

The Most Blessed Sacrament

This weekend we celebrate *The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ*, also known as *Corpus Christi*. It is indeed our parish feast day, thank you Jesus! This weekend, we meditate on a portion of the *The Bread of Life Discourse* located in John's Gospel (Jn 6:22-50). It's a truly magnificent scene in the Gospel of John recording the teaching of Jesus that took place in the synagogue in Capernaum (Jn 6:59)

In this teaching, Jesus explains to His listeners that He intended to have His disciples eat of His flesh and drink of His blood, saying, "my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink." (Jn 6:55) A very careful read of the entire discourse reveals that Jesus was not deterred by the shock that His message caused. Multiple times, Jesus clarified that He was speaking literally...that His flesh would be food and His blood would be drink. John records that so stunning was His teaching that, "as a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him."

After His teaching and the subsequent fallout, a famous exchange between Jesus and Peter happens. Jesus asked the twelve apostles, "do you also want to leave?" (Jn 6:67) Perhaps still stunned by the teaching himself...Peter makes an act of faith, and responds to Jesus "Master, to whom shall we go, you have the words of eternal life." (Jn 6:68) These words speak deeply to my heart and my faith in the Eucharist as truly the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ.

Coming to know Jesus saved my life and entirely changed my life as well, and that saving love is renewed in my heart, mind, soul and body every time I receive the Eucharist. I believe beyond the shadow of a doubt (no one could convince me otherwise) that the Eucharist is truly Jesus. Coming to Jesus in the Eucharist with an open and vulnerable heart continues to be the most impactful experience in my walk with Jesus. If somehow, someone heard about me 75 years from now...the one thing I would want them to know about my life as a disciple is that I passionately believed that the Eucharist was Jesus.

If there's one thing I could ever effectively teach and share, I would want it to be that...the Eucharist is really Jesus. My prayer for all of us (me included) is that we fall in love with Jesus in the Eucharist like never before in the months ahead. And as we receive Jesus in the Eucharist with great faith, we are transformed to be more and more like Him. That in turn allows us to truly live out the reality of what St. Paul taught in his Letter to the Ephesians, that the Church is indeed the Body of Christ. It's through passionate reception of Jesus in the Eucharist that we grow exponentially into a living representation of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ in this world. This is why the Eucharist is called *The Most Blessed* Sacrament...and blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb!

The Priesthood and the Eucharist

"These two Sacraments were born together," wrote St. John Paul II of the priesthood and the Eucharist, "and their destiny is indissolubly linked until the end of the world."

The Eucharist is such a beautiful example of how God, conscious of our limitations, bends to meet us. He once came to us cloaked in the flesh, that we might recognize Him. Now He comes as the very means by which we nourish ourselves: food and drink, the most familiar and comforting thing in the world to us. How easy He makes it to fulfill his command that we become one with Him. How generous He is to make such a sacred thing also accessible.

We can say the same of the priesthood, and of the men He calls to its number. How generous of Him to make such an accessible thing — our sons, our brothers, our uncles, our cousins — sacred. How generous of Him to allow these human creations — who share in our own faults — to be the means through which He comes to us in the Eucharist.

Without the Eucharist, we would have no eternal life. Without priests, we would have no Eucharist. On this, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let's give thanks for our priests, and redouble our prayers that God will send us good and holy ones — manna from Heaven in our wandering exile.

Corpus Christi CSA Campaign Update

Fr. Patrick here again with a CSA update. A big thank you to all who have already pledged, we are up to \$7,095 towards our parish goal of \$46,914. The annual Catholic Service Appeal funds more than 170 ministries, programs, and services throughout the Archdiocese including: support discerning God's call to the priesthood at Sacred Heart Major Seminary; campus ministry; grants to Catholic schools; and young adult programs.

This week I'd like to highlight the good work of Sacred Heart Major Seminary that is supported by CSA. From my days with Fr. Paul Berg and Sr. Mary Finn at Sacred Heart, I've found the seminary (which has about 100 seminarians and 350 commuter students) to be a wonderful ministry in the Archdiocese. For anyone who wants to grow in their faith, the seminary has something to offer and they are deeply committed to giving grants to anyone whom finances might be a challenge for. It's fascinating as well to know that this local seminary is both considered one of the best in the country and has an impact on forming both ordained and lay ministers around the country through both in person and online learning. Sacred Heart is indeed a fountain of grace that helps the local Church (and beyond) continue to grow. I'm grateful for my time at Sacred Heart, grateful for it's impact on so many lives near and far and glad to contribute to CSA knowing that Sacred Heart will receive support through this offering.

This year, as with last year, the Archdiocese is taking a burden off of parishes by encouraging CSA donations to be given directly to the Archdiocese. It is very easy (and safe) to give online through our parish website: https://corpuschristi-detroit.org/ Just click on the "How to Donate" tab and then select "CSA" and you'll be on your way to being able to make a quick online donation to the Archdiocese. Going through our website will enable your gift to be automatically counted for funds given from Corpus Christi. Each household also has received a mailing from the Archdiocese that has an envelope in it which you can use to write a check for CSA to the Archdiocese if you would prefer that method. Our CSA target goal this year is \$46,914, which was determined by a formula the Archdiocese uses to determine CSA target goals for each parish.

If you would rather contribute to Corpus Christi's CSA target goal by giving directly to Corpus Christi, you may indeed do so. In whatever way you give, simply specifically identify the donation as "CSA" and we'll be sure to send it along for you. If the parish goes over the goal, those funds go back to bless the parish, if we are under the goal, the deficit is paid out of parish savings. Thank you for every bit of your generosity, God bless you!


