to rise from the dead." (Jn 20:8-9)

What John shares with us is a treasure, the truth of when he came to believe in the Resurrection that Jesus had told His apostles multiple times would indeed come to pass. John acknowledges that it wasn't until he was in the empty tomb that he saw and believed. He readily shares with us that "they did not yet understand the scripture that he had to rise from the dead." In the empty tomb on the morning of the Resurrection John believed that Jesus had risen from the dead. I imagine an absolute rush of emotions flooding over John with a racing heart and mind and perhaps even a shout from his soul, "HE'S ALIVE!" With a burst of energy I imagine John racing out of the tomb with tears streaming

down his face and declaring, "if this is true, everything Jesus said is true!" And remember, John did a very good job of recording many lifechangingly important things Jesus said.

The moment John realized Jesus was alive, the moment he saw and believed, his life was forever changed. John clearly heard Jesus say (and recorded this in his gospel), "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies. will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (Jn 11:25-26) John understood that the Resurrection of Jesus truly meant that He would keep His word to His disciples: everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. On this morning of the Resurrection we too stand, by faith, stand in the empty tomb and declare and believe. We cast our eyes upon Jesus in the Eucharist and declare, "HE'S ALIVE." By grace, we resolve anew on this Resurrection morning to live for Him who died and rose for us...doing so will bring us into the abundant life (Jn 10:10) that Jesus has won for us by His victory over the powers of darkness, sin and death. There will never be any better option on the table...embrace Jesus anew today, He died and rose for you

Everyday Stewardship

At Easter, we celebrate that our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, conquered death, rose from the dead, and remains very much alive. To the world of nonbelievers: what!? It is quite a big reality to swallow. But for the believer, it is a reality that inspires us to the point where we find ourselves constantly sharing the Gospel with everyone we meet! Right?

So what does Easter mean to you? The question is not what do you believe. The question is what impact does Easter have on you? How do your actions demonstrate the power of Easter? What does it mean we you hear that we, the Church, are an Easter people?

You may be saying right now that you have no intention of becoming an evangelist, passing out Bibles to all you meet. But I would like to suggest that you actually have a more powerful way of evangelizing others: everyday stewardship. Actions speak louder than words and the way you live your life can be a great testimony to all those you encounter. By acknowledging the gifts you have been given, cultivating those so they grow to an increase, and then sharing them fully with God and with others in God's name will give testimony to your belief that Jesus is alive and seeking a relationship with each of his people.

If more of us won't live our lives in this manner, then non-believers and non-intentional disciples will ask the question, "What difference does Easter make anyway?" Jesus died and rose for you and me. To be sure, it DOES make a difference.
